





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FOREWORD

The Government of Rwanda, through the National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) conducted the 2022 Rwanda Population and Housing Census to provide updated demographic, social and economic indicators for policy formulation and planning to support the national development agenda and track the implementation of national, regional, continental and global development goals, such as the First National Strategy for Transformation (NST1 2017-2024); the AU Agenda 2063; and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The Population and Housing Census in Rwanda dates back to the year 1978 when the first ever modern census was implemented. The second, third, and fourth censuses were carried out in 1991, 2002, and 2012 respectively. The 2022 Population and Housing Census marks therefore the Fifth in the series following the United Nations Recommendations to conduct a census every ten years.

Considering census' crucial importance for the planning process, the Government of Rwanda has made the Population and Housing Census a priority to be undertaken every 10 years and adopted the use of technologies for timely delivery of census results for use.

Results of the 2022 Population and Housing Census provide population numbers from national to the lowest administrative level, as well as demographic and socio-economic indicators at both national and district levels. The census remains the only national data collection exercise that can provide the lowest levels of disaggregation to support decentralised decision making across the country.

I would like therefore to take this opportunity to thank all stakeholders that contributed to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. They include Ministries and other Government institutions, international organizations such as the World Bank (WB), the European Union (EU), the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), One-UN, UN Women, UNICEF, UNECA, the United Kingdom AID (UKAID), the African Development Bank (AfDB), the USAID, Enabel, PARIS 21 and others for their support in diverse ways.

My special thanks go to the local government leaders from the province to the village levels who contributed a lot to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. 

CHAPTER 1: POPULATION SIZE, STRUCTURE AND SPATIAL DISTRIBUTION

1.1 Size and spatial Distribution of the population

1.1.1 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Southern Province

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 3,002,699 residents in the Southern Province, which represents 22.7 % of the total population of Rwanda (13,246,394 residents). The population of Southern Province is predominantly Female (1,554,244) corresponding to 51.8 %. Kamonyi is the most populated district with 450,849 inhabitants. Its population represents 15.0 % of the total residents' population of Southern Province. The least populous district in Southern Province is Nyaruguru with 318,126 inhabitants, corresponding to 10.6 % of the total resident population of Southern Province.

1.1.2 Population Density of Southern Province by District

Population density is a measurement of population per unit land area. Density is the number of the inhabitant per Km2. The Rwanda Population and Housing Census conducted in 2022 revealed that the population density in Rwanda is 503 inhabitants per Km2. The Southern Province has 547 inhabitants per Km2. The district with a high population density is Kamonyi with 698 Inhabitants per km². The district with a lowest population density is Nyaruguru with 409 Inhabitants per km². The figure below indicates distribution of population density per district.




Figure 1. 3 Distribution of population density by sectors of Huye District

1.1.3 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of the Huye district

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 381,900 residents in Huye district, which represent 12.7 % of the total population of Southern Province as shown in Table 1.1. The population distribution is slightly more females (193,041) than male (188,859) in Huye District (i.e., 50.5% versus 49.5%).

Results in the table 1.2 below, Indicates the number of the population of Huye district by sector, by sex, the percentage of female and their shares across sectors to the total population of Huye district and further show a similar pattern of higher number of females than Male in all sectors of Huye district apart from Ngoma Sector which have more males mainly because of rural-urban migration with (24,499)male out of (11,079) Female which represent 68.9% and 31.1% respectively.

1.1.4 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Huye district by residence area

The results of Rwanda Population and housing census 2022 revealed that, the total population of Rwanda are spatially distributed in rural area that represent 72.1% and urban area represent 27.9%.

The Results in **Error! Reference source not found.** also shows that 85.2 % of the population of Southern Province live in rural areas while 14.8 % live in urban areas and by considering the distribution of the population by residence area, results from the census show that 79.1 % of the population of Huye live in rural areas while 20.9% live in urban areas. Compared to the previous census, this represents a continuous increase regarding the population living in urban areas, as this proportion was 16.1 % in 2012(NISR, PHC 2012)

The sectors of Huye district which are entirely rural are Gishamvu, Karama, Kigoma, Kinazi, Maraba, Ruhashya, Rusatira, Rwaniro and Simbi other sectors like Mbazi, Mukura, Huye have

more Resident live in rural areas compared to the Urban areas while Ngoma and Tumba have more Residents live in Urban areas compared to the rural areas respectively.

1.1.5 Age-Sex Structure of the Population of Huye district

Analysis of 2022 Census data shows that Huye has a predominantly youthful population where more than a half of total population (61.42%) are aged below 30 years old, and as many as (35.97%) are aged below 15 years old. The persons aged 65 years and above constitute around 5.5% of the total population where we have more female (12,541) than male (8,672) it means 3 women to 2 men.

The age pyramid (Figure 1.4) graphically displays Huye's age and sex composition based on 2022 Census. Horizontal bars present the numbers of males and females in each age group. The pyramid confirms Huye population as predominantly youthful, reflecting the high level of fertility in the recent past years. The elderly accounts for a very small proportion of the total population, indicating a high level of mortality in Rwanda in men compare to women.

And also Figure 1.4 presents the five-year age group pyramid for Huye district. The figure reveals a large base of pyramid thus demonstrating a high level of fertility in this district. However, the shape of this pyramid indicates a dip in age group 30-34, particularly among females, suggesting some evidence of high under five mortality in 30 years ago.

It shows also that Huye district is dominated by adult population in the working age group and a consequence of labour migration from rural district neighboring Huye like Nyaruguru, Gisagra and Nyamagabe .

1.1.6 population share of some specific interventions target groups in Huye District by sex

Some age groups are targets of specific interventions. For instance, children under five years are age group of interest for immunization programs. The age range for primary school children is basically 6-11, while age range 12-17 is the focus for secondary school children. Other age groups of significance in Rwanda are the youth population (16-30 years), people in the official working age group (16-59 years), and the elderly (60 years and above), etc. Knowing the size of these population groups is of great importance for the design, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of programs targeting them. Error! Reference s ource not found. gives the size of the main intervention target groups by sex as well as the proportion of each group in relation to the total population of Huye. The population under five represents 12.20% (46777) of the district's total population, with 9461 babies under one year of age (i.e., 2.5% of the population). Also, the children of primary school ages (6 to 11 years) constitute 13.9% of Huye total population, while the population of secondary school ages (12 to 17 years) represent 14.0% of the country's population. The share of the youth population (i.e., ages 16 to 30) is 24.7%. Almost a quarter of the district's total population (24.1%) are women of reproductive ages (15 to 49 years). The population of working age group (16 years and above) in Huye constitutes 61.7% of the district's population while older persons aged 60 and above represent 8.5 % of the population, with females in this group (4.9 %) higher than the male proportion (3.6%).

These results confirm the observed pattern in the population pyramid. the results further affirm the youthfulness of the population of Huye.

2: CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION

2.1 Socio-cultural characteristics of the population

2.1.1 Nationality of the population of Huye district

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that, the Rwandan population by nationality represent that 99.11% are Rwandan and 0.89% foreigners. In the Southern Province,99.39% are Rwandan and 0.61% foreigners.

In Huye district, the Rwandan represent 99.74% (380,926) and foreigners represent 0.26% (974). Among sectors of Huye District, two out of fourteen have more foreigners compared to others Ngoma (426) and Tumba (269) As represented in table 2.1.

2.1.2 Religious affiliation of the resident population of Huye District

In Huye district, Christianity is the predominant religion where 55.9% are catholic, 18.8% are ADEPR, 12.39 % are protestant, 5.93% are Adventists, 1.19% are Muslim, and Jehovah witness are 0.91%. 2.64% of the Huye resident population declared themselves to be without religion. 2.2 Marital Status of the resident population of Huye district

2.2.1 Marital status by sector

The results of 5 RPHC-2022, 47.6% of the resident population of Huye district aged 12 and above were living in union at the time of the census (Married to one wife \husband officially (31.3), Married to one wife\husband not officially (15.6%), living in polygamous union(0.7%), while 44.2% were never married,6.2% were widowed, while separated and divorced were respectively 1.9 % and 0.2%.

At the sector level, all Sector have almost the same percentage of married people around 44 up to 49 % as presented in Table 2.3.

Tumba(48.1%) ,Ngoma(45.2%) and Gishamvu (45.0%) have the highest percentages of the never married persons. Gishamvu and Rusatira sectors have high percentage of widowed persons (8.2% and 7.5% respectively).

2.2.2 Marital status by Age groups

The percentages of resident population of Huye district by marital status vary by sex and age: The percentage of never married persons decreases from 99.9% (age group of 12-14 years) to 1.5% (age group of 80 years and above). The percentage of persons currently married starts by increasing from 19.2% (age group of 20-24 years) to a maximum of 83.2% (age group of 40-44 years) and after it starts decreasing to 43.5% (age group 80+) due mainly to widowhood (54.3%). The highest percentage of divorced persons (0.4%) is observed between age 40-54, while the highest percentage of the separated persons (4.2%) is found in age group 45-49 years.

2.3 Educational Characteristics of the Population of Huye district

2.3.1 School attendance

Table 2. 5 below shows that, in Huye district, 65.6 % of pre-primary-age population (3-5 years) are currently attending school,34.4 % of children have never attended and none (0%) of those children have previously attended (i.e., children who have already had prior exposure to nursery school education before the time of census but who were not attending nursery school/dropped-out during census time). Simbi Sector has the highest proportion of children (age between 3 to 5) currently attending school in Huye District (85.0%). Followed by Maraba and Mbazi Sector with a percentage of 78.7 and 78.1 respectively.

Mukura sector has the lowest percentage of children currently attending school, with only 37.3 % enrolled and also have the highest proportion of children aged 3 to 5 who have never attended school (62.7%).

Table 2. 6 shows that in Huye District 91.2 % of children age 6 to 11 years (the official primary school-going age) are currently attending school, 7.4 % have never attended school and only 1.4 % have previously attended school (which means that 8.8 of children aged 6 to 11 are out of school). By comparing the distribution of the primary school-age population (6-11 years) across sectors in Huye District, comparisons reveal the disparities in primary school attendance. Across different sectors within Huye District, Sectors like Mukura, Rusatira and Gishamvu exhibit lower rates of children currently attending school (85.2%,85.7% and 87%, respectively) and higher rates of children who have never attended (11.2, 10.4 against 10.5%, respectively). On the other hand, sectors like Ngoma, Simbi and Tumba demonstrate higher rates of children currently attending school (95.5%,94.3% and 93.5 % respectively) and Ngoma and Simbi again have lower rates of children who have never attended (4.2%).

In Huye District 22.2% of the population aged 12 to 17 have previously attended school (i.e. they dropped out of school), 75.2% are currently attending school and 2.6% have never attended secondary school. The distribution of the secondary school-age population (12-17 years) across sectors in Huye District, shows that Karama sector has the highest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school at 84.4%. Conversely, Rusatira sector has the lowest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school with 67.9% and also has the highest percentage of the population between the ages of 12 and 17 who have never attended school at 4.2 %.

2.3.2. Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Primary School in Huye district

Gross and Net Attendance Ratios are used to measure the extent of coverage of an educational program. It gives a comparison of the children attending school with the total size of the school-age population. It can also be used for assessing how far a country has succeeded in bringing to school all those who are eligible to attend.

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 reveal that not all children attending primary school level are of the official age for that level (6-11 years). The gross attendance rate in Rwanda is 141.7, in Southern Province GAR is 146.6 and 146.3 in Huye district. The Net Attendance Rate (NAR) in Primary school for Huye district (91.2%) is above the NAR of the Southern Province (90.0%) as well as the NAR of national level (89.3%).

A Gross Attendance Rate (GAR) of 146.3 % in Huye District for the population 6 to 11 years indicates a high percentage of those who attended primary schools aged below 6 years or above 11 years. On the other hand, the NAR of 91.2 % for the population 6 to 11 years indicates that only 91.2 % of the population 6 to 11 years were attending primary schools in Huye District by 2022 (Table 2.8). In 2022, students older or younger than the official primary school age

range made up 37.7% [(GAR146.3-NAR91.2)/GAR146.3] of the primary school population of Huye District.

2.3.3. Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Secondary School

The table 2. 9 provides information on the gross and net attendance rates in the secondary school level (12-17 years) in Huye District, disaggregated by sex and sector. Huye District has the higher NAR compared to Southern and National level (22.8%, versus 22.3% for National Level and 21.9 for Southern Province). Comparing males and females in Huye District in terms of Net Attendance Rates (NAR), the table 2. 9 indicates that a higher proportion of females 26.9% in Huye District, within the secondary school age range (12-17 years), are attending school compared to males (18.7%). Female students older or younger than the official secondary school age range made up 39.5 % [(GAR44.48-NAR26.9)/GAR44.48] of the female with secondary school age of Huye District, while for male students it made up 45.9% [(GAR534.56-NAR18.7)/GAR34.56].This shows that females have a higher attendance rate in Huye District compared to males when considering the overall attendance rates, regardless of age or grade-level eligibility.

Among the sectors in Huye District, Ngoma and Tumba have the highest GAR for both sexes, with a rate of (69.04% and 62.79% respectively). Sectors such as Rwaniro and Simbi have relatively lower GAR compared to others (28,8% and 32.69% respectively). Ngoma has the highest NAR for both sexes in Huye District, with a rate of 39.2%. Sectors like Rwaniro,

Gishamvu, Kinazi, Rusatira and Ruhashya have relatively lower (less than 20%) NAR compared to others (16.5%,19.2%, 19.3%, 19.5% and 19.9% respectively).

2.3.4 Highest level of School attended in Huye District

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate the total population of Rwanda aged 3 and above is 11,999,691. The highest level of education attended is categorized into several levels: Never attended School, Nursery, Primary, INGOBOKA/Vocational, Lower secondary, Upper secondary, University, and Not stated. In Rwanda, 16.7% of the population aged 3 years and above has never attended school, while 2.7% have attended nursery, and 59.5% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.8% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.6% for lower secondary, 7.1% for upper secondary, 3.6% for university, and 0.0% is not stated.

The total population of the southern Province aged 3 and above is 2,720,038. The distribution of the highest level of education attended is like the national level, with slight variations. In the southern Province, 17.1 % of the population has never attended school, while 2.3 % have attended nursery, and 62.6% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 1.2% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.0% for lower secondary, 5.5 % for upper secondary, 2.4 % for university, and 0.0% is not stated.

The total population of Huye District aged 3 and above is 343,338. In Huye District, 15.6 % of the population has never attended school, while 2.4 % have attended nursery, and 61.8 % have attended primary school. Other education levels include 1.2% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.1 % for lower secondary, 6.8 % for upper secondary, 3.9 % for university, and 0.0% is not stated.

The distribution of the highest level of education attended varies among sectors, with differences in the percentage of individuals at each education level. For example, the

percentage of individuals who attended primary school is more than 60% in all sectors except in Tumba(48.6%) even if it is Simbi which has a higher percentage(71.3%). Ngoma has a higher percentage (21.0%) of individuals who have never attended school compared to other sectors, Tumba has a higher percentage (10.7%) of individuals who attended upper secondary school while Mukura has a higher percentage (10.7%) of individuals who attended university school (4.7%). Each sector has its own unique distribution of education levels attended by the population. The table below indicates the findings:

2.4 Characteristics of the Employed Population

The official working age in Rwanda is 16 years and above. Aggregate employment generally increases with growing population. Therefore, the ratio of Employment to the working age population (employment to population ratio) is an important indicator of the capacity of the Economy to provide employment to a growing population. A decline in the employment-to population ratio is often regarded as an indicator of economic slowdown and a decline in total employment as an indicator of a more severe economic downturn.

2.4.1 Employment to population ratio by sex, Province, District and area of residence

The results presented in the below Table 2. 11 shows that the employment to population ratio stood at 45.9 in Rwanda, it is lower among females (40.2 percent) than males (52.4 percent). On the other side, it was observed that the employment to population ratio is higher in urban areas of Rwanda (53.5 percent) than in rural areas (42.7 percent).

It was observed that in Southern Province, the employment to population ratio stood at 42.9 percent, it is higher in urban areas (52.5 percent) than in rural areas of Southern Province (41.2 percent). It was also revealed that the employment to population ratio is 44.5 percent among people residing in Huye districts, it is higher in urban areas of Huye (56.7 percent) than in rural areas of Huye (41.7 percent).



2.4.2 Employment to population ratio(EPR) among the resident population of Huye aged 16 years and above by age group and sex

Figure 2. 1 allows the study of intensity of Employment to population ratio and its variation by sex. The figure reveals the following remarks: The employment to population ratio among males as well as females increases from age group 16-19 to 35-44 and starts decreasing from age group 45-49 to 85 years and above as people starts getting very older and retire. It was observed that in district of Huye, the highest employment to population ratio among males stands at 67.8% and was observed in age group 30-34, On the other side the highest employment to population among females is 51.2% and was observed in the age group 40-44. The lowest employment to population ratio among males stands at 10.8% and was observed among males in the age group 85+., the lowest employment to population ratio among females is 3.9% and was observed among females in the age group 85+.

CHAPTER 3: SUB-POPULATION

3.1 Children Population (0-17 years)

According to the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989), a child is defined as every human being under 18 unless, under the law applicable to the child, majority is attained earlier. It is relevant to underline here that this definition by age coincides with that of Rwanda, as stipulated in Article 3 of the National Law n° 54/2011 of 14 December 2011 relating to the rights and the protection of the child, which stipulates that a child is any person under the age of 18. The age range (0–17) adopted for this report reflects this definition.

3.1.1 Number and share of children in Huye district.

At the national level, the children population constitute 44.5% of the total population of Rwanda (13,246,394). The Southern Province has 1,333,748 children with a share of 44.4% of the total resident population. In Huye District, the children constitute 42.7% of the resident population of the district with a percentage of males slightly greater than the females' one (43.4% to 42.0%). At sector level, the children's share is high in Karama (47.6%) and Kinazi (47.8%) and is very small in Ngoma (23.1%) compared to other remained sectors as The table below indicated.

3.1.2 Children with legal birth registration in Huye district

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that the percentage of children whose birth was registered is 94.28% at the national level. The birth registration rate in Huye district is high at a rate of 95.29 % compared to the province level where we have 93.81%. The variation by sex is not very significant as well as in Urban and Rural areas where it varies between 95.2% and 95.5%.

3.1.3 Birth registration by sector

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that birth registration varies across sectors and areas of residence (urban and rural). Note that 5 out 14 Sectors of Huye District have both Urban and Rural areas, the remaining sectors have only rural Areas.

The higher percentages of birth registrations are found in Simbi (98.7 %), Maraba (97.7%) and Karama (97.4%) while the lowest is in Mukura (91.0%). The percentage of birth registration for males is almost the same as the one for females.

3.2 Youth population in Rwanda

For statistical purposes, the United Nations defines "youth" as those persons between the ages of 15 and 24 years, without prejudice to other definitions by Member States. Considering the current priorities and trends of Rwanda's Development, the definition of Youth in terms of age has been revised in this policy. It was brought from 14-35 years to 16-30 years.

3.2.1 The youth population in Huye district

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 revealed that the youth population represent 27.1% (3,595,670) of the total population (13,246,394). In Huye district, the youth population was 94,211 which represents 24.7% of the total resident population of the district (381,900).

The sector with the highest youth share is Ngoma (30.2%) while Ruhashya (21.0%) and Karama (22.2%) have the lowest share of youth. The table below indicate the distribution of youth by sector and by sex.

3.2.2 Educational characteristics of youth

Youth who never attended school represent 5.15% of the youth resident population at national level; it represents 4.85% of the total resident population in Southern Province and 5.34% of the total resident population of Huye district. The percentage of youth who never attended school varies a lot within sectors of Huye district. The highest percentage was registered in Ngoma (12.79%) while the lowest percentages was registered in Kigoma (3.1%).

3.2.3 Highest level of education attended by youth in Huye District

In Huye district, 51.84 % of youth attained only the primary school level, 21.90 % attained the lower secondary education, 14.81 % attained the upper secondary education, 4.98% attained university and 5.34 % have never attended school. The highest level of education attained varies across sectors of the district. The sector with the highest percentage of youth who never attended school is Ngoma (12.79%). The percentage of youth with university level is high in Tumba with (13.89%). The sectors with the highest percentages of youth with primary education are Rwaniro (62.84%) and Simbi (61.24%).

3.2.4 Employment to population ratio among youth (16-30).

The Census results showed that in Rwanda the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 40.3%, it is higher among males than females 44.8% and 36.2% respectively. It was observed that in the district of Huye, the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 37.4%, it is higher among males (41.8%) than females (33.3%) The highest employment to population ratio among youth in Huye district was observed in Ngoma (47.6%), Mukura (42.9%) and Rusatira (42.6%), the lowest employment to population ratio among youth was observed in Rwaniro (24.3%), Karama (28.1%) and Kigoma(28.3%).

3.2.5 Distribution (%) of the currently employed youth age 16-30 years by Province, District, Sector and status in employment

In Huye district, most of the youth aged 16-30 currently employed are employees (66.3%) followed by own account worker without regular employees (27.8%). The highest percentages of youth employees are found in Ngoma, Huye, Mukura and Tumba with (80.2%, 79.6%, 79.5% and 75.8% respectively)) while the lowest are in Maraba (44.7%) and Simbi(45.3%). 3.2.6 Proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training in Southern Province by sex, district, and area of residence.

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate that, In Rwanda the proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training stood at 39.5 %. It is higher among females (43.8 %) than males (34.9 %).

In Southern Province, the proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training is 41.4 %, it is lower among males (37.5 %) than females (45.0 %). 2022 census results also revealed that the proportion is higher in rural areas of South (43.3 percent) than in urban areas (31.4 percent).

The proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training among people residing in Huye district stood at 40.2 percent. It is much higher (44.2 percent) among people residing in rural areas of Huye district than the ones residing in urban areas of Huye district (25.7 percent). 3.3 Persons with disabilities

In 2015, 193 countries agreed to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its Sustainable Development Goals with a commitment where possible, "to disaggregate the statistics they generate by disability to provide important insights about the extent to which persons with disabilities (PWDs) are being included in society, benefit from government programs, or are included in the workforce.

At the national level, 3.4% of the resident population aged 5 years and above have a disability while in Huye district, the disability prevalence rate is 4.1 %. At sector level, the highest prevalence rates of the resident population aged 5 years and above with disability are in Kinazi (5.0%), Ruhashya (4.9%) and Ngoma (4.8%). The lowest is in Simbi (3.0), Rwaniro (3.4%) and Kigoma(3.5%).

3.4 Elderly Population (60 years and above)

Rwanda has enacted laws such as the Law No 088/01 of 07/09/2020 (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2020) on Presidential order ratifying the protocol to the African charter on human and peoples' rights on the rights of older persons in Africa adopted by the twenty sixth ordinary session of the Assembly, held in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, on 31 January 2016 through an Official Gazette No.27 of 07/09/2020 and Law No.59/2008 of 10/09/2008 on prevention and punishment of gender- based violence (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2008), whose Article 32 sets the penalty for violence against an elderly person.

It is over two decades since the United Nations convened the First World Assembly on Ageing (Vienna, 1982) (National Academy of Sciences, National Research Council, 2001)) that launched an international action programme, which was the first international instrument on ageing, to provide a foundation for the formulation of policies and programmes on ageing. This was done to guarantee economic and social security to older people and other opportunities to contribute to national development.

3.4.1 Elderly population of Huye district by Sector

In 2022, the elderly persons constitute 8.5 % of the total resident population of Huye district. The share of the elderly females (9.7%) is higher than the male's one (7.4%), reflecting the higher life expectancy for women. By sector, Ngoma (12.7%), Karama(9.7%) and Simbi (9.5%) have the highest share of elderly among their total population while Tumba have the lowest (5.3%).

3.4.2 Employment among elderly people

In Rwanda, people keep on working until old age, the share of employed persons among the elderly population stands at 28.2%. The share is higher among the elderly males (33.7%) than elderly females (24.3%). In Huye district, 25.6 % of elderly people were employed. The percentage of employed elderly people is higher among males than females (27.3% vs. 24.3%). Employment among elderly residents is high in Rusatira (34.1%) and Mukura (33.2%). It is low in Rwaniro (16.7%).

3.4.3 Marital status of elderly people

In Huye district, more than half of the elderly population (52.3%) were married and 33.4% were widowed. The rate of celibacy among elderly was 2.9% while divorce and separation rate is 2.2%. Marital status among the elderly varies slightly by sector of residence as the table below displayed.

CHAPTER 4: HOUSEHOLDS AND HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS

4.1 Household characteristics

In this chapter, the 5th Population and Housing Census 2022 investigated households and housing characteristics; those include household size, households' heads by sex, type of habitat, housing tenure, materials used for construction, sources of energy used for lighting and cooking, water sources, sanitation facilities, asset possessed by household and mode of waste and disposals.

4.1.1 Number and mean size of the private households

The results of the 5th RPHC 2022 indicate the total of 3,312,743 private households in Rwanda. In the Southern Province, they are 760,173 and 96,037 in Huye District.

The average household size in Huye district is 3.8 persons per household. At the Sector level, the highest household size is found in Karama (4.1 persons/household). The smallest household sizes are found in Ngoma, Ruhashya and Tumba (3.7 persons/household each). The table below indicates number of households and size of household members per sector.

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4.1.2 Private households' heads of Huye District

The results of the 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that 28.9% of private households are headed by women at national level. In Huye district, private households headed by females are 34.9%. At sector level, the highest percentages of households headed by women are found in Gishamvu (39.8%) and Rusatira (37.0%) while the lowest are found in Maraba (30.4%).

4.2 Housing Characteristics

4.2.1 Type of habitat

The results of the 5th Population and Housing Census 2022 revealed that in Southern Province, the predominant type of habitat is Umudugudu Planned Rural settlement (72.3%) and Dispersed /Isolated housing (20.2%). The most common type of habitat in Huye district is is Umudugudu Planned Rural settlement (82.0%) followed by Dispersed /Isolated housing (11.6%) and squatter housing (2.8%).

The type of habitat across sectors in Huye district tend to be the same with Umudugudu Planned Rural settlement where is most prevalent in Rusatira, Kinazi, Simbi, Maraba and Kigoma with (96.1%, 92.0%, 91.4%, 91.2%, and 91.1 respectively). The sectors with the high percentages of dispersed/isolated housing units are Huye (42.1%) and Mbazi (16.8%). The table below displays results by sector.

According to the area of residence, In Urban Area, the predominant types are Umudugudu/Planned rural settlement (80.2%) and spontaneous/squatter housing (9.8%) but in rural areas, the predominant type are Umudugudu/Planned rural settlement (82.4%) followed by dispersed/isolated housing (13.7%). 4.2.2 Tenure of the housing

The results of the 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that the ownership of housing in the Southern Province represents 77.6 %, tenants represent 14.5% and free lodging represents 6.3%. In Huye district, 17.5% of housing units are occupied by tenants while 73.4% are occupied by their owners and free lodging represents 7.8%.

At the sector level, the percentage of owners of households' units is high in Simbi (88.5%), Maraba (86.6%) and Kigoma (86.5%) and low in Ngoma (41.8%) and Tumba (49.3%).

The percentage of tenants of housing units is high in Ngoma (47.1%) and Tumba (42.1%) and low in Simbi (3.9%).

The percentage of free lodging units is high in Karama (11.4%) and low in Rusatira(6.0%).



According to the area of residence, 3 types of tenure of housing units (owners, tenants, and free lodging) predominate in urban areas as well as in rural areas. The percentage of owners of housing units is 44.8% in urban areas to 79.7% in rural areas and the percentage of tenants of housing units is 46.5% in urban areas to 11.2% in rural areas. The percentage of free lodging is 6.1% in urban areas to 8.1% in rural areas. The figures below indicate details:

4.2.3 Material of the housing units

4.2.3.1 Main materials of the roof

The results of the 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets in Rwanda (74.1%) and in Southern Province (60.7%) of housing units are mainly covered by local tiles. In Huye district, housing units are covered by iron sheets (50.9%), 48.6% by local tiles, only 0.2% are covered by industrial tiles and 0.1% by Asbestos.

The high percentages of housing units covered by iron sheets are found in 5 sectors: Ngoma (86.6%), Tumba (80.4%), Kinazi(64.3%), Huye (57.3%), Rusatira(55.6%) and Mukura(54.7%). The lowest is in Karama with 28.2% of housing units covered by iron sheets.

The highest percentage of the housing units covered by local tiles are found in 6 sectors: Karama (71.4%), Simbi (67.5%), Gishamvu(65.6%), Maraba (65.2%), Ruhashya(64.0%) and Kigoma(62.4%). The lowest is in Ngoma with 11.5% of housing units covered by local tiles.



According to the area of residence, the predominant roofing materials in urban areas are the iron sheets (84.4%%) and local tiles (14.3%). In rural areas, the predominant roofing materials are the local tiles (56.1%) and the iron sheets (43.6%). The figure below illustrates details:

4.2.3.2 Main materials of the walls

The results of the census show that the most materials of the walls of the housing units are sundried bricks with cement: 36.3% in Rwanda, 35.8% in Southern Province and 34.2% in Huye district. At the national level, it is followed by sundried bricks without cement (30.7%) while the second most materials of the walls of the housing units in Southern Province and Huye district are wood with mud without cement (26.7% and 29.0% respectively). At the sector level, Sun dried bricks with cement is the frequently used material in Mbazi (51.7%), Huye (50.4%), Tumba (49.1%), Kinazi(44.0%) and Ngoma (42.9%). Wood with mud without cement are the most used materials in Kigoma (58.6%), Karama (52.7%) and Rwaniro (51.7%). The table below displays details:

According to the area of residence, the main materials used for walls of the housing units in urban areas are mostly sun-dried bricks with cement (48.5%), followed by burnt bricks with cement (16.4%), and sun-dried bricks without cement (13.9%), burnt bricks without cement (7.9%) and wood with mud without cement (6.4%).

In rural areas, wood with mud without cement are predominant materials with (34.0%), followed by sun-dried bricks with cement (31.1%), wood with mud and cement (17.3%) and sun-dried bricks without cement (15.2%). The figure below provides details.

4.2.3.3 Main materials of the floor

The results of the 5RPHC 2022 indicate that the main material of the floor of the housing units is the earth (60.4%) in countrywide as well as in the Southern Province with 64.2%) and in Gisagara district with 53.3%.

The second main material of the floor of the housing units is the cement where it represents 31.2% at the national level, 26.4% at province level and 29.0% in Gisagara district.

At sector level, the earth as main material used for the floor is most found in Rwaniro (71.2%), Ruhashya (68.6%), Kinazi (65.2%), Kigoma (64.2%), Rusatira (62.0%) and Simbi (60.6%).

The high percentages of housing units whose floor is cement are found in Ngoma (67.1%), Tumba (55.7%) and Huye (35.8%). The table below displays details:

By areas of residence, the results of the census indicate that the predominant materials used for the floor of the housing units are cement (61.9%) followed by earth (24.7%), ceramic/clay/granite tiles (6.9%) and Burnt bricks (4.5%) in urban areas. In rural areas, the predominant materials are earth (59.5%), cement (21.8%), dung hardened (15.2%) and Burnt Bricks (2.3) The figure below provides details:




Figure 4. 5 Distribution (%) of the private households of Huye district by main material of floor of the housing unit and by area of residence

4.3. Source of energy of the private households

4.3.1 Grid line connectivity in Huye district

At the national level, the results of the 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that 52.5% of private households are connected to the national grid while 47.5% are not connected. In Southern Province the percentage of private households connected to the national grid line is 43.8% while it is 47.0% in Huye district. At the sector level, only in 2 sectors out of 14, over 80% of private households have connected (Ngoma 89.4% and Tumba (80.9%) and in other 2 sectors over 50% of private households have connected (Huye with 60.7% and Mukura with 63.4%). In all 10 remained sectors, the rate of connectivity is very low. The least connected sector is Rwaniro(14.1%).



4.3.2 Main source of energy for lighting in Huye district

In Huye district, the main source of energy for lighting used by households is electricity (56.4%) and Flashlight or Phone flashlight (31.6%). At the sector level, the percentage of households using electricity for lighting is high in Ngoma and Tumba (89.8% and 82.1% respectively). The sectors with the high percentages of private households using flashlight/phone flashlight for lighting are Rwaniro (55.9%) and Simbi (50.8%). Table below provides details:

According to the area of residence, the main source of energy for lighting is electricity (49.8%), followed by flashlight/phone flashlight (37.2%) and Firewood (4.8%) in rural areas. 4.3.3 Main sources of energy for cooking in Huye district

At the district level, the main sources of energy for cooking used by the private households are firewood (82.8%) followed by charcoal (13.7%) and gas (1.9%).

At the sector level, firewood is the most used source of cooking energy by private households where over 90% of private households in 9 Sectors out of 14 use it (Simbi, Rwaniro, Gishamvu, Karama, Maraba, Kigoma, Ruhashya, Kinazi and Rusatira). Sectors with the highest percentages of private households using Charcoal and gas as main sources of cooking energy are Ngoma (52.3% and 13.6% respectively) and Tumba (49.3% and 6.5% respectively).

4.3.4 Water and sanitation of the private households in Huye district

4.3.4.1 Main source of drinking water

The results of the 5RPHC 2022 reveal that improved drinking water sources is the most water sources in Rwanda that represent (82.3%). In Huye district, 88.5% of private households use improved drinking water sources. At the sector level, the percentage of the private households using water from improved drinking sources is highest in Ngoma (97.7%), Mukura(96.7%), Tumba(96.5%)and Mbazi(91.1%). It is low in Karama (71.3%) and Rwaniro(74.2%).



4.3.4.2 Main type of toilet facility

The results of census reveal that the main types of toilet facility used by the private households in Rwanda are Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household (68.8%). In Huye district, main types of toilet facility used by the private households are Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household (70.2%), pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by several households (17.6%) and pit latrine without constructed floor slab used by one household (7.0%).

At the sector level, the percentage of households using pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household is high in Maraba (81.9%), Kigoma (81.4%) and Gishamvu (81.3%) while it is low in Ngoma (44.8%) and Tumba (47.2%).

For pit latrines with constructed floor slab used by several households, Tumba(35.5%) has the highest rate of 35.5% while the lowest percentage is found in Simbi (8.1%).

Pit latrine without constructed floor slab used by one household type is most found in Huye(14.8%), Karama(11.2%) and Simbi(10.5%).

The high percentages of households using Flush toilets used by one household are found in Ngoma (22.3%)



According to the area of residence in Huye district, the type of toilet facility used by the private households varies. In urban areas, the types of toilets most used are pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household (45.2%) and pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by several households (34.9%) followed by Flush toilets used by one Household (14.6%). In rural areas, the main types of toilets used are pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household (75.7%) and pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by several households (13.8%) and pit latrine without constructed floor slab used by one household(7.9%). The figure below indicates details:

4.3.4.3 Mode of waste disposal in Huye district

The results of the census reveal that, in Huye district, the high percentage of households (59.7%) evacuate their waste through the Household compost dumping while 30.8% of private households evacuate it by thrown in the household's fields or bushes and 3.4% in the waste collection companies.

At the Sector level, the high percentages of households evacuating their waste through the Household compost dumping are in Simbi (72.1%) and Mukura (71.0%). The high percentages of households evacuating their waste by throwing them in fields/bushes are high in Kinazi(44.1%) and Karama(40.5%). The high percentages of households evacuating their waste by using public compost dumping are in Tumba(8.7%)Karama(7.3%) and Ngoma(7.0%).

The results of the census indicate that the main modes of waste disposal used by households vary also by area of residence. In urban areas, domestic waste is mainly collected and evacuated by Household compost dumping (51.8%), followed by evacuating them in the household's fields or in the bushes (20.2%) and by evacuating them using waste collection companies (17.6%).

In rural areas, the households evacuate their waste mainly by compost dumping (61.5%) and others in their fields or in the bushes (33.2%). The figure below illustrates details:

4.4 Assets possessed by private households in Huye district.

4.4.1 Communication assets possessed by private households in Huye District

At the district level, 75.2% of private households possess a radio, 70.1% a mobile phone, 18.1% a smartphone, 10.0% a TV and 4.1% a computer.

The percentage of private households possessing a radio is high in Ngoma (91.2%) and Tumba (85.7%) while it is low in Rwaniro (64.9%).

The percentage of private households possessing a television is high in Ngoma (34.6%) and while it is low in Rwaniro (1.5%).

Mobile phone is mostly possessed by private households of Ngoma and Tumba (89.1% and 83.0% respectively).

The sector with high percentage of households with smartphone is Ngoma (54.1%) while the percentage of households possessing this asset is low in Rwaniro(5.2%).

The computer is mostly possessed in Ngoma (20.1%).

4.4.2 Access to the Internet

The results of the 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that the percentages of households with at least one member using internet are 22.2% at national level while they are 15.7% in Southern Province and 19.4% in Huye district.

At sector level, the high percentage of households with at least one member using internet is high in Ngoma (55.5%), Tumba (45.3%) and Mukura (22.4%). The sectors with the lower percentages of households with at least one member using internet are Rwaniro (7.3%) and Simbi (7.8%).



According to the area of residence in Huye district, the results of the census show that the access to the Internet varies greatly. CHAPTER 5: AGRICULTURE IN HUYE DISTRICT

The agriculture was the one of the areas of investigation of the 5th Rwanda Population and housing census conducted in 2022. The households engaged in Livestock husbandry; the number of private crop farming households cultivating different types of crops, by Sector, the number of private households raising different types of livestock, by Sector and type of household raised in district were captured in the census.

5.1 The households engaged in crop farming and livestock husbandly.

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that 2,280,854 private households (68.9%) are engaged in agriculture country wide. Among them, 62.6% are engaged in crop farming and 50.4% are engaged in Livestock husbandry. In Huye district, crop farming and animal husbandly are on good scale. Agricultural households represent 78.0% with 72.4 % of households engaged in crop farming and 59.3 % in Livestock husbandry.

At the sector level, the highest percentages of agricultural households are found in Simbi (93.4%) and Karama (92.4%). Households engaged in crop farming are more represented in Karama (90.4%) and Simbi (89.9%) while those engaged in livestock husbandry are in Simbi (79.7%) and Kigoma (76.7%). The table below provides details:

5.2 Distribution of private household engaged in crop farming of different types of crops, by Sector

The results of 5th Population and housing census 2022 indicate that the most cultivated crops by the private households of Huye district are Bean, Cassava, Fruits, Sweet Potato, Maize, sorghum, Banana, SoyBean, Vegetables, Yan and Taro and Irish Potato. Those crops are found in households that apply agriculture activities as displayed in the following table

5.3 Distribution of private households engaged in raising different types of livestock, by Sector

Nationally and in the Southern Province, the results of the census indicate that most private households are considerably more engaged in raising cows, goats, pigs, and chickens than other livestock. It is in the same extent in Huye district. The sectors that have high proportion of private households that are engaged in livestock are: Rwaniro,Simbi and Kigoma for Cows ,Rustira,Kinazi and Mbazi for Goats, Kigoma,Maraba and Simbi for Pigs and Mbazi,Kinazi and Rwaniro for Chickens.In all those sectors more than 1,000 households declared engaged in livestock.
