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FOREWORD

The Government of Rwanda, through the National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) conducted the 2022 Rwanda Population and Housing Census to provide updated demographic, social and economic indicators for policy formulation and planning to support the national development agenda and track the implementation of national, regional, continental and global development goals, such as the First National Strategy for Transformation (NST1 2017-2024); the AU Agenda 2063; and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The Population and Housing Census in Rwanda dates back to the year 1978 when the first ever modern census was implemented. The second, third, and fourth censuses were carried out in 1991, 2002, and 2012 respectively. The 2022 Population and Housing Census marks therefore the Fifth in the series following the United Nations Recommendations to conduct a census every ten years.

Considering census' crucial importance for the planning process, the Government of Rwanda has made the Population and Housing Census a priority to be undertaken every 10 years and adopted the use of technologies for timely delivery of census results for use.

Results of the 2022 Population and Housing Census provide population numbers from national to the lowest administrative level, as well as demographic and socio-economic indicators at both national and district levels. The census remains the only national data collection exercise that can provide the lowest levels of disaggregation to support decentralised decision making across the country.

I would like therefore to take this opportunity to thank all stakeholders that contributed to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. They include Ministries and other Government institutions, international organizations such as the World Bank (WB), the European Union (EU), the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), One-UN, UN Women, UNICEF, UNECA, the United Kingdom AID (UKAID), the African Development Bank (AfDB), the USAID, Enabel, PARIS 21 and others for their support in diverse ways.

My special thanks go to the local government leaders from the province to the village levels who contributed a lot to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. Exceptional gratitude to all enumerators, teachers and young people who collected the information and all respondents for their cooperation and dedication. The National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) deserves special appreciation for the excellent operational and coordination of all census activities.




Figure 1.1 Administrative map of Ngororero district

CHAPTER 1: POPULATION SIZE, SPATIAL DISTRIBUTION, AND STRUCTURE

1.1 Size and spatial Distribution of the population

1.1.1 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Western Province

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 2,896,484 residents in the Western Province, which represents 21.8% of the total population of Rwanda (13,246,394 residents). The population of the Western Province is predominantly female; 1,511,849 are women corresponding to 52.2 % of the total population of the western province. As revealed by PHC5 in 2022, Ngororero district has 367,955 residents. Its population represents 12.7% of the total residents' population of Western Province. The least populated district in the Western Province is Nyabihu with 319,047 inhabitants, corresponding to 11 % of the total resident population of Western Province (Table 1. 1).



1.1.2 Distribution of Population Density of the Western Province by District


Population density is a measurement of population per unit land area. Density is the number of the inhabitant per Km². The Rwanda Population and Housing Census conducted in 2022 revealed that, the population density in Rwanda is 503 inhabitants per Km². The Western Province has 693 inhabitants per Km². The district with a high population density is Rubavu with 1614 Inhabitants per km². The district with a lowest population density is Karongi with 482 Inhabitants per km². The Figure 1.2 below indicates distribution of population density per district.



1.1.3 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of the Ngororero district

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 367,955 residents in Ngororero district, which represent 12.7% of the total population of the Western Province (2,896,484 residents). The population of Ngororero district is predominantly female: 196,890 are women corresponding to 53.5 % of its the total population of Ngororero district.

The Table 1. 2 below indicates the number of the population of Ngororero district by sector, by sex and their shares across sectors to the total population of Ngororero district. Females are predominant in all sectors of the Ngororero district, the most populated sectors are Ngororero (38,823 population), Kabaya (36,324 population), Kavumu (32,791 population), Sovu (31,966 population), and Muhanda (31,869 population). The less populated sector is Bwira (20,012 inhabitants).

1.1.4 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Ngororero district by residence area

The results of Rwanda Population and housing census 2022 revealed that, the total population of Rwanda are spatially distributed in rural area that represent 72.1% and urban area represent 27.9%. The Western Province is predominantly by the rural area (77.9%) and urban area (22.1%). Ngororero district population is predominantly in rural areas 95.1% while urban area represents 4.9%. The almost all sectors of Ngororero district are entirely rural except Kabaya and Ngororero which have both urban and rural areas. The Table 1. 3 below illustrates the results.

1.1.5 Age-Sex Structure of the Population of Ngororero district

Ngororero population is mostly young. 59.07% of the resident population of Ngororero is under 25 years, as shown by the age pyramid (Figure 4), reflecting the high level of fertility in the recent past. The elderly (60 years and above) represents 7.22 % of the total population of the district. The Table 1. 4 below illustrates the results, and more details of sectors are in the annex.




Figure 1. 2 Age pyramid of the resident population of Ngororero district in 2022

1.1.6 population share of some specific interventions target groups in Ngororero District by sex

The Rwanda population and housing census 2022 indicate that the population on specific ages-based programs, policy and strategies interventions in health, education, employment and also indicates the population categories in their respective characteristics such as children, youth, working population, among other things. For instance, children under five years for immunization programs (Under 5 years children), children in school age (3-17 years), people in the official working age group (16 years and above), etc. Knowing the size of such groups is of great importance for the design, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of programs targeting such groups. The Table 1. 5 gives the size of the main interventions target groups by sex, and their share in the entire population of Ngororero district. The population aged 0-17 represents 46.9 % of the total population of the district, 16-30 years represent 25.2%; the working age population 16 years and above represents 58.1 % of the same population. The Table 1. 5 below shows distribution of Ngororero districts by targeted interventions by their age.

CHAPTER 2: CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION

2.1 Socio-cultural characteristics of the population

2.1.1 Nationality of the population of Ngororero district

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that, the Rwandan population by nationality represent 99.1% and foreigners represent 0.9%. In the Western Province, foreigners represent 0.5% and Ngororero districts, the Rwandan by nationality represent 99.98% and foreigners represent 0.02% (72). three sectors of Ngororero districts that have the highest percentage of foreigners compared to others; those are Kabaya (14 foreigners), Gatumba, and Muhanda (11 foreigners each). The Table 2. 1 below illustrates the distribution of the population by nationality with their respective sectors of residence.

2.1.2 Religious affiliation of the resident population of Ngororero District

In Ngororero district, Christianity is the predominant religion in Ngororero district. 45.0% are catholic, 23.5% are ADEPR, 11.0% are protestant, 10.0% are Adventists, Jehovah witness are 1.0%, and 0.7% are Muslim. 3.7% of the resident population declared themselves to be without religion. 2.2 Marital Status of the resident population of Ngororero district

2.2.1 Marital Status by sector

The results of 5RPHC-2022, 51.1% of the resident population of Ngororero district aged 12 and above were living in union (married officially to one wife/husband, married not officially to one wife/husband, live in polygamous union) at the time of the census, while 41.7% were never married. 5.7% were widowed, while separated and divorced were respectively 1.4% and 0.2%. At the sector level, only two sectors (Nyange and Kabaya sectors) have the lowest percentages (under 50% each) of the currently married people. Kabaya sector (44.7%) has the highest percentages of the never married persons. Nyange, Muhororo, Gatumba, Hindiro and Ndaro sectors have highest percentages of widowed persons (from 6 to 6.3%). Details of the resident population of Ngororero district aged 12 years and above by marital status and sex is presented in the annex.

2.2.2 Marital status by Age groups

The percentages of resident population of Ngororero district by marital status vary by sex and age: The percentage of never married persons decreases from 99.9% (age group of 12-14 years) to 0.9% (age group of 80 years and above). The percentage of persons currently living in union starts by increasing from 0.1% (age group of 12-14 years) to a maximum of 88.3% (age group of 40-44 years) before decreasing to 45.3% (age group 85+) due mainly to widowhood (53.0%). The highest percentage of the separated persons (2.7%) is found in age group 30-34 years. For more details see Table 2. 4.

2.3 Educational Characteristics of the Population of Ngororero district

2.3.1 School attendance

Table 2. 5 indicates that in Ngororero District, 75.3% of pre-primary-age population (3-5 years) are currently attending school, 24.7% of children have never attended and 0% of children have previously attended (i.e children who have already had prior exposure to nursery school education before the time of

census but who were not attending nursery school/droped-out during census time). Nyange and Ngororero Sectors have the highest proportion of children (age between 3 to 5) currently attending school in Ngororero District (84.8% and 84.7 respectively). Muhanda sector has the lowest percentage of children currently attending school, with only 44.2% enrolled. On the other hand, Muhanda sector has the highest proportion of children aged 3 to 5 who have never attended school (55.8%).

Table 2.6 shows that in Ngororero District 91.6% of children age 6 to 11 years (the official primary schoolgoing age) are currently attending school, 6.8% have never attended school and only 1.6% have previously attended school (which means that 8.4 of children aged 6 to 11 are out of school).

By comparing the distribution of the primary school-age population (6-11 years) across sectors in Ngororero District, comparisons reveal the disparities in primary school attendance across different sectors within Ngororero District. Sector like Muhanda exhibits lower rate of children currently attending school (75.4%) and higher rates of children who have never attended (21.5%,). On the other hand, sector like Ngororero demonstrates higher rate of children currently attending school (97.3%) and lower rate of children who have never attended (2.4%).

In Ngororero District, 27.9% of the population aged 12 to 17 have previously attended school (i.e. they dropped out of school), 67.9% are currently attending school, and 4.2% have never attended secondary school.

The distribution of the secondary school-age population (12-17 years) across sectors in Ngororero District, shows that Ngororero sector has the highest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school at 76.3%. Conversely, Muhanda sector has the lowest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school with 56.3%, and also has the highest percentage of the population between the ages of 12 and 17 who have never attended school at 13.3%.

2.3.2 Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in in Primary School in Ngororero district

Gross and Net Attendance Ratios are used to measure the extent of coverage of an educational program. It gives a comparison of the children attending school with the total size of the school-age population. It can also be used for assessing how far a country has succeeded in bringing to school all those who are eligible to attend.

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 reveal that not all children attending primary school level are of the official age for that level (6-11 years). The gross attendance rate in Rwanda is 141.7, Western Province GAR is 139.8 and 142.5 in Ngororero districts. The Net Attendance Rate (NAR) in Primary school for Ngororero district (91.6%) is higher than NAR of the Western Province (87.8%) and NAR of Ngororero I below the NAR of national level (89.3%).

A Gross Attendance Rate (GAR) of 142.5% in Ngororero District for the population 6 to 11 years indicates a high percentage of those who attended primary schools aged below 6 years and or above 11 years. On the other hand, the NAR of 91.6% for the population 6 to 11 years indicates that only 91.6% of the population 6 to 11 years were attending primary schools in Ngororero District by 2022 (Table 2.8). In 2022, students older or younger than the official primary school age range made up 35.7% [(GAR142.5-NAR91.6)/GAR142.5] of the primary school population of Ngororero District.

With a NAR of 97.2%, the Ngororero Sector has the greatest percentage of pupils that are attending primary school and are of primary school-age. In comparison to other sectors, the Muhanda sector has the lowest NAR at 75.4%, indicating a lesser percentage of pupils who are attending primary school within the eligible age range. 10 out of 13 sectors have gender parity indexes greater than 1.00, suggesting better access to education for female students compared to male students.

2.3.3 Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Secondary School

The provides information on the gross and net attendance rates in the secondary school level (12-17 years) in Ngororero District, disaggregated by sex and sector. The Western Province and Ngororero District both have lesser NARs than the national average (20.6% and 17.4%, respectively, versus 22.3%) when compared to the national average. Comparing males and females in Ngororero District in terms of Net Attendance Rates (NAR), the table 2. 9 indicates that a higher proportion of females 21.2%) in Ngororero District, within the secondary school-age range (12-17 years), are attending school compared to males (13.6%). Female students older or younger than the official secondary school age range made up 35.7 % [(GAR33.0–NAR21.2)/GAR33.0] of the female with secondary school age of Ngororero District, while for male students it made up 43.1 % [(GAR23.9–NAR13.6)/GAR23.9].This shows that females have a higher attendance rate in Ngororero District compared to males when considering the overall attendance rates, regardless of age or grade-level eligibility.

Among the sectors in Ngororero District, Kabaya has the highest GAR for both sexes, with a rate of 43.1%. Sectors such as Ndaro, Muhanda, Sovu, and Bwira have relatively lower GAR compared to others (16.17%, 17.68%,19.4%, and 19.87% respectively). Ngororero, Kabaya and Nyage sectors have the highest NAR for both sexes in Ngororero District, with a rate of 24.7%, 24.4%, and 24.0%, respectively. Sectors like Muhanda, Ndaro, and Sovu have relatively lower (less than 12%) NAR compared to others (9.4%, 9.9% and 10.4% respectively).

2.3.4 Highest level of school attended in Ngororero district

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate the total population of Rwanda aged 3 and above is 11,999,691. The highest level of education attended is categorized into several levels: Never attended School, Nursery, Primary, INGOBOKA/Vocational, Lower secondary, Upper secondary, University, and Not stated. In Rwanda, 16.7% of the population aged 3 years and above has never attended school, while 2.7% have attended nursery, and 59.5% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.8% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.6% for lower secondary, and 7.1% for upper secondary, 3.6% for university.

The total population of the Western Province aged 3 and above is 2,613,461. The distribution of the highest level of education attended is like the national level, with slight variations. In the Western Province, 19.4% of the population has never attended school, while 2.2% have attended nursery, and 60.7% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.6% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 8.7% for lower secondary, 6.2% for upper secondary, and 2.2% for university.

The total population of Ngororero District aged 3 and above is 326,874. In Ngororero District, 18.8% of the population has never attended school, while 2.4% have attended nursery, and 65.6% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.6% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 7.1% for lower secondary, 4.1% for upper secondary, and 1.3% for university. The distribution of the highest level of education attended varies among sectors, with differences in the percentage of individuals at each education level. For example, Muhanda has a higher percentage (33.8%) of individuals who have never attended school compared to other sectors, while Kabaya has a higher percentage (6.6%) of individuals who attended upper secondary school. Each sector has its own unique distribution of educational levels attended by the population. The table2.10 indicates the findings:

2.4 Characteristics of the Employed Population

The official working age in Rwanda is 16 years and above. Aggregate employment generally increases with growing population. Therefore, the ratio of Employment to the working age population (employment to population ratio) is an important indicator of the capacity of the Economy to provide employment to a growing population. A decline in the employment-to population ratio is often regarded as an indicator of economic slowdown and a decline in total employment as an indicator of a more severe economic downturn.

2.4.1 Employment to population ratio by sex, Province, District and area of residence

The results presented in the below table 2.11 shows that the employment to population ratio stood at 45.9 in Rwanda, it is lower among females (40.2 percent) than males (52.4 percent). On the other side, it was observed that the employment to population ratio is higher in urban areas of Rwanda (53.5 percent) than in rural areas (42.7 percent).

It was observed that in Western Province, the employment to population ratio stood at 42.3 percent, it is higher in urban areas (48.2 percent) than in rural areas of Western Province (40.6 percent).

It was also revealed that the employment to population ratio is 34.8 percent among people residing in Ngororero district, it is higher in urban areas of Ngororero (44.2 percent) than in rural areas of Ngororero (34.3 percent).

2.4.2 Employment to population ratio(EPR) among the resident population of Ngororero aged 16 years and above by age group and sex

Figure 2.1 allows the study of intensity of Employment to population ratio and its variation by sex. The figure reveals the following remarks: The employment to population ratio among males as well as females increases from age group 16-19 to 35-44 and starts decreasing from age group 45-49 to 85 years and above as people starts getting very older and retire. It was observed that in district of Ngororero, the highest employment to population ratio among males stands at 52.8% and was observed in age group 30-34. On the other side the highest employment to population among females is 38.2% and was observed in the age group 30-34. The lowest employment to population ratio among males stands at 5.4% and was observed among males in the age group 85+, the lowest employment to population ratio among females is 4.6% and was observed among females in the age group 85+.




Figure 2. 1 Employment to Population Ratio by age group and sex

CHAPTER 3: SUB-POPULATION

3.1 Children Population (0-17 years)

According to the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989), a child is defined as every human being under 18 unless, under the law applicable to the child, majority is attained earlier. It is relevant to underline here that this definition by age coincides with that of Rwanda, as stipulated in Article 3 of the National Law n° 54/2011 of 14 December 2011 relating to the rights and the protection of the child, which stipulates that a child is any person under the age of 18. The age range (0–17) adopted for this report reflects this definition.

3.1.1 Number and share of children in Ngororero district

The results of 5Th RPHC-2022 revealed that, the children population constitute 45% of the total population of 13,246,394. The Western Province has 1,355,679 children with a share of 47% of the total resident population of the Western Province. In Ngororero District, the children constitute 47% of the resident population of the district, with a percentage of females slightly greater than the males' one (86,852 vs 85,715). The children's share is high in Sovu (51.0%), Muhanda and Kavumu sectors (50% each), and small in Kabaya (44%). The Table 3. 1 below indicate distribution of children by sector and by sex.

3.1.2 Children with birth registration in Ngororero District

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate the percentage of children whose birth was registered is 94.3% at the national level. The birth registration rate in Ngororero district is 93.9%. Birth registration performance is higher in urban (97.2%) than in the rural areas (93.7%) of Ngororero district. The table3.2 illustrates the findings:

3.1.3 Birth registration by Sector

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that birth registration varies across sectors and areas of residence (urban and rural), Kabaya and Ngororero sectors are only sectors which have both urban rural, others have only rural area. High percentages of birth registrations are found in Gatumba, Matyazo, and Nyange sectors (around 97% each) while the lowest is in Kavumu (88.5 %) and Muhanda (88.7%). The percentage of birth registration for males is almost the same as the one for females. For more details see Table 3. 3

3.2 Youth population in Rwanda

The United Nations, for statistical purposes, defines 'youth', as those persons between the ages of 15 and 24 years, without prejudice to other definitions by Member States. Considering the current priorities and trends of Rwanda's Development, the definition of Youth in terms of age has been revised in this policy. It was brought from 14–35 years to 16–30 years.

3.2.1 The youth population in Ngororero district

The results of 5th Population and housing Censuses conducted in 2022 revealed that, the youth represent 27.1% (3,595,670) of the total population (13,246,394). The youth population in Ngororero district was 92,595 which represents 25.5% of the total resident population of the district (367,955). The sector with the highest youth share is Kabaya (29.4%) while Muhororo (23.0%), Gatumba (23.1%), and Nyange (23.2%) have the lowest share of youth. The Table 3. 4 below indicate distribution of youth by sector, and by sex.

3.2.2 Educational characteristics of youth

Youth who never attended school represent 5.15 % of the youth resident population at national level; it represents 6.6% of the total resident population in Western Province and 7.5% of the total resident population of Ngororero district. The percentage of youth who never attended school varies a lot within sectors of Ngororero district. The highest percentage was registered in Muhanda (21.3%) while the lowest percentages were registered in Gatumba (3.0%), Ngororero (3.4%), Nyange (3.7%), and Muhororo (3.9%). 3.2.3 Highest level of education attended by youth population in Ngororero district

In Ngororero district, among all youths, 61.9% attained only the primary school level, 17.5% attained the lower secondary education, 10.5% attained the upper secondary education, 1.9% attained university, and 7.5% have not attended any formal of school. The highest level of education attained varies across sectors of the district. The sectors with the highest percentage of youth with no schooling are Muhanda (21.3%), Kavumu and Sovu (around 2% each). The percentage of youth with university level is high in Kabaya(3.8%) and Gatumba sectors (3%). The sectors with the highest percentages of youth with primary education are Bwira and Ndaro sectors (72% each). The Table 3. 6 below indicates details:

3.2.4 Employment to population ratio among youth (16-30)

The Census results showed that In Rwanda the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 40.3%, it is higher among males than females 44.8% and 36.2 % respectively. It was observed that in the district of Ngororero, the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 32.3%, it is higher in among males (36.2%) than females (28.8%)

3.2.5 Distribution (%) of the currently employed youth aged 16-30 years by Sector and status in employment

In Ngororero district, the majority of youth aged 16-30 currently employed are employees (66.4%) followed by own account worker without regular employees (25.5%). The highest percentage of youth employees is found in Muhororo (82.8%) while the lowest is in Hindiro and Ndaro sectors (40.6% and 40.7% respectively). The highest percentage of currently employed population who worked as own account worker without regular employees among youth is also found in Hindiro (49.7%) and in Ndaro (43.9%) while the lowest is observed in Sovu (11.3%), in Muhanda (11.7%), and in

3.2.6 Proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training in Western Province by sex, district, and area of residence

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate that, In Rwanda the proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training stood at 39.5 %. It is higher among females (43.8 %) than males (34.9 %). In Western Province, the proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training is 42.6 %, it is lower among males (38.5 %) than females (46.3 %). 2022 census results also revealed that the aforementioned proportion is higher in rural areas of Western Province (44.6 percent) than in urban areas of Western Province (36.1 percent).

The proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training among people residing in Ngororero district stood at 51.9 percent. It is much higher (52.8 percent) among people residing in rural areas of Ngororero district than the ones residing in urban areas of Ngororero district (36.7 percent). The table below indicates results on Proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training in Western Province by Sex, District, and Area of Residence.

3.3 Persons with disabilities

In 2015, 193 countries agreed to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its Sustainable Development Goals with a commitment where possible, "to disaggregate the statistics they generate by disability to provide important insights about the extent to which persons with disabilities (PWDs) are being included in society, benefit from government programmes, or are included in the workforce. At the national level, 3.4% of the resident population aged 5 years and above have a disability. while in Ngororero district the disability prevalence rate is 3.2%. At sector level, the highest prevalence rates of the resident population aged 5 years and above with disability are in Matyazo (5.1%) and while the lowest is in Kageyo and Bwira sectors (1.4% and 1.6% respectively).

3.4 Elderly Population (60 years and above)

Rwanda has enacted laws such as the Law No 088/01 of 07/09/2020 (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2020) on Presidential order ratifying the protocol to the African charter on human and peoples' rights on the rights of older persons in Africa adopted by the twenty sixth ordinary session of the Assembly, held in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, on 31 January 2016 through an Official Gazette No.27 of 07/09/2020 and Law No.59/2008 of 10/09/2008 on prevention and punishment of gender- based violence (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2008), whose Article 32 sets the penalty for violence against an elderly person.

It is over two decades since the United Nations convened the First World Assembly on Ageing (Vienna, 1982) (National Academy of Sciences, National Research Council, 2001)) that launched an international action programme, which was the first international instrument on ageing, to provide a foundation for the formulation of policies and programmes on ageing. This was done to guarantee economic and social security to older persons and other opportunities to contribute to national development.

3.4.1 Elderly Population in Ngororero district by Sector

In 2022, the elderly persons constitute 7.2% of the total resident population of Ngororero district. The share of the elderly females is higher than the male's one (8.3% vs. 6.0%), reflecting the higher life expectancy for women. For more details see Table 3. 12

3.4.2 Employment among elderly people

In Rwanda, people keep on working until old age, the share of employed persons among the elderly population stands at 28.2%. The aforementioned share is higher among the elderly males (33.7%) than elderly females (24.3%).

In Ngororero district, 21.4 % of elderly people were employed. The percentage of employed elderly people is higher among males than females (26.0% vs. 18.5%).

Employment among elderly residents is high in Ndaro sector (34.8%) and Kabaya (31.5%). It is low in Kageyo sector (10.5%) and in Muhororo (11.5%).

3.4.3 Marital status of elderly People

In Ngororero district, more than half of the elderly population (64.3%) were married and 32.6 % were widowed. The rate of celibacy among elderly was 1.6% while divorce and separation rate are 0.3 % and 1.2% respectively. Marital status among the elderly varies slightly by sector of residence. Marriage among elderly people is more important in Matyazo sector (66.3%). widowhood is widespread in Sovu (36.3%) and Muhanda (34.7%) and lowest in Matyazo sector (30.3%). The table3.14 below illustrates distribution of elderly people across sectors.

CHAPTER 4: HOUSEHOLDS AND HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS

4.1 Household characteristics

In this chapter 5th Population and housing census 2022 investigated households and housing characteristics; those include household size, head of household by sex, type of habitat, housing tenure, materials used for construction, sources of energy used for lighting and cooking, water sources, sanitation facilities, asset possessed by household and mode of waste and disposals.

4.1.1 Number of households and size of household members

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate the total of 3,312,743 households in Rwanda, 671,506 in the Western Province and 92,623 in Ngororero district. The average household size in Ngororero district is 4 persons per household. At the Sector level, the highest sizes are found in Sovu, Kabaya, Kavumu, Muhanda, Hindiro, Matyazo, and Kageyo sectors (at least 4.0 persons/household each). In other sectors, the average household size is under 4 persons/household but around. The Table 4. 1 below indicates number of households and size of household members per sector.

4.1.2 Private households' heads by sex of Ngororero district

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that at national level, 28.9% of private households are headed by women. In Ngororero district, private households headed by females are 32.1%. At sector level, the highest percentages of households headed by women are found in Muhanda sector (34.7%) and Nyange sectors (34.1%) while the lowest is found in Muhororo sector (29.9%). 4.2 Housing Characteristics

4.2.1 type of habitat

The results of 5th Population and Housing Census 2022 revealed that in the Western Province the predominant type of habitat is Umudugudu (Planned rural settlement) (70.5%) and Dispersed/ Isolated housing (18.3%). The most common type of habitat in Ngororero district is Umudugudu (Planned rural settlement) (60.4%) followed by dispersed or isolated housing (33.3%). The type of habitat varies across sectors. Umudugudu (Planned rural settlement) is most prevalent in Gatumba, Kabaya, and Ngororero sectors (77.9%, 75.9% and 75.5%, respectively), and low in Sovu sector (35.8%). dispersed or isolated housing is most prevalent in Sovu sector (58.2%) and low in Kabaya and Ngororero sectors (16.6% and 18.4%, respectively). The sectors with the high percentages of Spontaneous/squatter housing are Kageyo (5.7%). The table 4.3 below displays results by sector.



The type of habitat in Ngororero district varies according to the area of residence. In urban areas, the predominant types are umudugudu/Planned rural settlement (70.1%) and dispersed/isolated housing (15.9%). In rural areas it is the same, the predominant type is umudugudu/Planned rural settlement (59.9%) followed by dispersed/isolated housing (34.2%).

4.2.2 Tenure of the housing in Ngororero district

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that the ownership of housing in the Western Province represents 80.5% and tenant represent 13.5%. In Ngororero district, 86.9% of housing units are occupied by their owners, 6.5% are occupied by Free lodging, while 5.9% are occupied by tenants. At the sector level, the highest percentage of owners of households' units is found in Ndaro, Bwira, and Muhororo sectors (91.4%, 91.1%, and 90.9%, respectively), and for other sectors, the percentage is not less than 83%). The percentage of tenants of housing units is high in Ngororero and Gatumba sectors (8.8%, and 8.4% respectively), and low in Matyazo (2.3%). The Table 4. 4 below indicate details:

In Ngororero district, 3 types of tenure of housing units (owners, tenants and free lodging) predominate in urban area as well as in rural area and their percentages vary substantially according to the area of residence. The percentage of owners of housing units is 69.6% in urban areas to 87.8% in rural areas, the percentage of tenants of housing units is 22.7% in urban areas to 5.0% in rural areas. The percentage of free lodging is 6.6% in urban areas to 6.5% in rural areas. The Figure 4.2 below indicate details:




Figure 4. 2 Distribution (%) of the private households of Ngororero district by tenure of the housing and area of residence

4.2.3 Material of the housing units in Ngororero district

4.2.3.1 Main materials of the roof

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets in Rwanda (74.1%), in the Western Province, the Iron sheet represent (59.0%). In Ngororero district, housing units are mainly covered by local tiles (77.4%). Only 22.3% are covered by iron sheets and 0.2% by Industrial tiles. At the sector level, the high percentages of housing units covered by local tiles are found in Ndaro sector (91.3%). The lowest percentages of housing units covered by local tiles are found in Ngororero sector (50.0%). The highest percentages of the housing units covered by iron sheets are found in Ngororero (49.7%), and the lowest percentages of housing units covered by iron sheets are found in Ngaro sectors (7.3% and 8.6%, respectively). 

The results of the census reveal that the materials used for roofing of the households' units in Ngororero district vary slightly according to the area of residence. In Ngororero district, the predominant roofing materials in urban areas are iron sheets (61.6%) and rural areas are local tiles (79.4%). The percentage of housing units covered by iron sheets is 20.2% in rural areas while the local tiles in urban areas, is 38.3%. The figure 4.3 below illustrates details:

4.2.3.2 Main materials of the walls


The results of the census show that the housing units of wall are mostly built with sundried bricks in Rwanda (67%), and 74.2% in the Western Province. In Ngororero district, walls of the housing units are also mostly built with sundried bricks (95.9%), wood/mud (2.2%), and burnt bricks (0.8%). At the sector level, sundried bricks are the mostly used materials in Bwira and Gatumba sectors (98% each). The table below displays details:



The main materials used for walls of the housing units in Ngororero district are mostly sundried bricks, wood with mud and burnt bricks and their percentages vary substantially according to the area of residence. In urban areas, the predominant materials are sundried bricks (95.6%) followed by burnt bricks (3.2%). In rural areas, sundried bricks are predominant materials with 96.0% followed by wood with mud (2.2%). The Figure 4.4 below provides details:

4.2.3.3 Main materials of the floor

The results 5RPHC 2022 indicate that the main material of the floor of the housing units is cement (31.2%) in countrywide. In the Western Province, the earth is the main material of the floor of the housing units (74.6%) followed by cement (22.4%). In Ngororero district, the main material of the floor of the housing units is earth (82.4%) followed by cement (16.7%) and ceramic/clay/granite tiles (0.1%). At sector level, the cement as main material used for the floor is most found in Gatumba sector (33.4%). The highest percentage of the housing units with earth as main material used for the floor is found in Muhanda (90.3%), and the high percentage of housing units whose floor in ceramic/clay/granite tiles is found in Ngororero (0.3%). 

The results of census indicate the main materials used for floor of the housing units in Ngororero district are mostly cement, earth and ceramic/clay/granite tiles. In urban areas, the predominant materials are cement (53.3%) followed by earth (45.4%). In rural areas, the predominant materials are earth (84.3%) and cement (14.8%). 4.3 Source of energy of the private households of Ngororero district

4.3.1 Grid line connectivity in Ngororero district

At national level, the results of the 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that 52.5% of private households are connected to the national grid, while 47.5% are not connected. In Western Province, the percentage of private household connected to the national grid line is 49.0% while it is 51.3% in Ngororero district. At the sector level, over 47% of private households are connected to the national grid line in 3 sectors out of 13. Kabaya (50.9%) has the higher percentage. Sectors with lower percentages of private households connected to the national grid line are Sovu (13.7% and Matyazo (13.8%). The table below displays details:



4.3.2 Main source of energy for lighting in Ngororero district

In Ngororero district, the main source of energy for lighting used by households is electricity (40.4%) followed by flashlight/phone flashlight for lighting (39.0%). At the sector level, the percentage of households using electricity for lighting is high in Gatumba (55.6%), Ngororero (53.3%), Kabaya (53.1%), and Hindiro sectors (52.8%). The sectors with the high percentages of private households using flashlight/phone flashlight for lighting are Ndaro (50.7%). The sector with the lowest percentage of private households using electricity for lighting is Sovu (19.4%). Table 4.9 below provides details:

The sources of energy for lighting in Ngororero district are mainly electricity, firewood, and flashlight/phone flashlight. However, the percentages of households using them vary by area of residence. In urban areas, the main source of energy for lighting is electricity (75.5%), followed by flashlight/phone flashlight (13.5%) and firewood (5.1%). In rural areas, 40.3% of private households use flashlight/phone flashlight as main source of energy for lighting while 38.6% use electricity, 16.2% use firewood. The Figure 4.7 provides details:




Figure 4. 6 Distribution (%) of the private households of Ngororero district by main source of energy for lighting and by area of residence

4.3.3 Main sources of energy for cooking in Ngororero district


At the district level, the main sources of energy for cooking used by the private households are firewood (94.9%) followed by charcoal (4.0%) and gas (0.3%). At the sector level, firewood is the most used source of cooking energy by private households in all sectors of Ngororero district (above 90% each, except Ngororero sector with 87.9%). Sector with the high percentage of private households using charcoal as main source of cooking energy is Ngororero (10.2%). 4.3.4.1. Main source of drinking water

The results of 5RPHC 2022 reveal that improved water sources is the most water sources in Rwanda that represent (82.3%). In Ngororero district, 68.6% of private households use improved water sources while those use unimproved water sources is 31.4%. At the sector level, the percentage of the private households

using water from improved sources is high in Gatumba sector (77.4%), and the lowest is in Sovu sector (39.5%). The Table 4. 11 below provides details:






Figure 4. 8 Percentage of the private households of Ngororero District by main source of water and by Sector


The results of census reveal that the main types of toilet facility used by the private households in Rwanda are not shared Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab (68.8%), in Ngororero district main types of toilet facility used by the private households are not shared Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab (79.0%), shared pit latrine with constructed floor slab (12.1) and not shared Pit Latrine without constructed floor slab (6.5%). At the sector level, the percentage of households using private or not shared pit latrines with constructed floor slab is high in Bwira (87.2%). The highest percentage of households using shared pit latrines with constructed floor slab is in Muhanda sector (19.7%), the lowest percentages are found in Nyange (7.0%). Flush toilets are mainly not shared and the high percentage of households using this type is found in Hindiro (0.6%).The Table 4. 12 below indicates the types of toilets facilities.



The results of the census reveal that, In Ngororero district, the high percentage of households (51.2%) evacuate their waste through the household's fields or bushes while 45.0% of private households evacuate their waste in the Household compost dumping. At the Sector level, the highest percentages of households evacuating their waste through the Household compost dumping are in Bwira (70.8%). The household's fields or bushes as main mode of waste disposal is the most used in Hindiro (61.6%). The Table 4. 13 below indicates details:

The results of the census indicate the main modes of waste disposal used by the households. modes of waste disposal used vary by area of residence, in urban areas, domestic waste is mainly evacuated in the household compost dumping (45.8%). Other private households evacuate their domestic waste in the household's fields or in the bushes (39.1%) or in the public compost dumping (9.7). 


Figure 4. 11 Distribution (%) of the private households of Ngororero district by mode of waste disposal and by area of residence

4.4 Assets possessed by private households

4.4.1 Communication assets possessed by private households in Ngororero district

At the district level, 74.9% of private households possess a radio, 58.7% a mobile phone, 5.8% a smartphone, 3.1% a TV and 0.8% a computer. The percentage of private households possessing a radio is high in Kageyo sector (86%), and it is low in Sovu sector (61%). The percentage of private households possessing a television is high in Gatumba (6.6%) while it is low in Kavumu, and Muhanda, sectors (1% each). Mobile phones are mostly possessed by private households of Kageyo, and Bwira sectors (79% and 70%, respectively). The sectors with high percentage of households with smartphone are Kabaya and Ngororero (about 10% each), while the percentage of households possessing this asset is low in Kavumu and Muhanda sectors (3% each). The computer is mostly possessed by Kabaya and Ngororero sectors (1.6%). The Table 4. 14 below provides details:

4.4.2 Access to the Internet in Ngororero district


The results of the 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that the percentages of households with at least one member using internet are 22.2% at national level while they are 16.6% in Western Province and 9.6% in Ngororero district. At sector level, the high percentage of households with at least one member using internet is high in Ngororero (15.9%), and Kabaya (14.8%). The sectors with the lower percentages of households with at least one member using internet are Muhanda (5.2%) and Sovu (5.3%).



The results of the census show that the access to the Internet varies greatly in accordance with the area of residence in Ngororero district. In urban areas, 35.7% of private households have at least one member accessing the Internet. In rural areas, private households whose at least member accessing the Internet are only 8.2%. CHAPTER 5: AGRICULTURE IN NGORORERO DISTRICT

The agriculture was the one of the areas of investigation of the 5th Rwanda Population and housing census conducted in 2022. The households engaged in Livestock husbandry; the number of private crop farming households cultivating different types of crops, by Sector, the number of private households raising different types of livestock, by Sector and type of household raised in district were captured in the census.

5.1 The households engaged in crop farming and livestock husbandly

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that Nationally, 2,280,854 of private households (68.9%) are engaged in agriculture, among them 62.6% are engaged in crop farming and 50.4% are engaged in Livestock husbandry. In Ngororero district, Agricultural households occupy 89.5%, with 82.9% of households engaged in crop farming and 73.9% Households engaged in Livestock husbandry. All sectors of Ngororero district apply agriculture activities and have a high proportion of Households engaged in agriculture activities (above 80%). Bwira, Muhororo and Ndaro sectors have the high percentages of Households engaged in crop farming (around 91% each) and Ndaro, Nyange, Kageyo, and Bwira sectors have a high proportion of hhouseholds engaged in Livestock husbandry (above 81% each). The results of 5th Population and housing census 2022 indicate that the most cultivated crops by the private households of Ngororero district are maize, sorghum, wheat, beans, soybean, cassava, sweet potato, Irish potato, Yams &Taro, banana, vegetables, and fruits.
