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


Figure 1: Administrative map of Ngoma district

- The 4th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC) has enumerated **2,595,703** residents in Eastern Province, which represents 24.7% of the total population of the Rwanda (10,515,973 residents).
- The population of Eastern Province is predominantly female: **1,337,613** are women corresponding to 51.5% of the total population of the province.
- Nyagatare and Gatsibo are the most populated districts with more than 430 thousands residents each. Their populations represent, respectively, 17.9%, and 16.7% of the total resident population of Eastern Province.
- The less populated district is Rwamagana with about 313.5 thousand inhabitants, corresponding to 12.1% of the total resident population of Eastern Province.
- Two districts with a high population density (Inhabitants /km²) are Rwamagana, (461 inhabitants /km²) and Ngoma (388 inhabitants /km²).
- The district with a low population density (Inhabitants /km²) is Kayonza (178 inhabitants by /km²).





Figure 2: Population Density (Inhabitants / km²) by district in Eastern Province

- The 4th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC) has enumerated **336,928** residents in Ngoma district.
- Females are predominant in almost all sectors of the district except in Kibungo (47.7%).
- Rukumberi, Rurenge and Kibungo, are the mostly populated sectors with more than 28 thousands residents for each. Their populations represent, respectively, 8.5% each for two first and 8.4% of the total resident population in Ngoma district.
- The less populated sectors are Karembo and Gashanda with 14,902 and 16,309 inhabitants respectively, corresponding to 4.4% and 4.8% of the total resident population in Ngoma district.
- Sectors with a high population density (Inhabitants /km²) are Kibungo (653 inhabitants / km²) and Remera (548 inhabitants /km²).
- Sectors with a low population density (Inhabitants /km²) are Jarama (261 inhabitants /km²) and Mutenderi (277 inhabitants /km²).

- Ngoma district population is predominantly rural: 95.5 % of the resident populations (321,692 inhabitants) reside in rural areas vs. 4.5 % in urban.
- Almost all sectors are rural, except Kibungo with 11,537 inhabitants in urban representing 40.7% of its inhabitants, Rukira with 2,322 inhabitants which represents 9.2% of its residents and Murama with 1,377 inhabitants represents 6.1% of its residents.

• Ngoma population is mostly young. 61.4% of resident population of Ngoma is under 25 years old, as shown by the age pyramid (Figure 2), reflecting the high level of fertility in the recent past.

• The elderly (60 years and above) represents 5% of the total population of the district. The distribution of resident population by age and by sector is in the annex.




Figure 4: Age pyramid of the resident population of Ngoma district in 2012

- Some age groups are targets of specific interventions. For instance children under five year for immunization programs, children in primary school age (7-12 years), people in the official working age group (16-64 years), etc.
- Knowing the size of such groups is of great importance for the design, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of programs targeting such groups. The above table gives the size of the main interventions target groups by sex, and their share in the entire population of Ngoma district.
- The population aged 0-17 represents 48 % of the total population of the district. The economically active population aged 16 -64 years represents more than the half of entire population (52.2%) of the district.

Marital status of the resident population of Ngoma district varies by sex and age:

- The percentage of the never married persons decreases quickly from 99.4% (age group of 12-14 years) to 4.3% (age group of 85 years and above) at the time of the census.
 - The percentage of persons currently married increases from 0.6% (aged 12-14 years) to a maximum of 83% (aged 35-39 years) before decreasing down to 38.2% (aged 85 and above), due to the widowhood.
 - Divorced persons represent 2.0 %, while the percentage of the separated persons is just 0.6% among all age groups in the district.

- Correspondingly, school attendance varies across the sectors:
 - For preschool-age, it considerably varies from 14.7% (Sake) to (36.4%) in Kibungo;
 - > For primary school-age, it varies from 82.1% (Sake) to 94.7% (Karembo)
 - For secondary school-age, it varies from 65.3% (Rukumberi) to 80.2% (Murama).

Table 11 suggests that not all children attending primary school level are of the official age for that level (7-12 years).

- The gross attendance rates are greater than 100% in all sectors of Ngoma district, with variations. The net attendance rate (NAR) in primary school for Ngoma district is (87.8%) above the NAR at Eastern province (86.3%) and below at the national level (88.2%).
- The net attendance rate in primary school is between 80% and 92% at the district level. The highest net attendance rate is observed in Kibungo sector (91.5%) and the low NAR is in Sake sector (80.4%).

Among the population aged 3 years and above in Ngoma district, 27.1% of them have no education, 58.6% attained the primary level, 8.3% attained secondary level, and 1.1% attained university level.

Level of educational attainment varies across sectors. Kibungo sector has the high percentage of residents who attained secondary and university levels (16.7% and 5.2% respectively). The low percentages are observed in Jarama for secondary and university levels (4.9% and 0.3% respectively).



- In Ngoma district, labour force participation is more intense in rural areas (81.5%) than in urban areas (69.7%).
- Labour force participation for female is higher in rural areas (81.6% female vs 81.4% male) while the situation reverses in urban areas(75.1% male vs 64.2% female)

- Some gender disparity is remarkable in labour force participation, from 25-29 age group to above; males contribute more than females to labour force.










Figure 9: Distribution (%) of the private households of Ngoma district by main material of the roof and of the housing unit and by area of residence







In Ngoma district the main sources of energy for lighting are kerosene lamp (77.4%), electricity (9.8%), candle (2.0%) and firewood (1.0%). However a high percentage of the households use an unspecified source of energy for their lighting (9%).

- At the sector level, the percentage of private households that use kerosene lamp for lighting is high in Gashanda (90.3%) and Murama (90.1%). It is low in Jarama (50.2%). 

Figure 13: Distribution (%) of the private households of Ngoma district by improved and unimproved source of water and by Sector





Figure 14: Distribution (%) of the private households of Ngoma district by main source of water and by area of residence












