





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#### **FOREWORD**

The Government of Rwanda, through the National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) conducted the 2022 Rwanda Population and Housing Census to provide updated demographic, social and economic indicators for policy formulation and planning to support the national development agenda and track the implementation of national, regional, continental and global development goals, such as the First National Strategy for Transformation (NST1 2017-2024); the AU Agenda 2063; and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The Population and Housing Census in Rwanda dates back to the year 1978 when the first ever modern census was implemented. The second, third, and fourth censuses were carried out in 1991, 2002, and 2012 respectively. The 2022 Population and Housing Census marks therefore the Fifth in the series following the United Nations Recommendations to conduct a census every ten years.

Considering census' crucial importance for the planning process, the Government of Rwanda has made the Population and Housing Census a priority to be undertaken every 10 years and adopted the use of technologies for timely delivery of census results for use.

Results of the 2022 Population and Housing Census provide population numbers from national to the lowest administrative level, as well as demographic and socio-economic indicators at both national and district levels. The census remains the only national data collection exercise that can provide the lowest levels of disaggregation to support decentralised decision making across the country.

I would like therefore to take this opportunity to thank all stakeholders that contributed to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. They include Ministries and other Government institutions, international organizations such as the World Bank (WB), the European Union (EU), the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), One-UN, UN Women, UNICEF, UNECA, the United Kingdom AID (UKAID), the African Development Bank (AfDB), the USAID, Enabel, PARIS 21 and others for their support in diverse ways.

My special thanks go to the local government leaders from the province to the village levels who contributed a lot to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. #### CHAPTER 1: POPULATION SIZE, SPATIAL DISTRIBUTION, AND STRUCTURE

#### 1.1 Size and spatial distribution of the population

#### 1.1.1 Size and spatial distribution of the population of the City of Kigali

The 5<sup>th</sup> Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 1,745,555 residents in the City of Kigali, which represents 13.17% of the total population of Rwanda (13,246,394 residents). The population of the City of Kigali is predominantly male: 888,882 residents are men corresponding to 50.9 % of the total population of the City and Nyarugenge is the district with a higher percentage of men (52.3%) while Gasabo has the lowest percentage of men (50.5%).

Nyarugenge is the low populated district with 374,319 residents in 2022. Its population represents 21.4% of the total residents' population of the City of Kigali and the high populated district is Gasabo with 879,505 inhabitants, corresponding to 50.4% of the total resident population of City of Kigali.

#### 1.1.2 Population density of the City of Kigali by district

Population density is a measurement of population per unit land area. Density is the number of the inhabitant per Km<sup>2</sup>. The 5<sup>th</sup> Rwanda Population and Housing Census revealed that the population density in Rwanda is 503 inhabitants per Km<sup>2</sup>. The City of Kigali has 2,401 inhabitants per Km<sup>2</sup>.

The district with a high population density is Kicukiro with 2,944 inhabitants per km<sup>2</sup> and the district with a lowest population density is Gasabo with 2,056 inhabitants per km<sup>2</sup>. The figure below indicates distribution of population density per district.




Figure 1. 3Distribution of population density by sectors of Nyarugenge District

#### 1.1.3 Size and spatial distribution of the population in the Nyarugenge District

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 374,319 residents in Nyarugenge District which represent 21.4% of the total population of City of Kigali (Table 1.1). The population of Nyarugenge District is predominantly male: 195,780 are men corresponding to 52.3% of its total population.

The table 1.2 below indicates the number of the population of Nyarugenge District by sector, by sex (count and percentage) across sectors. The population of Nyarugenge District is predominantly male: 195,780 residents in this district are men corresponding to 52.3% of its total population.

Sectors with high percentages of males are Mageregere (57.0%) and Muhima (54.5%). Females are predominant in Nyakabanda sector only (50.1%).

Kigali, Mageregere, Kimisagara and Nyamirambo are the most populated sectors. They represent respectively 16.4%; 16.0%; 15.1% and 14.8% of the total population of Nyarugenge District.

The two less populated sectors are Nyarugenge (4.5%) and Rwezamenyo (3.9%).

## 1.1.4 Size and spatial distribution of the population in Nyarugenge District by area of residence

The results of the Rwanda Population and Housing Census 2022 revealed that 72.1% of the total population of Rwanda live in rural area and only 27.9% are in urban area contrary to the City of Kigali where 86.9% of the resident population live in urban and 13.1% rural area.

Nyarugenge District population lives predominantly in urban area (84.4%) while resident population in rural represents 15.6%.

The sectors of Nyarugenge District which are entirely urban are Gitega, Kimisagara, Muhima, Nyakabanda, Nyamirambo, Nyarugenge and Rwezamenyo while Kanyinya, Kigali and Mageregere have some areas considered as urban and some others as rural.

The table below illustrates the results.

#### 1.1.5 Age-sex structure of the population of Nyarugenge District

Nyarugenge population is mostly young. About 64.3% (240,598 out of the 374,319 residents' population of Nyarugenge) are under 30 years. This situation reflects the high level of fertility in the recent past.

The elderly (60 years and above) represents 3.34% of the total population of the district and the percentage share of the population aged 0-14 is 31.8%. The table 1.4 and the age pyramid below illustrate the results. More details of sectors are in the annex.




Figure 1. 4 Age pyramid of the resident population of Nyarugenge District in 2022

## 1.1.6 Population share (%) of some specific interventions target groups in Nyarugenge District by sex

The Rwanda Population and Housing Census 2022 indicates the population on specific ages-based programs, policy and strategies interventions in health, education, employment and also indicates the population categories in their respective characteristics such as children, youth, working population, among other things. For instance, children under five years for immunization programs (Under 5 years children), children in school age (3-17 years), people in the official working age group (16 years and above), etc. Knowing the size of such groups is of great importance for the design, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of programs targeting them.

The results of the census indicate that children under five years represent 11.8% of the total population of the district and the population aged 0-17 represents 36.9%. The economically active population aged 16-64 represents 65.0% of the same population.

The table above gives details on the size of the main interventions target groups by sex, age groups and their share in the entire population of Nyarugenge District.

#### **CHAPTER 2: CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION**

#### 2.1 Socio-cultural characteristics of the population

#### 2.1.1 Nationality of the population of Nyarugenge District

The results of the 5<sup>th</sup> RPHC-2022 indicate that the Rwandan population represent 99.11% and foreigners represent 0.89% at national level. In the City of Kigali, foreigners represent 1.18% and, in Nyarugenge District, foreigners represent 0.88% that is to say 3,276 residents foreigners.

Three sectors of Nyarugenge District that have the highest percentage of foreigners compared to others are Nyarugenge (4.32%), Rwezamenyo (2.70%) and Muhima (2.37%).

The table below illustrates the distribution of the population by nationality with their respective sectors of residence.

#### 2.1.2 Religious affiliation of the resident population of Nyarugenge District

In Nyarugenge District, christianity is the predominant religion: 34.86% are catholics, 25.90% are ADEPR, 7.01 % are protestants, 9.19% are adventists and 4.62% are other christians. Globaly, 81.58% of the total population of Nyarugenge District are Christians.

Other religious represented are Muslim (11.31%) and Jehovah witness (1.27%) while 3.84% of the resident population declared themselves to be without religion. The table below displays details.

#### 2.2 Marital Status of the resident population of Nyarugenge District

#### 2.2.1 Marital status by sector

The results of 5RPHC-2022 revealed that 43.3% of the resident population of Nyarugenge District aged 12 and above are living in union (married officially to one wife/husband, married not officially to one wife/husband and live in polygamous union) at the time of the census while 51.9% are never married, 2.6% are widowed, 1.8% separated and 0.5% divorced.

At the sector level, 3 sectors have the highest percentages of the currently married people: Mageregere (51.3%), Kigali (51.2%) and Kanyinya (50.5%) while the highest percentages of the never married persons are found in Muhima (63.4%), Rwezamenyo (63.1%), Nyarugenge (61.8%) and Gitega (60.8%).

The percentages of persons married not officially are high in Kigali Sector (28.5%), Kanyinya (25.7%) and Mageregere (25.5%).

Mageregere (3.1%), Rwezamenyo (2.9%), Nyamirambo (2.8%), Kanyinya and Muhima (2.7% each) are the sectors with high percentage of widowed persons in the district.

#### 2.2.2 Marital status by age groups

The percentages of resident population of Nyarugenge District by marital status vary by age: the percentage of never married persons decreases from 99.8% (age group of 12-14 years) to 4.7% (age group of 80 years and above).

The percentage of persons currently married starts by increasing from 0.2% (age group of 12-14 years) to a maximum of 77.9% (age group of 40-44 and 45-49 years) before decreasing to 41.6% (age group 80+) due mainly to widowhood (52.4%).

Persons married not officially are most represented within the age groups 35-39 years (34.1%), 30-34 years (34.0%) and 40-44 years (30.3%).

The highest percentages of divorced persons are observed within the age groups 45-49 and 50-54 (1.5% each) while the highest percentages of the separated persons is found in the age group 40-44 years (3.9%), the age group 45-49 years (4.0%) and the age group 50-54 years (3.8%).

#### 2.3 Educational Characteristics of the Population of Nyarugenge District

#### 2.3.1 School attendance

Table 2. 5 below shows that, in Nyarugenge district, 50.5% of pre-primary-age population (3-5 years) are currently attending school, 49.5% of those children have never attended and none (0%) of those children have previously attended (i.e children who have already had prior exposure to pre-primary school education before the time of census but who were not attending nursery school/droped-out during census time).

At sector level, Rwezamenyo has the highest percentage of children currently attending preschool (69.6%). It is followed by Nyarugenge (62.8%) and Nyakabanda (62.5%) and the lowest percentage of children currently attending pre-school is found in Kimisagara (41.2%) and Mageregere (43.5%), means that Kimisagara and Mageregere are the sectors having the highest proportions of children aged 3 to 5 who have never attended school (58.8% and 56.5%, respectively).

Table 2.6 shows that in Nyarugenge District, 92.3% of children age 6 to 11 years (the official primary school age) are currently attending school and 6.8% have never attended school while only 1.0% have previously attended school (which means that 7.8% of children aged 6 to 11 are out of school).

By comparing the distribution of the primary school-age population (6-11 years) in Nyarugenge District, the results reveal the disparities in primary school attendance across different sectors within the district.

Rwezamenyo (97.8%), Muhima (95.9%), Nyakabanda (95.5%), Nyarugenge (95.3%) and Gitega (95.1%) demonstrate higher rates of children currently attending school. Lower rates of children who have never attended are found in the same sectors: Rwezamenyo (1.9%), Muhima and Nyarugenge (3.3% each), Nyakabanda and Gitega (3.8% each).

In Nyarugenge District, 18.6% of the population aged 12 to 17 have previously attended school (i.e. they dropped out of school), 75.9% are currently attending school and 1.9% have never attended secondary school.

The distribution of the secondary school-age population (12-17 years) by school attendance status across sectors in Nyarugenge District shows that Rwezamenyo sector has the highest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school at 87.0%. Conversely, Mageregere sector has the lowest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school with 74.4%. The highest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 who have never attended school is found in Kigali sector (2.9%), Kimisagara (2.5%) and Mageregere (2,4%) and the highest percentages of drop out are found in the same sectors: Mageregere (23.2%), Kimisagara (20.8%) and Kigali (20.4%). #### 2.3.2. Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Primary School in Nyarugenge District

Gross and Net Attendance Ratios are used to measure the extent of coverage of an educational program. It gives a comparison of the children attending school with the total size of the school-age population. It can also be used for assessing how far a country has succeeded in bringing to school all those who are eligible to attend.

The results of 5<sup>th</sup> RPHC 2022 reveal that not all children attending primary school level are of the official age for that level (6-11 years). The gross attendance rate is 141.7% in Rwanda, 132.5% in the City of Kigali and 134.9% in Nyarugenge District.

The Net Attendance Rate (NAR) in Primary school for Nyarugenge District (92.2%) is greater than the NAR of the City of Kigali (91.4%) and the NAR at national level (89.3%).

A Gross Attendance Rate (GAR) of 131.8% in Nyarugenge District for the population 6 to 11 years indicates a high percentage of those who attended primary schools aged below 6 years and or above 11 years. On the other hand, the Net Attendance Rate (NAR) indicates that only 92.2% of the population 6 to 11 years were attending primary school in Nyarugenge District by 2022 (Table 2.8). In 2022, students older or younger than the official primary school age range made up 31.7% [(GAR134.9-NAR/92.2)/GAR134.9)] of the primary school population of Nyarugenge District.

With a NAR of 97.8%, Rwezamenyo Sector has the greatest percentage of pupils that are attending primary school and are of primary school-age. In comparison to other sectors, Mageregere Sector has the lowest NAR at 89.3%.

The gender parity index is slightly greater than 1.00 in 6 sectors (Kanyinya, Kigali, Mageregere, Muhima, Nyamirambo and Nyarugenge), suggesting better access to education for female students compared to male students. The table below displays details:

#### 2.3.3 Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Secondary School

The table 2. 9 provides information on the gross and net attendance rates in the secondary school level (12-17 years) disaggregated by sex and sector in Nyarugenge District. The City of Kigali (35.2%) and Nyarugenge District (37.0%) both have higher NARs than the national average (22.3%).

Comparing males and females in Nyarugenge District in terms of Net Attendance Rates (NAR), the results indicate that a higher proportion of females (38.0%), within the secondary schoolage range (12-17 years), are attending school compared to males (35.9%).

Female students older or younger than the official secondary school age range made up 41.4% [(GAR64.8-NAR38.0)/GAR64.8] of the female with secondary school age of Nyarugenge District, while for male students it made up 46.0 % [(GAR66.5-NAR35.9)/GAR66.5]. This shows that females have a higher attendance rate in Nyarugenge District compared to males when considering the overall attendance rates, regardless of age or grade-level eligibility.

Among the sectors in Nyarugenge District, Rwezamenyo and Nyarugenge sectors have the highest GAR for both sexes, with a rate of 107.2% and 96.0% respectivily. Mageregere has the lower GAR (37.4%) compared to other sectors.

Also, Rwezamenyo has the highest NAR for both sexes in Nyarugenge District, with a rate of 56.4% and Mageregere has the lowest (22.2%) compared to other sectors.

#### 2.3.3 Highest level of school attended in Nyarugenge District

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate the total population of Rwanda aged 3 and above is 11,999,691. The highest level of education attended is categorized into several levels: Never attended School, Nursery, Primary, INGOBOKA/Vocational, Lower secondary, Upper secondary, University and Not stated. In Rwanda, 16.7% of the population aged 3 years and above has never attended school while 2.7% have attended nursery, and 59.5% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.8% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.6% for lower secondary, 7.1% for upper secondary, 3.6% for university, and 0.0% is not stated.

The total population of the City of Kigali aged 3 and above is 1,603,405. The distribution of the highest level of education attended is like the national level with slight variations. In the City of Kigali, 9.6% of the population have never attended school, while 3.4% have attended nursery, and 46.8% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 1.1% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 12.8% for lower secondary, 14.2% for upper secondary, 12.0% for university and 0.0% is not stated.

The total population of Nyarugenge District aged 3 and above is 344,878. In Nyarugenge District, 9.5% of the population have never attended school while 2.9% have attended nursery and 47.9% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 1.1% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 14.0% for lower secondary, 15.4% for upper secondary, 9.0% for university and 0.1% is not stated.

The distribution of the highest level of education attended varies among sectors with differences in the percentage of individuals at each education level. For example, Mageregere has a higher percentage (14.6%) of individuals who have never attended school compared to other sectors while Rwezamenyo has a higher percentage (25.4%) of individuals who attended upper secondary school. Each sector has its own unique distribution of educational levels attended by the population.

#### 2.4 Characteristics of the employed population in Nyarugenge District

The official working age in Rwanda is 16 years and above. Aggregate employment generally increases with growing population. Therefore, the ratio of Employment to the working age population (employment to population ratio) is an important indicator of the capacity of the Economy to provide employment to a growing population. A decline in the employment-to population ratio is often regarded as an indicator of economic slowdown and a decline in total employment as an indicator of a more severe economic downturn.

#### 2.4.1 Employment to population ratio by sex, Province, District and area of residence

The results presented in the below table 2.11 shows that the employment to population ratio stood at 45.9% in Rwanda. It is lower among females (40.2%) than males (52.4%). On the other side, it was observed that the employment to population ratio is higher in urban areas of Rwanda (53.5%) than in rural areas (42.7%).

In City of Kigali, the employment to population ratio stood at 55.4% and it is higher in urban areas (56.6%) than in rural areas (46.1%).

It was also revealed that the employment to population ratio is 56.2% among people residing in Nyarugenge District. By area of residence, it is higher in urban (56.7%) than in rural (51.8%) and by sex, it is higher for male than for female in both urban (66.8% to 46.0%) and rural (64.0% to 39.9%).

## 2.4.2 Employment to population ratio(EPR) among the resident population of Nyarugenge aged 16 years and above by age group and sex


In Nyarugenge District, the employment to population ratio among males as well as females increases from age group 16-19 to 40-44 and starts decreasing from age group 45-49 to 85 years and above as people starts getting very older and retire.

It was observed that the highest employment to population ratio among males stands at 81.2% and was observed in age group 35-39. Among females, the highest employment to population ratio is 56.1% and is observed in the age group 40-44.

The lowest employment to population ratio stands at 10.5% among males and 4.3% among females and it is observed in the age group 80-84 as well as among males than females.

#### **CHAPTER 3: SUB-POPULATION**

#### 3.1 Children Population (0-17 years)

According to the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989), a child is defined as every human being under 18 unless, under the law applicable to the child, majority is attained earlier. It is relevant to underline here that this definition by age coincides with that of Rwanda, as stipulated in Article 3 of the National Law  $n^{\circ}$  54/2011 of 14 December 2011 relating to the rights and the protection of the child, which stipulates that a child is any person under the age of 18. The age range (0–17) adopted for this report reflects this definition.

#### 3.1.1 Number and share of children in Nyarugenge District

At the national level, the children population constitute 44.5% of the total population of 13,246,394 residents. The City of Kigali has 661,643 children with a share of 37.9% of the total resident population.

In Nyarugenge District, the children constitute 36.9% of the resident population of the district with a percentage of females slightly greater than the males' one (39.1% to 34.9%).

At sector level, the children's share is high in Kanyinya (44.0%) and Kigali (42.1%) and is small in Muhima (27.1%), Nyarugenge (28.9%) and Rwezamenyo (29.5%).

The table below indicates the details by sector and by sex.

#### 3.1.2 Children with birth registration in Nyarugenge District

The results of the 5<sup>th</sup> RPHC 2022 indicate that the percentage of children whose birth was registered is 94.3% at the national level. The birth registration rate in Nyarugenge District is 92.6%. There is no difference by sex but the birth registration in rural areas is high (95.9%) than in urban (92.0%).

The table below illustrates the findings:

#### 3.1.3 Birth registration by sector

The children's birth registration varies across sectors and areas of residence in Nyarugenge District. In this district, 7 sectors are entirely urbans and only 3 sectors (Kanyinya, Kigali and Mageregere) have both urban and rural areas.

The higher percentages of birth registration are found in Mageregere (94.3%), Muhima and Nyarugenge sectors (93.7% each) while the lowest is in Kigali and Kimisagara (91.0% each).

The variation by sex is not very marked in all sectors.

#### 3.2 Youth population in Rwanda

For statistical purposes, the United Nations defines "youth" as those persons aged 15 years to 24 years, without prejudice to other definitions by Member States. Considering the current priorities and trends of Rwanda's Development, the definition of "Youth" in terms of age has been revised in this policy. It was brought from 14-35 years to 16-30 years.

#### 3.2.1 The youth population in Nyarugenge District

The results of the 5<sup>th</sup> RPHC-2022 reveal that the youth population represent 27.14% (3,595,670) of the total population (13,246,394) at national level. In Nyarugenge District, the youth population is 126,094 which represents 33.7% of the total resident population of the district (374,319).

The sector with the highest youth share is Gitega (39.9%) while Mageregere (27.6%) and Kanyinya (28.1%) have the lowest shares of youth. The table below indicate distribution of youth by sector and by sex.

#### 3.2.2 Educational characteristics of youth

Youth who never attended school represents 5.1% of the youth resident population at national level; it represents 3.1% of its total resident population in City of Kigali and 2.8% of its total youth resident population in Nyarugenge District.

The percentage of youth who never attended school varies a lot within sectors of Nyarugenge District. The highest percentage was registered in Mageregere (4.7%) while the lowest percentages were registered in Nyakabanda (1.2%) and Nyarugenge (1.4%).

#### 3.2.3 Highest level of education attended by youth in Nyarugenge District

In Nyarugenge District, 35.2% of youth attended only the primary school level, 23.5% attained the lower secondary education, 26.3% attained the upper secondary education, 11.3% attained university and 2.8% have never attended school.

The highest level of education attained varies across sectors of the district. The sectors with the highest percentage of youth never attended school are Mageregere (4.7%), Kigali (4.0%) and Kanyinya (3.5%).

The percentage of youth with university level is high in Nyarugenge (22.9%), Rwezamenyo (21.9%) and Muhima (20.4%).

The sectors with the highest percentages of youth with primary education are Mageregere (51.9%), Kanyinya (47.5%) and Kigali (46.2%).

## 3.2.4 Employment to population ratio among youth (16-30) in Nyarugenge District

The Census results shows that the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 40.3% in Rwanda and it is higher among males (44.8%) than females (36.2%). It is observed that in the district of Nyarugenge, the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 48.5%, it is higher in among males (56.3%) than females (41.2%)

The highest employment to population ratio among youth in Nyarugenge District is observed in Muhima (51.5%) and Gitega (51.1%). The lowest employment to population ratio among youth is observed in Nyarugenge (44.1%).

## 3.2.5 Status in employment of youth population in Nyarugenge District

In Nyarugenge District, most of the youth aged 16-30 currently in employement are employees (74.3%) followed by own account worker without regular employees (21.4%).

The highest percentage of youth employees is found in Nyarugenge (85%) while the lowest is in Kimisagara (60.5%). The biggest share of youth as self-employed or own account worker is found in Kimisagara (34.1%) while the lowest is in Nyarugenge (11.7%). The highest share of youth in employment as employer with regular employees is found in Kimisagara (2.3%).

# 3.2.6 Proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training in Kicukiro District by sex, district, and area of residence.

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate that, the proportion of Youth (aged 16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training in Rwanda stood at 39.5 %. It is higher among females (43.8 %) than males (34.9 %).

In City of Kigali, the proportion of youth (aged 16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training is 31.2% and it is lower among males (23.7 %) than females (38.3 %). The results also reveale that the aforementioned proportion is higher in rural areas of City of Kigali (42.2%) than in urban areas (30.1%).

The proportion of youth (aged 16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training among people residing in Nyarugenge District stood at 30.4%. It is much higher among people residing in urban areas (35.7%) than the ones residing in rural areas (29.8%).

The table below (Table 3.9) indicates results on proportion of youth (16-30 years) neither in employment nor in education or training in City of Kigali by Sex, District, and Area of Residence.

## 3.3 Persons with disabilities in Nyarugenge District

In 2015, the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its Sustainable Development Goals was agreed by 193 countries with a commitment, where possible, to disaggregate the statistics they generate by disability. The purpose was to provide important insights about the extent to which persons with disabilities (PWDs) are being included in society, benefit from government programmes, or are included in the workforce.

The results of the 5<sup>th</sup> PHC reveal that at the national level, 3.4% of the resident population aged 5 and above have a disability. In Nyarugenge District, the disability prevalence rate is 2.5%.

At sector level, the highest prevalence rates of the resident population aged 5 and above with disability are in Mageregere (3.2%), Nyamirambo and Nyarugenge (3.0% each). The lowest is in Rwezamenyo (1.4%).

The prevalence of disability varies slightly by type. Disability of seeing has the higher percentage both at national level (1.40%) and in City of Kigali (1.20%) compared to other types of disabilities.

By district, Nyarugenge has the highest prevalence rate of residents with seeing disability (1.20%) and the lowest is in Kicukiro (1.02%).

In Nyarugenge District, seeing disability is followed by walking disability with 0.76% of residents declared having it. The prevalence of the remaining types of disabilities (hearing, communicating, remembering or concentrating, self-care, short stature and albinism) is under 0.40% in the district.

## 3.4 Elderly Population (60 years and above)

Rwanda has enacted laws such as the Law No 088/01 of 07/09/2020 (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2020) on Presidential order ratifying the protocol to the African charter on human and peoples' rights on the rights of older persons in Africa adopted by the twenty sixth ordinary session of the Assembly, held in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, on 31 January 2016 through an Official Gazette No.27 of 07/09/2020 and Law No.59/2008 of 10/09/2008 on prevention and punishment of gender- based violence (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2008), whose Article 32 sets the penalty for violence against an elderly person.

It is over two decades since the United Nations convened the First World Assembly on Ageing (Vienna, 1982) (National Academy of Sciences, National Research Council, 2001)) that launched an international action program, which was the first international instrument on ageing, to provide a foundation for the formulation of policies and programs on ageing. This was done to guarantee economic and social security to older persons and other opportunities to contribute to national development.

## 3.4.1 Elderly population of Nyarugenge District

In 2022, the elderly persons constitute 3.3% of the total resident population of Nyarugenge District. The share of the elderly females (3.8%) is higher than the male's one (3.0%), reflecting the higher life expectancy for women.

By sector, Nyarugenge (5.3%) and Mageregere (4.7%) have the highest share of elderly among their total population while Kimisagara (2.0%) and Kigali (2.8%) have the lowest.

## 3.4.2 Employment among elderly people in Nyarugenge District

In Rwanda, people keep on working until old age, the share of employed persons among the elderly population stands at 28.7%. The aforementioned share is higher among the elderly males (35.0%) than elderly females (24.4%).

In Nyarugenge District, 26.1% of elderly people are employed. The percentage of employed elderly people is higher among males (35.5%) than females (18.2%).

By sector, employment among elderly residents is high in Kanyinya (30.2%), Kimisagara (29.7%), Gitega (29.2%) and Nyakabanda (28.1%). It is low in Mageregere (23.0%) and Rwezamenyo (23.6%).

## 3.4.3 Marital status of elderly people

In Nyarugenge District, 61.3% of the elderly population are married (48.9% married officially to one wife/husband, 11.5% married to one wife/husband not officially and 0.9% living in polygamous union) while 30.5% are widowed. The rate of celibacy among elderly is 5.2% while divorce rate is 0.9% and separation is 2.1%.

Marital status among the elderly varies slightly by sector. Among elderly people, marriage to one wife/husband officially is the status more represented in all sectors and the high percentages of people in this status are in Mageregere (51.5%) and Nyakabanda (51.0%). The percentages of elderly married not officially are high in Kigali (16.0%), Nyarugenge (13.6%) and Mageregere (13.1%). Widowhood is widespread in Nyamirambo (34.4%), Muhima (33.6%) and Nyakabanda (33.4%) and lowest in Nyarugenge (23.2%) and Mageregere (27.0%) sectors. The table below illustrates distribution of elderly people across sectors.

## **CHAPTER 4: HOUSEHOLDS AND HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS**

#### 4.1 Household characteristics

In this chapter, the 5<sup>th</sup> Population and Housing Census 2022 investigated households and housing characteristics; those include household size, head of household by sex, type of habitat, housing tenure, materials used for construction, sources of energy used for lighting and for cooking, water sources used by households, sanitation facilities used by households, asset possessed by households and mode of waste disposal used by households.

# 4.1.1 Number and mean size of the private households

The results of the 5<sup>th</sup> RPHC 2022 indicate a total number of 3,312,743 private households in Rwanda. The number of households counted in City of Kigali is 448,868 and 103,985 in Nyarugenge District.

The average household size in Nyarugenge District is 3.5 persons per household. At the sector level, the highest sizes are found in Mageregere (3.8 persons/household), Kanyinya and Nyamirambo (3.6 persons/household each). The smallest household sizes are found in Muhima (3.1persons/household), Gitega and Nyarugenge (3.2 persons/household each).

## 4.1.2 Private households' heads of Nyarugenge District

The results of the 5<sup>th</sup> RPHC 2022 revealed that nationally 28.9% of private households are headed by women. In Nyarugenge District, private households headed by females are 25.4%. At sector level, the highest percentages of households headed by women are found in Rwezamenyo sector (30.7%) and Muhima (30.6%) while the lowest are found in Kigali sector (21.8%) and Kanyinya (22.9%).

## 4.2 Housing Characteristics

## 4.2.1 Type of habitat

The results of the 5<sup>th</sup> Population and Housing Census 2022 revealed that the predominant types of habitat are "Modern planned urban housing" (42.9%) and "Spontaneous/squatter housing" (40.1%) in the City of Kigali. In Nyarugenge District, the most common type of habitat is "Spontaneous/squatter housing" (52.3%) followed by "Modern planned urban housing" (28.3%) and "Dispersed/isolated housing" (11.3%).

The type of habitat varies across sectors. "Spontaneous/squatter housing" is most prevalent in Gitega (84.5%), Muhima (78.3%), Kimisagara and Rwezamenyo (74.6% each) and low in Mageregere (16.9%) and Kigali (35.0%).

The sectors with the high percentages of "Modern planned urban housing" are Nyarugenge (46.4%) and Nyamirambo (44.6%).

The higher percentages of "Dispersed/isolated housing" units are in Kanyinya (32.0%), Mageregere (29.6%) and Kigali (28.9%).

According to the area of residence, the predominant types of habitat are "Spontaneous/squatter housing" (59.1%) and "Modern planned urban housing" (31.0%) in urban areas.

In rural areas, the predominant type is "Dispersed/isolated housing" (57.2%) followed by "Umudugudu/Planned rural settlement" (23.9%).

# 4.2.2 Tenure of the housing

The results of 5<sup>th</sup> RPHC 2022 indicate that the ownership of housing in the City of Kigali represents 34.1% and tenant represent 61.3%. In Nyarugenge District, 64.4% of housing units are occupied by tenants while 31.0% are occupied by their owners.

At the sector level, the percentage of owners of households' units is high in Mageregere (60.9%) and Kanyinya (45.6%) and it is low in Muhima (14.3%), Gitega (16.4%) and Kimisagara (18.8%).

The percentage of tenants of housing units is high in the same sectors where the percentage of owners is low: Muhima (80.2%), Gitega (80.5%) and Kimihurura (79.3%) and it is low in Mageregere (32.6%) and Kanyinya (48.1%). The table below indicate details:



According to the area of residence, 3 types of tenure of housing units (owners, tenants and free lodging) predominate in urban areas as well as in rural area.

The percentage of owners of housing units is 29.2% in urban areas while it is 77.6% in rural areas and the percentage of tenants of housing units is 66.8% in urban areas and 18.4% in rural areas. The percentage of free lodging is 2.2% in urban areas while it is 5.7% in rural areas.

## 4.2.3 Material of the housing units

#### 4.2.3.1 Main materials of the roof

The results of the 5<sup>th</sup> RPHC 2022 indicate that housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets in Rwanda (74.1%) as well as in the City of Kigali where it represents 98.8%.

In Nyarugenge District, housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets (99.3%). Only 0.3% are covered by local tiles and 0.1% covered by asbestos.

The variation by sector is not very significant. More than 99% of housing units are covered by iron sheets in 7 sectors out of 10 of the Nyarugenge District. The lowest percentage is in Rwezamenyo with 97.7% of housing units covered by iron sheets.

The highest percentage of the housing units covered by asbestos is found in Rwezamenyo (0.2%) and Nyarugenge (0.1%).



According to the area of residence, the predominant roofing materials are the iron sheets in both urban areas (99.3%) and rural areas (99.3%). The percentage of housing units covered by local tiles is 0.7% in rural areas while it is 0.2% in urban areas.

#### 4.2.3.2 Main materials of the walls

The results of the census show that the most materials of the walls of the housing units are sundried bricks with cement: 36.3% in Rwanda, 59.8% in the City of Kigali and 48.2% in Nyarugenge District.

At the national level, it is followed by sundried bricks without cement (30.7%) while the second most materials of the walls of the housing units in City of Kigali and Nyarugenge district are wood with mud and cement (11.4% and 7.6% respectively).

At the sector level, sun dried bricks with cement are the mostly used materials in Kimisagara (65.1%) and Muhima (51.1%). Wood with mud and cement is the most frequently used material in Gitega (56.5%), Nyarugenge (34.9%), Kigali and Nyakabanda (32.1% each).



According to the area of residence in Nyarugenge District, the main materials used for walls of the housing units are mostly sun-dried bricks with cement (50.5%) followed by wood with mud and cement (27.7%) and burnt bricks with cement (5.3%) in urban areas.

In rural areas, wood with mud and cement are predominant materials (32.4%) followed by sun-dried bricks with cement (31.1%) and wood with mud without cement (20.0%).

#### 4.2.3.3 Main materials of the floor

The results 5RPHC 2022 indicate that the main material of the floor of the housing units is earth (60.4%) at national level. In the City of Kigali, cement is the main material of the floor of the housing units (63.1%). In Nyarugenge District, the main material of the floor of the housing units is cement (71.0%) followed by earth (18.6%) and ceramic/clay/granite tiles (9.3%). At sector level, more than 70% of housing units have cement as main material used for the floor in 7 sectors out of 10: Gitega (89.6%), Kimisagara (86.9%), Nyakabanda (79.8%), Muhima (79.1%), Nyarugenge (75.0%), Rwezamenyo (74.3%) and Nyamirambo (70.2%). The highest percentage of the housing units with earth as main material used for the floor is found in Mageregere (54.1%), Kanyinya (37.5%) and Kigali (27.4%) and the high percentages of housing units whose floor is in ceramic/clay/granite tiles are found in Rwezamenyo (22.8%), Nyarugenge (18.0%), Muhima (16.4%) and Nyamirambo (15.4%).



By area of residence, the results of census indicate that the predominant materials used for the floor of the housing units are cement (75.2%) followed by earth (13.3%) and ceramic/clay/granite tiles (10.3%) in urban areas.

In rural areas, the predominant materials for the floor are earth (57.5%) and cement (40.1%).

# 4.3 Source of energy of the private households in Nyarugenge District

## 4.3.1 Grid Line connectivity in Nyarugenge District

At national level, the results of the 5<sup>th</sup> RPHC 2022 revealed that 52.5% of private households are connected to a grid line while 47.2% are not connected.

In City of Kigali, the percentage of private household connected to a grid line is 88.8% while it is 92.6% in Nyarugenge District.

At the sector level, over 95% of private households are connected to a grid line in 7 sectors out of 10. Rwezamenyo (99.7%), Nyakabanda (98.9%) and Nyarugenge (98.6%) have the higher percentages. Sectors with lower percentages of private households connected to a grid line are Mageregere (73.9%) and Kanyinya (83.4%).





## 4.3.2 Main source of energy for lighting

In Nyarugenge District, the main source of energy for lighting used by households is electricity (92.9%). At the sector level, more than 96% of households use electricity for lighting in 7 sectors out of 10: Rwezamenyo (99.6%), Nyarugenge (98.7%), Gitega (98.6%), Kimisagara (98.3%), Muhima (98.0%), Nyakabanda (97.7%) Nyamirambo (96.3%). The less percentage of private households using electricity is found in Mageregere (75.4%).

The sectors with the high percentages of private households using flashlight or phone flashlight for lighting are Mageregere (15.6%) and Kanyinya (8.4%). The table below provides details:



According to the area of residence, the main source of energy for lighting is electricity (95.4%) followed by candles (2.4%) and flashlight or phone flashlight (1.8%) in urban areas. In rural areas, 74.4% of private households use electricity as main source of energy for lighting while 16.4% use flashlight or phone flashlight and 7.0% use candles.

## 4.3.3 Main sources of energy for cooking in Nyarugenge District

At the district level, the main sources of energy for cooking used by the private households are charcoal (60.0%) followed by firewood and gas (17.8% each).

At the sector level, firewood is the most used source of cooking energy by private households in Mageregere (60.9%) and Kanyinya (42.6%).

Sectors with the high percentage of private households using charcoal as main source of cooking energy are Kimisagara (79.3%), Nyakabanda (67.7%) and Gitega (67.2%). Sectors with the highest percentages of private households using gas as main source of cooking energy are Rwezamenyo (42.9%), Nyarugenge (38.2%) and Muhima (37.1%).

The high percentage of private households that not cook are found in Rwezamenyo (5.9%), Muhima (5.6%), Nyarugenge (5.4%) and Kigali (5.3%).



By area of residence, private households use mostly charcoal (64.8%) and gaz (19.9%) in urban areas. In rural areas, private households use most firewood (71.5%) and charcoal (24.3%). The percentage of private households that do not cook is 4.5% in urban area and 1.9% in rural.

## 4.3.4 Water and sanitation of the private households in Nyarugenge District

## 4.3.4.1 Main source of water

The results of 5RPHC 2022 reveal that improved drinking water sources are used by 82.3% of private households in Rwanda while they are 97.4% in the City of Kigali. In Nyarugenge District, the percentage of private households using improved drinking water is 98.9%. At the sector level, almost all of private households 99% and above use improved drinking water sources in 8 sectors. Sectors with low percentages using this type are Kigali (98.9%) and Kanyinya (93.2%). The table below provides details:





Figure 4. 9 Distribution (%) of the private households of Nyarugenge District by main source of drinking water and by sector

By area of residence, private households use mainly improved drinking water source in both urban and rural areas of Nyarugenge District (99.2% in urban and 96.9% in rural). The percentage of private households using unimproved drinking water source is higher in rural (3.8%) than in urban (0.8%).

## 4.3.4.2 Main type of toilet facility

The results of census reveal that the main types of toilet facility used by the private households in Rwanda are "pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household" (68.8%). In Nyarugenge District, the main types of toilet facility used by the private households are "pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by several households" (55.5%), "pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household" (30.4%) and "flush toilet used by one household" (9.1%). At the sector level, the percentage of households using "pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household" is high in Mageregere (65.7%) and Kanyinya (49.3%) while it is low in Nyarugenge (15.7%), Gitega (16.8%) and Kimisagara (17.1%).

For "pit latrines with constructed floor slab used by several households", Kimisagara (73.7%), Gitega (73.0%) and Muhima (64.0%) are the sectors with the high percentage of private households using this kind of toilet. The lowest percentage is found in Mageregere (24.2%).

The high percentages of households using "flush toilets used by one household" are found in Rwezamenyo (25.4%) and Nyarugenge (20.7%).


The type of toilet facility used by the private households varies according to the area of residence in Nyarugenge District.

In urban areas, the types of toilets most used are "Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by several households" (59.9%), "Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household" (25.2%) and "flush toilet used by one household" (10.2%).

In rural areas, the main types of toilets used are "Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by one household" (68.4%) and "Pit Latrine with constructed floor slab used by several households" (23.2%).

## 4.3.4.3 Mode of waste disposal in Nyarugenge District

The results of the census reveal that, in Nyarugenge District, the high percentage of households (56.7%) evacuate their waste through the waste collection companies while 22.8% of private households evacuate their waste in the household's fields and 16.3% in the compost dumping.

At the Sector level, the high percentages of households evacuating their waste through the waste collection companies are in Rwezamenyo (98.3%), Gitega (97.1%), Muhima (96.7%), Nyarugenge (94.6%) and Nyakabanda (92.6%).

The household's fields as main mode of waste disposal is the most used Kigali (43.7%), Kanyinya(43.4%) and Mageregere (42.7%).

The high percentages of households using household compost dumping are in Mageregere (49.0%) and Kanyinya (33.0%).


The results of the census indicate that the main modes of waste disposal used by the households vary also by area of residence.

In urban areas, domestic waste is mainly collected and evacuated by companies (64.2%), thrown in the household's fields or in the bushes (19.2%) or in the household compost dumping (12.2%).

In rural areas, the households' waste is mainly evacuated thrown in the household's fields or bushes (49.5%) and in the household compost dumping (46.0%).

## 4.4 Assets possessed by private households in Nyarugenge District

## 4.4.1 Communication assets possessed by private households in Nyarugenge District

At the district level, 94.2% of private households possess a radio, 88.8% a mobile phone, 42.6% a smartphone, 36.8% a TV and 13.1% a computer. By sectors, the percentage of private households possessing at least one radio including one from telephone is high in Rwezamenyo (97.7%), Nyarugenge (97.7%), Gitega (97.6%) and Muhima (97.3%) and it is low in Gikomero (88.1%).

The percentage of private households possessing a television is high in Rwezamenyo (61.3%) while it is low in Mageregere (21.2%) and Kanyinya (21.9%).

Mobile phone is mostly possessed by private households of Rwezamenyo (95.7%), Nyarugenge (94.4%), Muhima and Nyakabanda (94.2% each) and Gitega (94.1%).

The sectors with high percentage of households with smartphone are Rwezamenyo (74.1%), Nyarugenge (65.1%) and Muhima (62.5%) while the percentage of households possessing this asset is low in Mageregere (18.7%) and Kanyinya (20.9%).

The computer is mostly possessed in Rwezamenyo (29.4%), Nyarugenge (27.6%) and Muhima (23.5%).

#### 4.4.2 Access to the Internet

The results of the 5<sup>th</sup> RPHC-2022 indicate that the percentages of households with at least one member using internet are 22.2% at national level while they are 53.4% in City of Kigali and 54.0% in Nyarugenge District.

At sector level, the percentage of households with at least one member using internet is high in Rwezamenyo (86.7%), Muhima (72.1%) and Gitega (71.6%). The sectors with the lower percentages of households with at least one member using internet are Mageregere (28.7%) and Kanyinya (29.9%).



According to the area of residence in Nyarugenge District, the results of the census show that the access to the Internet varies greatly.

## **CHAPTER 5: AGRICULTURE IN NYARUGENGE DISTRICT**

The agriculture was the one of the areas of investigation of the 5<sup>th</sup> Rwanda Population and Housing Census conducted in 2022 and private households engaged in livestock husbandry and types of livestock, private households engaged in crop farming cultivating different types of crops were captured in the census. Their number and percentage are presented by sector and by different types of livestock and by different types of crops cultivated.

## 5.1 Crop farming and livestock husbandly in Nyarugenge District

At national level, the results of 5<sup>th</sup> RPHC 2022 revealed that 2,280,854 of private households (68.9%) are engaged in agriculture. Among them, 62.6% are engaged in crop farming and 50.4% are engaged in Livestock husbandry.

In Nyarugenge District, crop farming and animal husbandly are on small scale: agricultural households occupy 19.3% with 14.5% of households engaged in crop farming and 12.1% of households engaged in livestock husbandry.

At the sector level, the highest percentages of agricultural households are found in Mageregere (53.9%) Kanyinya (39.5%) and Kigali (24.6%). Households engaged in crop farming as well as those engaged in livestock husbandry are more represented in the same sectors: Mageregere (45.1% of households in crop farming and 35.3% in livestock husbandry), Kanyinya (31.8% of households in crop farming and 27.5% in livestock husbandry) and Kigali (17.6% of households in crop farming and 15.5% in livestock husbandry). ## 5.2 Crop farming in Nyarugenge District

The results of the 5<sup>th</sup> Population and Housing Census 2022 indicate that the most cultivated crops by the private households of Nyarugenge District are beans (11,851 households), fruits (9,390 households), cassava (8,344 households) and maize (5,398 households). By sector, Mageregere has the high number of households practicing crop farming: 4,868 households for beans; 3,824 households for fruits; 3,451 households for cassava and 2,190 for maize. The

sectors with few households practicing crop farming (all types of crops) are Rwezamenyo and Nyarugenge.

## 5.3 Livestock husbandly in Nyarugenge District

Nationally and in the City of Kigali, the results of the census indicate that most private households engaged in livestock husbandly are considerably more engaged in raising cows, goats, and chicken than other livestock. It is in the same extent in Nyarugenge District.

The sectors that have high number of private households that are engaged in livestock are Mageregere (2,276 households raising goats; 1,819 households raising chickens and 1,209 households raising cows), Kigali (1,180 households raising goats; 1,163 households raising chickens and 913 raising cows) and Kanyinya (1,366 households raising cows; 864 households raising goats and 830 households raising chickens).
