FOREWORD

The Government of Rwanda, through the National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) conducted the 2022 Rwanda Population and Housing Census to provide updated demographic, social and economic indicators for policy formulation and planning to support the national development agenda and track the implementation of national, regional, continental and global development goals, such as the First National Strategy for Transformation (NST1 2017-2024); the AU Agenda 2063; and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The Population and Housing Census in Rwanda dates back to the year 1978 when the first ever modern census was implemented. The second, third, and fourth censuses were carried out in 1991, 2002, and 2012 respectively. The 2022 Population and Housing Census marks therefore the Fifth in the series following the United Nations Recommendations to conduct a census every ten years.

Considering census' crucial importance for the planning process, the Government of Rwanda has made the Population and Housing Census a priority to be undertaken every 10 years and adopted the use of technologies for timely delivery of census results for use.

Results of the 2022 Population and Housing Census provide population numbers from national to the lowest administrative level, as well as demographic and socio-economic indicators at both national and district levels. The census remains the only national data collection exercise that can provide the lowest levels of disaggregation to support decentralised decision making across the country.

I would like therefore to take this opportunity to thank all stakeholders that contributed to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. They include Ministries and other Government institutions, international organizations such as the World Bank (WB), the European Union (EU), the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), One-UN, UN Women, UNICEF, UNECA, the United Kingdom AID (UKAID), the African Development Bank (AfDB), the USAID, Enabel, PARIS 21 and others for their support in diverse ways.




Figure 1. 1 Administrative map of Musanze district

CHAPTER 1: POPULATION SIZE, SPATIAL DISTRIBUTION, AND STRUCTURE

1.1 Size and spetial Distribution of the population

1.1.1 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Northern Province

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 2,038,511 residents in the Northern Province, which represents 15.4 % of the total population of Rwanda (13,246,394 residents). The population of the Northern Province is predominantly female; 1,065,551 are women corresponding to 52.3 % of the total population of the Northern province. Musanze is the most populated district with 476,522 residents in 2022. Its population represents 23.4% of the total residents' population of Northern Province. The least populated district in the Northern Province is Rulindo with 360,144 inhabitants, corresponding to 17.7% of the total resident population of Northern Province.

1.1.2 Population Density of the Northern Province by District

Population density is a measurement of population per unit land area. Density is the number of the inhabitant per Km². The Rwanda Population and Housing Census conducted in 2022 revealed that, the population density in Rwanda is 503 inhabitants per Km². The Northern Province has 663 inhabitants per Km². The district with a high population density is Musanze with 1,157 Inhabitants per km². The district with a lowest population density is Gakenke with 520 Inhabitants per km². The figure below indicates distribution of population density in Northern province per district.




Figure 1. 2 Population density (inhabitant per Km²) by district in Northern Province

1.1.3 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of the Musanze district

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 476,522 residents in Musanze district, which represent 23.4% % of the total population of the Northern Province (2,038,511 residents). The population of Musanze district is predominantly female: 249,182 are women corresponding to 52.3 % of the total population of Musanze district. Females are predominant in all sectors of the district except Muhoza sector with 49.4%. Muhoza (69,741 population), Cyuve (62,179 population), and Musanze (47,720 population) are the most populated sectors. They represent 14.6%, 13%, and 10% of the total population of Musanze district, respectively. The two less populated sectors are Gashaki (14,272 inhabitants) and Nkotsi (17,349 inhabitants). They represent 3% and 3.6% of the total resident population of Musanze district, respectively. The Table 1. 2 below indicates the number of the population of Musanze district by sector, by sex, density, and their shares across sectors to the total population of Musanze district.

1.1.4 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Musanze district by residence area

The results of Rwanda Population and housing census 2022 revealed that, the total population of Rwanda are spatially distributed in rural area that represent 72.1% and urban area represent 27.9%. The Northern Province is predominantly by the rural area (82.6%) and urban area (17.4%). Musanze district population is predominantly by rural area 50.8% while urban represents 49.2%. The sectors of Musanze district which are almost urban are Muhoza, Kimonyi, Busogo, and Cyuve. Gashaki and Remera Sectors are entirely rural while Rwaza, Shingiro, Gacaca, and Kinigi sectors are almost rural. The Table 1. 3 below illustrates the results.


1.1.5 Age-Sex Structure of the Population of Musanze district

Musanze population is mostly young. About 57% of the resident population of Musanze is under 25 years, as shown by the age pyramid (Figure 1. 4Error! Reference source not found.), reflecting the high level of fertility in the recent past. The elderly (60 years and above) represents 6 % of the total population of the district. 1.1.6 population share of some specific interventions target groups in Musanze District by sex

The Rwanda population and housing census 2022 indicates the population on specific agesbased programs, policy and strategies interventions in health, education, employment and also indicates the population categories in their respective characteristics such as children, youth, working population, among other things. For instance, children under five years for immunization programs (Under 5 years children), children in school age (3-17 years), people in the official working age group (16 years and above), etc. Knowing the size of such groups is of great importance for the design, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of programs targeting such groups. The below table gives the size of the main interventions target groups by sex, and their share in the entire population of Musanze district. The population aged 0-17 represents 43.3 % of the total population of the district, 16-30 years represent 29.3%; the working age population 16 years and above represents 61.5 % of the same population. The Table 1. 5 below shows distribution of Musanze districts by targeted interventions by their age.

CHAPTER 2: CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION

2.1 Socio-cultural characteristics of the population

2.1.1 Nationality of the population of Musanze district

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that, the Rwandan population by nationality represent 99.11 % and foreigners represent 0.89%. In the Northern Province, foreigners represent 0.1% and Musanze districts, the Rwandan by nationality represent 99.7% and foreigners represent 0.24% (1,142). Two sectors of Musanze districts that have the highest percentage of foreigners compared to others; are Muhoza (0.65%), and Cyuve (0.44%). The Table 2. 1 below illustrates the distribution of the population by nationality with their respective sectors of residence.

2.1.2 Religious affiliation of the resident population of Musanze District

2.2 Marital Status of the resident population of Musanze district

2.2.1 Marital Status by sector

The results of 5RPHC-2022, the

Table 2. 3 shows that about 51.6% of the resident population of Musanze district aged 12 and above were living in union (married officially to one wife/husband, married not officially to one wife/husband, live in polygamous union) at the time of the census, while 42.2% were never married, 4.7 % were widowed, while separated and divorced were respectively 1.3% and 0.2%. At the sector level, fourteen out of 15 sectors, more than 50% of their residents are currently married people. Muhoza sector has the highest percentages (about 49%) of the never married persons. Nyange, Muko, Remera, and Rwaza sectors have high percentage of widowed persons (about 6% each). Details of the resident population of Musanze district aged 12 years and above by marital status and sex is presented in the annex.

2.2.2 Marital status by Age groups

The percentages of resident population of Musanze district by marital status vary by sex and age: The percentage of never married persons decreases from 99.9% (age group of 12-14 years) to 0.8% (age group of 80 years and above). The percentage of persons currently living in union starts by increasing from 0.1% (age group of 12-14 years) to a maximum of 88% (age group of 40-44 years) before decreasing to 47% (age group 85+) due mainly to widowhood (52%). The highest percentage of divorced persons (around 0.6%) is observed from age groups 40-49, while the highest percentage of the separated persons (around 2.3%) is found in age groups 30-49 years (Table 2. 4).

2.3 Educational Characteristics of the Population of Musanze district

2.3.1 School attendance

Table 2. 5 indicates that in Musanze District, 52.4% of pre-primary-age population (3-5 years) are currently attending school, 47.6% of children have never attended and none of children have previously attended (i.e children who have already had prior exposure to nursery school education before the time of census but who were not attending nursery school/droped-out during census time). Gashaki Sector has the highest proportion of children (age between 3 to 5) currently attending school in Musanze District (78.2%). Following closely, the Remera Sector has a percentage of `74.7 % of children currently attending school. Rwaza sector has the lowest percentage of children currently attending school, with only 33.6% enrolled. On the other hand, Rwaza sector has the highest proportion of children aged 3 to 5 who have never attended school (66.4%).

Table 2.6 shows that in Musanze District 91% of children age 6 to 11 years (the official primary school-going age) are currently attending school, 7.4% have never attended school and only 1.5% have previously attended school (which means that 9 of children aged 6 to 11 are out of school).

By comparing the distribution of the primary school-age population (6-11 years) across sectors in Musanze District, comparisons reveal the disparities in primary school attendance across different sectors within Musanze District. Sectors like Kimonyi, and Shingiro exhibit lower rates of children currently attending school (84.3, and 86.2, respectively) and higher rates of children who have never attended are in Kimonyi (14.2%) and Shingiro (12%) sectors. On the other hand, sectors like Gashaki, Nkotsi and Remera demonstrate higher rates of children currently attending school (96.7%, 95.9% and 95.6%, respectively) and lower rates of children who have never attended (2.8, 3.3%, and 3.7%, respectively).

In Musanze District, 26.6% of the population aged 12 to 17 have previously attended school (i.e. they dropped out of school), 70.3% are currently attending school and 3.0% have never attended secondary school. The distribution of the secondary school-age population (12-17 years) across sectors in Musanze District, shows that Busogo sector has the highest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school at 81.6%. Conversely, Kimonyi sector has the lowest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school with 63.6%. Shingiro Sector also has the highest percentage of the population between the ages of 12 and 17 who have never attended school at 5.9%.

2.3.2 Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Primary School in Musanze district

Gross and Net Attendance Ratios are used to measure the extent of coverage of an educational program. It gives a comparison of the children attending school with the total size of the school-age population. It can also be used for assessing how far a country has succeeded in bringing to school all those who are eligible to attend.

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 reveal that not all children attending primary school level are of the official age for that level (6-11 years). The gross attendance rate in Rwanda is 141.7, in the Northern Province, GAR is 144.1 and 138.4 in Musanze district. The Net Attendance Rate (NAR) in Primary school for Musanze district (91.0%) is below the NAR of the Northern Province (92.9%) and NAR of Musanze higher the NAR of national level (89.3%).

A Gross Attendance Rate (GAR) of 138.4% in Musanze District for the population 6 to 11 years indicates a high percentage of those who attended primary schools aged below 6 years and or above 11 years. On the other hand, the NAR of 91.0% for the population 6 to 11 years indicates that only 91.0% of the population 6 to 11 years were attending primary schools in Musanze District by 2022 (Table 2.8). In 2022, students older or younger than the official primary school age range made up 34.2% [(GAR138.4-NAR91.0)/GAR138.4] of the primary school population of Musanze District.

With a NAR of 96.7%, the Gashaki Sector has the greatest percentage of pupils that are attending primary school and are of primary school-age. In comparison to other sectors, the Kimonyi sector has the lowest NAR at 84.2%, indicating a lesser percentage of pupils who are attending primary school within the eligible age range. Almost all sectors have gender parity indexes greater than 1.00 except Muhoza and Nkotsi sectors (1.00 each), suggesting better access to education for female students compared to male students.

2.3.3 Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Secondary School

The table 2. 9 provides information on the gross and net attendance rates in the secondary school level (12-17 years) in Musanze District, disaggregated by sex and sector. The Northern Province and Musanze District both have higher NARs than the national average (22.9% and 26.4%, respectively, versus 22.3%) when compared to the national average. Comparing males and females in Musanze District in terms of Net Attendance Rates (NAR), the table 2. 9 indicates that a higher proportion of females 29.6%) in Musanze District, within the secondary school-age range (12-17 years), are attending school compared to males (23.1%). Female students older or younger than the official secondary school age range made up 39.1 % [(GAR48.6-NAR29.6)/GAR48.6] of the female with secondary school age of Musanze District, while for male students it made up 44.8 % [(GAR41.9-NAR23.1)/GAR41.9].This shows that females have a higher attendance rate in Musanze District compared to males when considering the overall attendance rates, regardless of age or grade-level eligibility.

Among the sectors in Musanze District, Muhoza sector has the highest GAR for both sexes, with a rate of 72.0%. Sector such as Gacaca has relatively lower GAR compared to others (26.6%). Muhoza has the highest NAR for both sexes in Musanze District, with a rate of 38.4%. Sectors like Gacaca, Shingiro, and Gataraga have relatively lower(less than 20%) NAR compared to others (16.4%, 17.1% and 19.3% respectively).

2.3.4 Highest level of school attended in Musanze district

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate the total population of Rwanda aged 3 and above is 11,999,691. The highest level of education attended is categorized into several levels: Never attended School, Nursery, Primary, INGOBOKA/Vocational, Lower secondary, Upper secondary, University, and Not stated. In Rwanda, 16.7% of the population aged 3 years and above has never attended school, while 2.7% have attended nursery, and 59.5% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.8% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.6% for lower secondary, 7.1% for upper secondary, 3.6% for university. The total population of the Northern Province aged 3 and above is 1,847,684. The distribution of the highest level of education attended is like the national level, with slight variations. In the Northern Province, 16% of the population has never attended school, while 2.7% have attended nursery, and 61.9% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.7% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.6% for lower secondary, 6.4% for upper secondary, 2.6% for university.

The total population of Musanze District aged 3 and above is 437,445. In Musanze District, 15.6% of the population has never attended school, while 3.2% have attended nursery, and 55.8% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.5% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 10.8% for lower secondary, 9.2% for upper secondary, and 4.9% for university. The distribution of the highest level of education attended varies among sectors, with differences in the percentage of individuals at each education level. For example, Kimonyi, and Nyange sectors have a higher percentage (19.6% each) of individuals who have never attended school compared to other sectors, while Muhoza has a higher percentage (16.0%) of individuals attended upper secondary school. Each sector has its own unique distribution of educational levels attended by the population. The table below indicates the findings:

2.4 Characteristics of the Employed Population

The official working age in Rwanda is 16 years and above. Aggregate employment generally increases with growing population. Therefore, the ratio of Employment to the working age population (employment to population ratio) is an important indicator of the capacity of the Economy to provide employment to a growing population. A decline in the employment-to population ratio is often regarded as an indicator of economic slowdown and a decline in total employment as an indicator of a more severe economic downturn.

2.4.1 Employment to population ratio by sex, Province, District and area of residence

The results presented in the below table 2.11 shows that the employment to population ratio stood at 45.9 in Rwanda, it is lower among females (40.2 percent) than males (52.4 percent). On the other side, it was observed that the employment to population ratio is higher in urban areas of Rwanda (53.5 percent) than in rural areas (42.7 percent). It was observed that in Northern Province, the employment to population ratio stood at 42.9 percent, it is higher in urban areas (50.3 percent) than in rural areas of Northern Province (41.3 percent).

It was also revealed that the employment to population ratio is 46.6 percent among people residing in Musanze district, it is higher in urban areas of Musanze (50.1 percent) than in rural areas of Musanze (43.3 percent).

2.4.2 Employment to population ratio(EPR) among the resident population of Musanze aged 16 years and above by age group and sex

Figure 2.1 allows the study of intensity of Employment to population ratio and its variation by sex. The figure reveals the following remarks: The employment to population ratio among males as well as females increases from age group 16-19 to 35-44 and starts decreasing from age group 45-49 to 85 years and above as people starts getting very older and retire. It was observed that in district of Musanze, the highest employment to population ratio among males stands at 69.5% and was observed in age group 35-39, On the other side the highest employment to population among females is 52.1% and was observed in the age group 35-39. The lowest employment to population ratio among males stands at 8.2% and was observed among males in the age group 85+, the lowest employment to population ratio among females is 4.0% and was observed among females in the age group 85+.

CHAPTER 3: SUB-POPULATION

3.1 Children Population (0-17 years)

According to the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989), a child is defined as every human being under 18 unless, under the law applicable to the child, majority is attained earlier. It is relevant to underline here that this definition by age coincides with that of Rwanda, as stipulated in Article 3 of the National Law n° 54/2011 of 14 December 2011 relating to the rights and the protection of the child, which stipulates that a child is any person under the age of 18. The age range (0-17) adopted for this report reflects this definition.

3.1.1 Number and share of children in Musanze district

At the national level, the results of 5^{Th} RPHC-2022 revealed that, the children population constitute 45% of the total population of 13,246,394. The Northern Province has 888,804 children with a share of 43.6% of the Northern province total resident population. In Musanze District, the children constitute 43.3% of the resident population of the district, number of females is slightly greater than that of males (104,228 vs 102,243%). The children's share is high in Gacaca (46.5%), and small share in Muhoza (36.7%). For more details see the Table 3. 1.

3.1.2 Children with birth registration in Musanze district

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that the percentage of children whose birth was registered is 94.3% at the national level. The birth registration rate in Musanze district is 94.8%. Birth registration performance is almost the same in urban (95.4%) and (94.3%) in the rural areas of Musanze district. The Table 3. 2 below illustrates the findings:

3.1.3 Birth registration by Sector in Musanze district.

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that birth registration varies across sectors and areas of residence (urban and rural). High percentage of birth registrations is found in Remera (98.8%) while the lowest is in Shingiro (91.6%). The percentage of birth registration for males is almost the same as the one for females. In urban areas of Musanze district, birth registration is 95.4% while in rural areas, it is 94.3%.

3.2 Youth population in Rwanda

The United Nations, for statistical purposes, defines 'youth', as those persons between the ages of 15 and 24 years, without prejudice to other definitions by Member States. Considering the current priorities and trends of Rwanda's Development, the definition of Youth in terms of age has been revised in this policy. It was brought from 14–35 years to 16–30 years.

3.2.1 The youth population in Musanze district

The results of 5th Population and housing Censuses conducted in 2022 revealed that, the youth represent 27.14% (3,595,670) of the total population (13,246,394). The youth population in Musanze district was 139,508 which represents 29.3% of the total resident population of the district (476,522). The sector with the highest youth share is Muhoza (34.7%) while Gashaki (25.2%), Rwaza (25.5%), and Remera (25.6%) have the lowest share of youth (Table 3. 4)

3.2.2 Educational characteristics of youth

Youth who never attended school represents 5.1 % of the youth resident population at national level; it represents 4.2% of the total resident population in Northern Province and 4.6% of the total resident population of Musanze district. The percentage of youth who never attended school varies a lot within sectors of Musanze district. The highest percentage was registered in Shingiro (8.2%) while the lowest percentages were registered in Remera (2.1%), Gashaki (2.3%) and Nkotsi (2.9%), for more details see Table 3. 5.

3.2.3 Highest level of education attained by youth population in Musanze district

In Musanze district, among all youths, 45% attained only the primary school level, 22.8% attended the lower secondary education, 19.6 % attended the upper secondary education, 6.9% attended university, and 4.6% have not attended any formal of school. The highest level of education attended varies across sectors of the district. The sectors with the highest percentage of youth with no schooling are Shingiro (8.2 %). The high percentage of youth with university level is in Muhoza sector (16.7%). The sector with the highest percentage of youth with primary education is Gacaca (61 %). The Table 3. 6 below indicates details:

3.2.4 Employment to population ratio among youth (16-30).

The Census results showed that in Rwanda the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 40.3%, it is higher among males than females 44.8% and 36.2 % respectively. It was observed that in the district of Musanze, the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 40.8%, it is higher in among males (45.1%) than females (37.0%)

The highest employment to population ratio among youth in Musanze district was observed in Shingiro (54.3%), and Gataraga (50.8%), the lowest employment to population ratio among youth was observed in Gashaki (21.4%), Remera (22.8%) and Gacaca (23.0%).

3.2.5 Distribution (%) of the currently employed youth aged 16-30 years by Province, District, Sector and status in employment

In Musanze district, the majority of youth aged 16-30 currently employed are employees (69.9%) followed by own account worker without regular employees (22.5%). The highest percentage of youth employees is found in Gacaca (81.3%) while the lowest is in Rwaza and Shingiro sectors (52.1% each). The highest percentage of currently employed population who worked as own account worker without regular employees among youth is found in Rwaza (38.0%), while the lowest is observed in Gacaca (17.1%), and in Musanze (17.2%).

3.2.6 Proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training in Northern Province by sex, district, and area of residence.

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate that, In Rwanda the proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training stood at 39.5%. It is higher among females (43.8%) than males (34.9%).

In Northern Province, the proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training is 42.1 %, it is lower among males (38.6 %) than females (45.4 %). 2022 census results also revealed that the proportion is higher in rural areas of North Province (44.0 percent) than in urban areas of North Province (34.1 percent).

The proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training among people residing in Musanze district stood at 39.2 percent. It is much higher (44.6 percent) among people residing in rural areas of Musanze district than the ones residing in urban areas of Musanze district (34.1 percent). The table below indicates results on Proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training in Northern Province by Sector, District, Sex and Area of Residence.

3.3 Persons with disabilities

In 2015, 193 countries agreed to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its Sustainable Development Goals with a commitment where possible, "to disaggregate the statistics they generate by disability to provide important insights about the extent to which persons with disabilities (PWDs) are being included in society, benefit from government programmes, or are included in the workforce. At the national level, 3.4% of the resident population aged 5 years and above have a disability. while in Musanze district the disability prevalence rate is 3.1%. At sector level, the highest prevalence rates of the resident population aged 5 years and above with disability are in Remera sector (4.3%), and while the lowest is in Busogo sector (1.9%).

3.4 Elderly Population(60 years and above)

Rwanda has enacted laws such as the Law No 088/01 of 07/09/2020 (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2020) on Presidential order ratifying the protocol to the African charter on human and peoples' rights on the rights of older persons in Africa adopted by the twenty sixth ordinary session of the Assembly, held in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, on 31 January 2016 through an Official Gazette No.27 of 07/09/2020 and Law No.59/2008 of 10/09/2008 on prevention and punishment of gender- based violence (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2008), whose Article 32 sets the penalty for violence against an elderly person.

It is over two decades since the United Nations convened the First World Assembly on Ageing (Vienna, 1982) (National Academy of Sciences, National Research Council, 2001)) that launched an international action programme, which was the first international instrument on ageing, to provide a foundation for the formulation of policies and programmes on ageing. This was done to guarantee economic and social security to older persons and other opportunities to contribute to national development.

3.4.1 Elderly population in Musanze district by Sector

In 2022, the elderly persons constitute 6.1% of the total resident population of Musanze district. The share of the elderly females is higher than the male's one (7.3% vs. 4.8%), reflecting the higher life expectancy for women.

3.4.2 Employment among elderly people

In Rwanda, people keep on working until old age, the share of employed persons among the elderly population stands at 28.2%. The aforementioned share is higher among the elderly males (33.7%) than elderly females (24.4%).

In Musanze district, 27.0% of elderly people were employed. The percentage of employed elderly people is higher among males than females (32.7% vs. 23.6%).

Employment among elderly residents is high in Nkotsi (42.9%). It is low in Gacaca sector (10.5%), Remera (13.8%), and in Gashaki (14.5%).

3.4.3 Marital status of elderly people

The Table 3.14 below illustrates distribution of elderly people across sectors. In Musanze district, more than half of the elderly population (64.8%) were married and 32.7 % were widowed. The rate of celibacy among elderly was 1.5% while divorce or separation rate is under 1%. Marital status among the elderly varies slightly by sector of residence. Marriage among elderly people is more important in Gacaca and Gashaki sectors (about 70% each). widowhood is widespread in Kinigi (39%), and lowest in Gataraga sector (27.1%).

CHAPTER 4: HOUSEHOLDS AND HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS

4.1 Household characteristics

In this chapter 5th Population and housing census 2022 investigated households and housing characteristics; those include household size, head of household by sex, type of habitat, housing tenure, materials used for construction, sources of energy used for lighting and cooking, water sources, sanitation facilities, asset possessed by household and mode of waste and disposals.

4.1.1 Number and mean size of private households

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate the total of 3,312,743 households in Rwanda, 506,064 in the Northern Province, and 119,387 in Musanze District. The average household size in Musanze district is 3.9 persons per household. At the Sector level, the average Household Size (persons per household) is almost the same in all sectors of district. The Table 4. 1 below indicates number of households and size of household members per sector.

4.1.2 Private households' heads of Musanze District

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that nationally 28.9% of private households are headed by women. In Musanze district, private households headed by females are 27.7%. At sector level, the highest percentages of households headed by women are found in Busogo sector (30.5%) and Kinigi sector (30.1%) while the lowest is found in Gashaki sector (22.5%).

4.2 Housing Characteristics

4.2.1 Type of habitat

The results of 5th Population and Housing Census 2022 revealed that in the Northern Province the predominant type of habitat is Umudugudu (Planned rural settlement) (70.5%) and Dispersed/ Isolated housing (22.3%). The most common type of habitat in Musanze district is Umudugudu (Planned rural settlement) (76.4%) followed by Spontaneous/squatter housing (9.3%) and dispersed or isolated housing (7.7%). The type of habitat varies across sectors. Umudugudu (Planned rural settlement) is most prevalent in Kinigi sector (98.1%), and low in Kimonyi sector (23.2%). Spontaneous/squatter housing is most prevalent in Kimonyi (56.4%) and Musanze Sector (33.4%) and low in Nyange sector (0%). The sectors with the high percentages of dispersed/isolated housing units are Gataraga (52%). The



The type of habitat in Musanze district varies according to the area of residence. In urban areas, the predominant types are umudugudu/Planned rural settlement (75.9%) and Spontaneous/squatter housing (11.6%). In rural areas it is the same, the predominant type is umudugudu/Planned rural settlement (76.8%) followed by Dispersed/ Isolated housing (11.6%). The figures below indicate details:

4.2.2 Tenure of the housing in Musanze district


The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that the ownership of housing in the Northern Province represents 86.6% and tenant represent 9.5%. In Musanze district, 77.1% of housing units are occupied by their owners while 18.7% are occupied by tenants. At the sector level, the percentage of owners of households' units is high in Gashaki (94.2%), and low in Muhoza (48.3%). The percentage of tenants of housing units is high in Muhoza (47.0%), and low in Gashaki (2.1%). The Table 4. 4 below indicate details:

In Musanze district, 3 types of tenure of housing units (owners, tenants and free lodging) predominate in urban area as well as in rural area and their percentages vary substantially according to the area of residence. The percentage of owners of housing units is 69.4% in urban areas to 91.3% in rural areas, The percentage of tenants of housing units is 26.0% in urban areas to 5.4% in rural areas. The percentage of free lodging is 3.6% in urban areas to 2.8% in rural areas. The Figure 4. 2 below indicate details:

4.2.3 Material of the housing units in Musanze district

4.2.3.1 Main materials of the roof

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets in Rwanda (74.1%), in the Northern Province, the Iron sheet represent (79.3%). In Musanze district, housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets (84.7%). Only 15.1% are covered by local tiles and 0.1% by Industrial tiles. At the sector level, the highest percentage of housing units covered by iron sheets is found in Nyange sector (99.8%). The lowest percentage of housing units covered by iron sheets is found in Remera (28.9%) sector. The highest percentages of the housing units covered by local tiles are found in Remera (70.7%), and in Gashaki sectors (66.3%). The Table 4. 5 below displays details:



The results of the census reveal that the materials used for roofing of the households' units in Musanze district vary slightly according to the area of residence. In both rural and urban areas of Musanze district, the predominant roofing materials are iron sheets (76.1% in rural and 93.7% in urban areas). The percentage of housing units covered by local tiles is 23.8% in rural areas while it is 6.0 in urban areas. The Figure 4. 3 below illustrates details:

4.2.3.2 Main materials of the walls

The results of the census show that the housing units of wall are mostly built with sundried bricks in Rwanda (67%), and 71% in the Northern Province. In Musanze district, walls of the housing units are also mostly built with sundried bricks (54.3%), wood/mud (32.5%), and burnt bricks (9.1%). At the sector level, sundried bricks are the mostly used materials in Rwaza (94.1%) and Busogo (92.6%). Wood/mud is the most frequently used material in Kinigi (92.2%) and Nyange (74.6%). The Table 4. 6 below displays details:



The main materials used for walls of the housing units in Musanze district are mostly sundried bricks, wood with mud and burnt bricks and their percentages vary substantially according to the area of residence. In urban areas, the predominant materials are sundried bricks with cement (37.7%) followed by sundried bricks without cement (24.3%). Burnt bricks (17.7% with and without cement) and wood with mud (16.8% with and without cement). In rural areas, wood with mud are predominant materials with 47.6% followed by sundried bricks (46.9%) and burnt bricks (0.8%). The Figure 4. 4 below provides details:

4.2.3.3 Main materials of the floor


The results 5RPHC 2022 indicate that the main material of the floor of the housing units is earth (60.4%) followed by cement (31.2%) countrywide. In the Northern Province, the earth is the main material of the floor of the housing units (75.1%) followed by cement (21.7%). In Musanze district, the main material of the floor of the housing units is earth (64.9.1%) followed by cement (30.0%) and ceramic/clay/granite tiles (2.6%). At sector level, the cement as main material used for the floor is most found in Muhoza sector (63.2%). The highest percentage of the housing units with earth as main material used for the floor is found in Rwaza (89.4%), Shingiro (89.1%) Gashaki (89.0%), and Remera (88.8%) and the high percentage of housing units whose floor in ceramic/clay/granite tiles is found in Muhoza (9.0%) and Cyuve sectors (6.0%). The results of census indicate the main materials used for floor of the housing units in Musanze district are mostly earth, cement, and ceramic/clay/granite tiles. In urban areas, the predominant materials are cement (50.2%) followed by earth (42.3%) and ceramic/clay/granite tiles (5.3%). In rural areas, the predominant materials are earth (86.5%) and cement (10.6%). The Figure 4. 5 below provides details:

4.3 Source of energy of the private households

4.3.1 Grid line connectivity in Musanze district

At national level, the results of the 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that 52.5% of private households are connected to the national grid while 47.2% are not connected. In Northern Province, the percentage of private household connected to the national grid line is 44.5% while it is 60.2% in Musanze district. At the sector level, over 70% of private households are connected to the national grid line in 3 sectors out of 15. Muhoza (87.7%) has the higher percentage. Sectors with lower percentages of private households connected to the national grid line are Shingiro (26.1% and Gtaraga (37.1%). The table below displays details:





Regarding the areas of residence in Musanze district, the percentage of private households connected to the national grid line is 76.8% in urban areas while it is 44.2% in rural areas as shown in the figure below:

4.3.2 Main source of energy for lighting in Musanze district

In Musanze district, the main source of energy for lighting used by households is electricity (62.9%). At the sector level, the percentage of households using electricity for lighting is high in Muhoza(88.0%), Gashaki (74.4%), Remera (72.7%), and Busogo sectors (72.3%). The sectors with the high percentages of private households using flashlight/phone flashlight for lighting are Shingiro (53.7%), and Gataraga (44.7%). Table4.9 below provides details:



The sources of energy for lighting in Musanze district are mainly electricity, candles, and flashlight/phone flashlight. However, the percentages of households using them vary by area of residence. In urban areas, the main source of energy for lighting is electricity (77.8%), followed by flashlight/phone flashlight (14.0%) and candles (5.2%). In rural areas, 48.6% of private households use electricity as main source of energy for lighting while 37.8% use flashlight, 7.2% use firewoods, and 4.1% use candles. 4.3.3 Main sources of energy for cooking in Musanze district

At the Musanze district level, the main sources of energy for cooking used by the private households are firewood (73.9%) followed by charcoal (21.0%) and gas (4.0%). At the sector level, firewood is the most used source of cooking energy by private households in Remera (98.2%) and Gashaki (98.0%). The sector with the high percentage of private households using charcoal as main source of cooking energy is Muhoza (55.1%). Sectors with the highest percentages of private households using gas as main source of cooking energy are Muhoza (16.4%), and Cyuve (7.0%). The Table 4. 10 below illustrates details:



The main sources of energy for cooking used by private households in Musanze district vary by area of residence. In Rural areas, private households use mostly firewood (96.1%) and charcoal (2.7%). 4.3.4Water and sanitation of the private households in Musanze district

4.3.4.1 Main source of drinking water

The results of 5RPHC 2022 reveal that improved water sources is the most water sources in Rwanda that represent (82.3%). In Musanze district, 93.7% of private households use improved water sources. At the sector level, the percentage of the private households using water from improved sources is highest in Cyuve (99.5%), and the lowest in Gataraga (72.5%). The





In Musanze district, both urban and rural areas, private households use mainly improved sources of water (93.7% in urban and 88.0% in rural). 4.3.4.2 Main type of toilet facility


The results of census reveal that the main types of toilet facility used by the private households in Rwanda are not shared Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab (68.8%), in Musanze district main types of toilet facility used by the private households are Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household (62.5%), pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by several households (18.5) and not shared Pit Latrine without constructed floor slab (11.6%). At the sector level, the percentage of households using private or pit latrines with constructed floor slab used by one household is high in Remera (91%), Gashaki and Rwaza sectors (84.4% each). The high percentage of households using pit latrines with constructed floor slab used by several households is in Muhoza sector (34%), the lowest percentages are found in Remera (4.9%), and Gashaki (6.0%). Flush toilets are mainly used by one household and the high percentage of households using this type is found in Muhoza (12.4%). The Table 4. 12 below indicates the types of toilets facilities.

The type of toilet facility used by the private households varies according to the area of residence in Musanze district. In urban areas, the types of toilets most used are pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household (54.2%) and pit latrines with constructed floor slab used by several households (26.9%). In rural areas, the main types of toilets used are pit latrines with constructed floor slab used by one household (70.3%), pit latrine without constructed floor slab used by one households (15.2%), and pit latrines with constructed floor slab used by several households (10.4%). 4.3.4.3 Mode of waste disposal in Musanze district

The results of the census reveal that, In Musanze district, the high percentage of households (49.3%) evacuate their waste through the Household compost dumping while 33.6% of private households evacuate their waste in the household's fields or bushes and 9.3% in the Waste collection companies. At the Sector level, the high percentages of households evacuating their waste through the Household compost dumping are in Remera (70.6%), Kinigi (67.5%), Busogo (62.7%) and Nyange sectors (60.0%). The household's fields or bushes as main mode of waste disposal is the most used in Kimonyi (58.7%). The



The results of the census indicate the main modes of waste disposal used by the households. modes of waste disposal used vary by area of residence, in urban areas, domestic waste is mainly collected and evacuated through household compost dumping (44.5%). Other private households evacuate their domestic waste in the household's fields or in the bushes (28.0%) or in the Waste collection companies (18.8). In rural areas, the households evacuate their waste mainly by compost dumping (53.9%) and others in their fields or in the bushes (39.0%). The Figure 4. 12 below illustrates details:

4.4 Assets possessed by private households

4.4.1 Communication assets possessed by private households in Musanze district

At the district level, 84.7% of private households possess a radio, 81.6% a mobile phone, 24.1% a smartphone, 13.4% a TV and 5.1% a computer. The percentage of private households possessing a radio is high in Muhoza (93.5%), and it is low in Shingiro (75.1%). The percentage of private households possessing a television is high in Muhoza (34.6%) and Cyuve (23.5%) while it is low in Rwaza, Remera, and Shingiro sectors (about 3% each). Mobile phone is mostly possessed by private households of Muhoza sector (91.1%). The sectors with high percentage of households with smartphone is Muhoza (53.1%), while the percentage of households possessing this asset is low in Rwaza and Shingiro sectors (8% each). The computer is mostly possessed in Muhoza (15.9%). The Table 4. 14 below provides details:

4.4.2 Access to the Internet in Musanze district


The results of the 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that the percentages of households with at least one member using internet are 22.2% at national level while they are 16.7% in Northern Province and 25.0% in Musanze district. At sector level, the high percentage of households with at least one member using internet is high in Muhoza (53.9%). The sectors with the lower percentages of households with at least one member using internet are Shingiro (8.9%) and Rwaza (10.1%).

The results of the census show that access to the Internet varies greatly in accordance with the area of residence in Musanze district. CHAPTER 5: AGRICULTURE IN MUSANZE DISTRICT

The agriculture was the one of the areas of investigation of the 5th Rwanda Population and housing census conducted in 2022. The households engaged in Livestock husbandry; the number of private crop farming households cultivating different types of crops, by Sector, the number of private households raising different types of livestock, by Sector and type of household raised in district were captured in the census.

5.1 The households engaged in crop farming and livestock husbandly

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that Nationally, 2,280,854 of private households (68.9%) are engaged in agriculture, among them 62.6% are engaged in crop farming and 50.4% are engaged in Livestock husbandry. In Musanze district, Agricultural households occupy 66.3%, with 59.4% of households engaged in crop farming and 44.4% Households engaged in Livestock husbandry. Musanze district has sectors located in rural areas where the agriculture activities are applied, Gashaki, Rwaza, and Remera sectors have a high proportion of Households engaged in agriculture activities (93.6%, 91.2% and 91% respectively). Gashaki sector has a high percentage of Households engaged in crop farming (90.9%) and Households engaged in Livestock husbandry (82.4%). The Table 5. 1 below provides details:
