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#### SUMMARY

In the fourth quarter of 2020, Rwanda's total trade was US\$ 1231.61 million, an increase of 0.86 percent over the fourth quarter of 2019. Exports were US\$ 241.35 million, imports were US\$ 900.35 million and re-exports were US\$ 89.91 million.

In this quarter, total domestic exports decreased by 43.71 percent when compared to the third quarter of 2020 (US\$ 241.35 million and US\$ 428.78 million respectively). Total imports of Rwanda increased by 0.89 percent when compared to the same quarter of 2019 (US\$ 900.35 million and US\$ 892.38 million respectively) and decreased by 7.97 percent over the third quarter of 2020. Re-exports, increased by 2.95 percent in the fourth quarter of 2020 over the same quarter of 2019 (US\$ 89.91 million and US\$ 87.33 million respectively) and by 13.29 percent compared to the third quarter of 2020.

The top five export destinations were; United Arab Emirates, the Democratic Republic of Congo, United Kingdom, India and United States of America. Together, these five countries accounted a share of 76.31 percent of total value of domestic exports (US\$ 184.17 million).

The commodity groups with the largest export values were; "Other commodities & transactions, n.e.s" (US\$ 125.43 million), "Food and live animals" (US\$ 67.45 million), and "Crude materials, inedible, except fuels" (US\$ 22.57 million).

In terms of re-exports, the top five destinations were the Democratic Republic of Congo, Uganda, Ethiopia, Senegal and United Arab Emirates. Democratic Republic of Congo accounted for 96.81 percent of Rwanda's total re-exports. The most re-exported commodity group were, "Food & live animals" (US\$ 31.74 million) followed by "Mineral fuels, lubricants & related materials" (US\$ 15.90 million).

In terms of total imports (CIF); Tanzania, China, Kenya, India, and United Arab Emirates were the top five countries of origin of imports to Rwanda and they totalized US\$ 577.81 million of imports equivalent to 64.18% share of the total value of imports.

The commodity groups with the largest values among the top imported products were "Machinery and transport equipment" (US\$ 188.89 million), "Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material" (US\$ 144.14 million) and "Other commodities & transactions, n.e.s" (US\$ 126.47 million).

#### INTRODUCTION

This Statistical Report of Formal External Trade in Goods covers the fourth quarter of 2020, the period running from October to December. It is produced by the External Trade Statistics Team of the Department of Economic Statistics (DES) at the National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR).

One of the key mandates of the DES is to compile, analyze and produce statistics and information on the external trade sector following international recommendations. The Rwanda Revenue Authority (RRA), Customs Department provides raw data compiled by NISR. They are processed using EUROTRACE and MS Access database management systems (DBMS).

To collect and compile formal external trade statistics, NISR relies on the General Trade System under which the recorded aggregates include all goods entering or leaving the country's economic territory with the exception of simple transit trade.

**Imports** include goods brought in directly for domestic consumption plus goods imported into customs bonded warehouses.

**Exports** cover domestic exports defined as goods of national origin; that is, goods produced in the exporting country and the nationalized goods.

**Re-exports** which are exported in the same conditions as imported or after undergoing minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged and include re-exports from customs bonded warehouses.

**Partner country** is the last known country of destination for exports and the country of origin for imports by the time of compilation.

**Valuation of imports and exports:** Imports are valued on a CIF (Cost, Insurance and Freight) basis while exports and re-exports are valued on a FoB (Free on Board) basis.

**Classification of commodities:** The data are categorized by partner country and the international standard classifications such as the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (HS) and the Standard International Trade Classification (SITC), all linked to the national Customs Procedure Codes (CPCs).

Furthermore, the compilation of External Trade Statistics abides by the recommendations of the *International Merchandise Trade Statistics: Concepts and Definitions 2010* (IMTS 2010) of the United Nations Statistics Division (UNSD). Hence, the data for this report are compiled on **IMTS 2010** basis (not to be confused with data compiled on **Balance of Payments** or **National Accounts** basis)

# 1. Rwanda's Formal External Trade in Goods

This section provides an overview of Rwanda's total trade in goods covering the period from first quarter 2018 to the fourth quarter of 2020, on a quarterly basis.

In the fourth quarter of 2020, Rwanda's total trade was US\$ 1231.61 million, an increase of 0.86 percent over the fourth quarter of 2019 and a decrease of 17.14 percent from US\$ 1486.45 million in the preceding quarter (third quarter of 2020).

Figure 1 below summarizes the balance of Rwanda's formal trade in goods. Year-over-year, the deficit on traded goods decreased by 0.96 percent, from the same period in 2019.

Total imports of goods constitute 73 percent of total trade in goods (US\$ 900.35 million), while domestic exports constituted 20 percent (US\$ 241.35 million) and re-exports constituted 7 percent (US\$ 89.91 million). For more detailed figures, see Appendix 6.1.

# **2.** Domestic Exports

# 2.1. Overview

Compared to the third quarter of 2020, the fourth quarter of 2020 registered a decrease in values of 43.71 percent, with total domestic exports estimated at US\$ 241.35 million (see Figure 1).

# 2.2. Rwanda's Export Markets

# 2.2.1. Trade Partners

Rwanda's key destination markets of exports during the fourth quarter of 2020 were the United Arab Emirates (US\$ 134.21 million, 55.61 percent share), the Democratic Republic of Congo (US\$ 24.23 million, 10.04 percent share), United Kingdom (US\$ 9.07 million, 3.76 percent share), India (US\$ 8.79 million, 3.64 percent share) and United States of America (US\$ 7.87 million, 3.26 percent share).

Together, these five countries accounted for US\$ 184.17 million; that is 76.31 percent share of total value of domestic exports. Figure 2 summarizes these figures from quarter one of 2018 up to the fourth quarter of 2020. For the top twenty domestic exports partners see appendix 6.5a.

# 2.2.2. East African Community Partner States

In the fourth quarter of 2020, Rwanda's domestic exports to the East African Community Partner States was estimated at US\$ 12.14 million, around 5 percent of total domestic exports value see appendix 6.8b. Of these, about 38.58 percent were destined to South Sudan (US\$ 4.68 million).

Domestic exports' values to EAC Partner States increased by 3.14 percent in comparison with the third quarter of 2020 and by 135.71 percent when compared to the same quarter of 2019.

In terms of exports to EAC partner states, Kenya stood at the second place with domestic exports from Rwanda valued at US\$ 3.94 million.

# 3. Imports

## 3.1. Overview

In the fourth quarter of 2020, Total estimated value of imports was US\$ 900.35 million; a decrease of 7.97 percent compared to the third quarter of 2020, which was US\$ 978.31 million, and an increase of 0.89 percent when compared to the corresponding quarter of 2019, which was US\$ 892.38 million (see Figure 1 above and appendix 6.1).

The five most imported commodities in terms of USD values ranked from top to bottom were "Other commodities & transactions, n.e.s", "Food and live animals", "Crude materials, inedible, except fuels" and "Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material".

## 3.2. Origin of the imports of Rwanda

## 3.2.1 Trade Partners

In the fourth quarter of 2020, the top five imports of Rwanda came from the following countries: Tanzania (US\$ 173.10 million), China (US\$ 171.01 million), Kenya (US\$ 100.16 million), India (US\$ 79.08 million) and United Arab Emirates (US\$ 54.45 million). A more extensive table showing the top twenty partner countries in terms of imports is provided in Appendix 6.6a.

#### 3.2.2 East African Community Partner States

In the fourth quarter of 2020, Rwanda's imports from EAC Partner States totaled US\$ 273.34 million; representing 30.36 percent of all imported commodities (see Appendix 6.8a).

Imports from Tanzania represent 63.33 percent of total imports from EAC partner states while those from Kenya were 36.64 percent.

In general, Rwanda's imports from EAC Partner States increased by 41.94 percent when compared to the same quarter of 2019 (US\$ 192.57 million in the fourth quarter of 2019).

# 4. Re-exports

# 4.1. Overview

In the fourth quarter of 2020, Rwanda's re-exports was estimated at US\$ 89.91 million, an increase of 13.29 percent over the third quarter of 2020 (from US\$ 79.36 million in the third quarter) and of 2.95 percent when compared to the same quarter of 2019 (US\$ 87.33 million).

The top three products re-exported by Rwanda in the fourth quarter of 2020 accounted for around 64.41 percent of total Rwanda's re-export values. These are; "Food and live animals" which amounted to US\$ 31.74 million, "Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials" which amounted to US\$ 15.90 million and "Animals and vegetable oils, fats & waxes" estimated at US\$ 10.28 million.

## 4.2. Rwanda's Re-exports Markets

## 4.2.1. Trade Partners

The analysis of re-exports figures by country of destination for the fourth quarter of 2020 shows that African countries were the main buyers. Out of US\$ 89.91 million of re-exports value of Rwanda, the African countries accounted for 99.29 percent of total re-exports. The Democratic Republic of Congo was the main destination, with 96.81 percent share of Rwanda's total re-exports amounting to US\$ 87.04 million. Other important destinations of Rwanda's re-exports, ranked by percent share, were Uganda (0.92 percent), Ethiopia (0.76 percent), Senegal (0.39 percent) and United Arab Emirates (0.21 percent). Figure 6 below illustrates respective quarterly values per top five destinations of Rwanda's re-exports and the rest of the world.

#### 4.2.2. East African Community Partner States

Rwanda's re-exports to EAC Partner States decreased by 82.54 percent in value terms during the fourth quarter of 2020 compared to the same quarter of 2019 (US\$ 0.92 million and 5.27 US\$ million, respectively) and by 19.41 percent when compared to the third quarter of 2020 (US\$ 0.92 million and US\$ 1.14 million respectively).

# 5. Trade with Selected Regional Economic Organizations

# 5.1. Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa

During the fourth quarter of 2020, Rwanda's total trade with the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA) Member States was US\$ 254.18 million compared to US\$ 225.78 million registered in the same quarter of 2019 and US\$ 296.54 million registered in the third quarter of 2020.

Exports to COMESA Member States increased by 68.66 percent in 20209Q4 when compared to the same quarter of 2019 and reduced by 12.14 compared to the third quarter of 2020.

Imports from COMESA Member States increased by 8.86 percent in 2020Q4 when compared to the same quarter of 2019 but decreased by 26.97 percent when compared to the third quarter of 2020.

On the re-exports side, Rwanda registered revenues estimated at US\$ 88.67 million during the fourth quarter of 2020 from COMESA Member States; an increase of 4.24 percent in value terms against the same quarter of 2019 and of 13.77 percent when compared to the third quarter of 2020.

Thus, a deficit in trade balance of US\$ 7.30 million has been registered during the 2020Q4 against another one of US\$ 14.41 million during the same quarter of 2019 and of US\$ 61.51 million registered in the third quarter of 2020.

# 5.2. Communauté Economique des Pays de Grands Lacs

During the fourth quarter of 2020, total exports to Communauté Economique des Pays de Grands Lacs (CEPGL) Member States (Burundi and the Democratic Republic of Congo), including re-exports, totalized US\$ 111.30 million and total imports were US\$ 2.49 million. Therefore, the trade in goods surplus with CEPGL member states totaled US\$ 108.81 million compared to US\$ 93.23 million registered in the same quarter of 2019 and to US\$ 100.84 million in the third quarter of 2020.

# 5.3. Southern African Development Community

Rwanda's total trade with the Southern African Development Community (SADC) Member States totaled US\$ 321.61 million during the fourth quarter of 2020 compared to US\$ 259.96 million in the fourth quarter of 2019 and US\$ 378.69 million during the third quarter of 2020.

Year-over-year, domestic exports to the SADC increased by 41 percent, from 18.84 US\$ million in the fourth quarter of 2019 to US\$ 25.99 million in the fourth quarter of 2020; while total imports increased by about 27 percent, from US\$ 164.71 million to US\$ 208.47 million. Over the same period, re-exports increased by 13 percent, from US\$ 76.81 million to 87.15 US\$ million.

Therefore, the trade in goods deficit with SADC totaled US\$ 95.52 million compared to another one of US\$ 69.47 million during the same quarter of 2019 and another one of US\$ 166.36 million in the third quarter of 2020.

# 5.4. European Union

Trade in goods with the European Union (EU) in the fourth quarter of 2020 totaled US\$ 123.49 against US\$ 95.60 million registered in the same quarter of 2019 and of US\$ 92.81 million in the third quarter of 2020.

The quarterly exports to EU Member Countries decreased by 15.45 percent when compared to the same quarter of 2019 (US\$ 20.08 million against US\$ 23.75 million). The total value of imports from the EU increased by 45.73 percent during the fourth quarter of 2020 over the same quarter of 2019.

Re-exports to the EU decreased by 88.08 percent during the fourth quarter of 2020 over the same quarter of 2019 (US\$ 0.97 million and US\$ 0.12 million respectively).

To sum, Rwanda's trade with the EU registered a trade deficit of US\$ 83.09 million in the fourth quarter of 2020 and of US\$ 46.16 million in the same quarter of 2019 while US\$ 54.98 million has been registered as deficit in the third quarter of 2020.

# 5.5. Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS)

During the fourth quarter of 2020, total exports to the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS) Member Countries, including re-exports, totalized US\$ 0.62 million and the total imports were US\$ 1.21 million. Therefore, the trade in goods deficit with ECOWAS Member States extended to US\$ 0.59 million from the one of US\$ 0.72 million in the same quarter of 2019.
