





The Fifth Rwanda Population and Housing Census (RPHC2022) was implemented by the National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR). Field work was conducted from August 16 th to 30 th , 2022.
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FOREWORD

The Government of Rwanda, through the National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) conducted the 2022 Rwanda Population and Housing Census to provide updated demographic, social and economic indicators for policy formulation and planning to support the national development agenda and track the implementation of national, regional, continental and global development goals, such as the First National Strategy for Transformation (NST1 2017-2024); the AU Agenda 2063; and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The Population and Housing Census in Rwanda dates back to the year 1978 when the first ever modern census was implemented. The second, third, and fourth censuses were carried out in 1991, 2002, and 2012 respectively. The 2022 Population and Housing Census marks therefore the Fifth in the series following the United Nations Recommendations to conduct a census every ten years.

Considering census' crucial importance for the planning process, the Government of Rwanda has made the Population and Housing Census a priority to be undertaken every 10 years and adopted the use of technologies for timely delivery of census results for use.

Results of the 2022 Population and Housing Census provide population numbers from national to the lowest administrative level, as well as demographic and socio-economic indicators at both national and district levels. The census remains the only national data collection exercise that can provide the lowest levels of disaggregation to support decentralised decision making across the country.

I would like therefore to take this opportunity to thank all stakeholders that contributed to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. They include Ministries and other Government institutions, international organizations such as the World Bank (WB), the European Union (EU), the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), One-UN, UN Women, UNICEF, UNECA, the United Kingdom AID (UKAID), the African Development Bank (AfDB), the USAID, Enabel, PARIS 21 and others for their support in diverse ways.

My special thanks go to the local government leaders from the province to the village levels who contributed a lot to the success of the 2022 Population and Housing Census. Exceptional gratitude to all enumerators, teachers and young people who collected the information and all respondents for their cooperation and dedication. The National Institute of Statistics of Rwanda (NISR) deserves special appreciation for the excellent operational and coordination of all census activities.

I finally recommend that the invaluable information contained in different thematic reports of the 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census be used as updated evidence for all decision and policy making for the national, regional and global development programs.



CHAPTER 1: POPULATION SIZE, SPATIAL DISTRIBUTION, AND STRUCTURE

4.1.1 1.1 Size and Spatial Distribution of the population

4.1.2 1.1.1 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Eastern Province

The 5Th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 3,563.145 residents in the Eastern Province, which represents 26,89% of the total population of Rwanda (13,246,394 residents). The population of the Eastern Province is predominantly female; 1,828,751 are female corresponding to 51.3% of the total population of the Eastern Province. Kayonza is the sixth populated district with 457,156 residents in 2022. Its population represents 12.8% of the total residents' population of Eastern Province. The least populated district in the Eastern Province is Ngoma with 404,048 inhabitants, corresponding to 11.3% of the total resident population of Eastern Province.


4.1.3 1.1.2 Distribution of Population Density of the Eastern Province by Distric

Population density is a measurement of population per unit land area. Density is the number of the inhabitant per Km². The Rwanda Population and Housing Census conducted in 2022 revealed that, the population density in Rwanda is 503 inhabitants per Km². The Eastern Province has 433 inhabitant per Km². The district with a high population density is Rwamagana with 740 Inhabitants per km². The district with a lowest population density is Kayonza with 338 Inhabitants per km². The figure below indicates distribution of population density per district.

4.1.4 1.1.3 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of the Kayonza district

The 5th Rwanda Population and Housing Census (PHC5) has enumerated 457,156 residents in Kayonza district, which represent 12.8% % of the total population of the Eastern Province (3,563,145 residents). The population of Kayonza district is predominantly female: 235,708 are women corresponding to 51.6 % of its total population.

Females are predominant in all 12 sectors of the district of Kayonza district.

Murundi (57,809 population) and Mukarange (54,818 population) are the most populated sectors. They represent 12.6% and 12.0% of the total population of Kayonza district, respectively. The two less populated sectors are Ruramira (21,185 inhabitants) and Murama(23,381 inhabitants). They represent 4,6% and 5.1% of the total resident population of Kayonza district, respectively. The table below 1.2 indicates the number of the population of Kayonza district by sector, by sex and their shares across sectors to the total population of Kayonza district.

4.1.5 1.1.4 Size and Spatial Distribution of the Population of Kayonza district by residence area

The results of Rwanda Population and housing census 2022 revealed that, the total population of Rwanda are spatially distributed in rural area that represent 72.1% and urban area represent 27.9% and the Eastern Province is also predominantly rural area (79.1%) and urban area is only 20.9%. Kayonza population lives predominantly in rural area 85.8% while resident population in Urban represents 14.2%.

The sectors of Kayonza district which are entirely rural are Kabare, Murama, Mwiri, Ndego, Ruramira and Rwinkwavu. The table below 1.3 illustrates the results.

4.1.6 1.1.5 Age-sex structure of the Population of Kayonza district


Kayonza population is mostly young. 59.95% of the resident population of Kayonza is under 25 years, as shown by the age pyramid (Figure 4). 4.1.7 1.1.6 population share of some specific interventions target groups in Kayonza District by sex

The Rwanda population and housing census 2022 indicate the population on specific ages-based programs, policy and strategies interventions in health, education, and employment and also indicates the population categories in their respective characteristics such as children, youth, working population, among other things. For instance, children under five years for immunization programs (Under 5 children), children in school-age (3-17 years), people in the official working age group (16 years and above), etc. Knowing the size of such groups is of great importance for the design, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of programs targeting such groups. The below table gives the size of the main interventions target groups by sex, and their share in the entire population of Kayonza district. The population aged 0-17 represents 46.9 % of the total population of the district, 16-30 years represent 26.4%. The working age population, 16 and above represents 58.0 %. The table below shows distribution of Kayonza districts by targeted interventions by their age.

CHAPTER 2: CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION

4.1.8 2.1 Socio-cultural characteristics of the population

2.1.1 Nationality of the population of Kayonza district

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that, the Rwandan population by nationality represent 99.1% and foreigners represent 0.89%. In the Eastern Province, foreigners represent 1.70% and 0.15% in Kayonza District that is to say 665 residents 'foreigners. By sector, the sector of Mukarange has the highest percentage of foreigners compared to others (201 that represents 0.37%).

The table below illustrates the distribution of the population by nationality with their respective sectors of residence.

4.1.9 2.1.2 Distribution of (Count and %) of the resident population of Kayonza District by religious affiliation and their area of residence.

In Kayonza district, Christianity is the predominant religion in Kayonza district. 26.80% are catholic, 23.59% are ADEPR, 18.54 % are protestant, 11.66% are Adventists, and 8.67% are other Christians. Muslim represents 2.27% and Jehovah witness are 0.60%. 4.03% of the resident population declared themselves to be without religion. The table below displays details:

2.2 Marital Status of the resident population of Kayonza district

2.2.1 Marital status by sector

The results of 5RPHC-2022, 49.0% of the resident population of Kayonza district aged 12 and above were married(married officially to one wife/husband, married not officially to one wife/husband, live in polygamous union) at the time of the census, while 43,9% were never married. 4.6% were widowed, while separated and divorced were respectively 2.4% and 0.2%.

At the sector level, two sectors, Murundi(51.0%), Kabare(50.6%) and Ndego(50.1%) have the highest percentages of the currently married people. Rukara (46.5%), Mukarange (45.5%) and Kabarondo(45.4%) have the highest percentages of the never married persons. Ruramira, Nyamirama and Rukara sectors have high percentage of widowed persons (5.7%, 5.2% and 5.1% respectively). Details of the resident population of Kayonza district aged 12 years and above by marital status and sex is presented in the annex.

2.2.2 Marital status by Age groups

The percentages of resident population of Kayonza district by marital status vary by age: The percentage of never married persons decreases from 99.8% (age group of 12-14 years) to 1.6% (age group of 80 years and above). The percentage of persons currently married starts by increasing from 0.2% (age group of 12-14 years) to a maximum of 85.3% (age group of 40-44 years) before decreasing to 50.8% (age group 80+) due mainly to widowhood (46.4%). The highest percentage of divorced persons is observed from age group 40-44 and 55-59 that is 0.5% for each age group while the highest percentage of the separated persons (4.8%) is found in age group 45-49 years.

2.3 Educational Characteristics of the Population of Kayonza district

2.3.1 School attendance

Table 2.5 below shows that, in Kayonza district, 55.3% of pre-primary-age population (3-5 years) are currently attending school, 44.7% of children have never attended and 0% of children have previously attended (i.e children who have already had prior exposure to nursery school education before the time of census but who were not attending nursery school/droped-out during census time). Rukara Sector has the highest proportion of children (age between 3 to 5) currently attending school in Kayonza District (69.4%). Following closely, the Murama Sector has a percentage of 64.4 % of children currently attending school. Two sectors Ruramira and Rwinkwavu have the lowest percentage of children currently attending school, with only (45.2% each) enrolled.

Table 2.6 shows that in Kayonza District 86.8% of children age 6 to 11 years (the official primary school-going age) are currently attending school, 11.0% have never attended school and only 2.2% have previously attended school (which means that 13.2 of children aged 6 to 11 are out of school).

By comparing the distribution of the primary school-age population (6-11 years) across sectors in Kayonza District, comparisons reveal the disparities in primary school attendance across different sectors within Kayonza District. Sectors like Gahini, Murundi (83.5% each), and Mwiri(84.0%) and Ruramira(84.2%)exhibit lower rates of children currently attending school and higher rates of children who have never attended (14.2%, 13.4%, 14.4% and 14.1%) respectively). On the other hand, sectors like Kabarondo and Murama demonstrate higher rates of children currently attending school (92.2 against 91.8%, respectively) and lower rates of children who have never attended (6.4against 6.0%, respectively).

In Kayonza District 25.4% of the population aged 12 to 17 have previously attended school (i.e. they dropped out of school), 70,4% are currently attending school and 4.3% have never attended secondary school.

The distribution of the secondary school-age population (12-17 years) across sectors in Kayonza District, shows that Mukarange sector has the highest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school at 74.3%. Conversely, Kabare sector has the lowest percentage of the population aged 12 to 17 currently attending school with 66.4%. Ndego Sector also has the highest percentage of the population between the ages of 12 and 17 who have never attended school at 6.4%.

2.3.2 Gross and Net Attendance Rate % in Primary School in Kayonza district

Gross and Net Attendance Ratios are used to measure the extent of coverage of an educational program. It gives a comparison of the children attending school with the total size of the school-age population. It can also be used for assessing how far a country has succeeded in bringing to school all those who are eligible to attend.

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 reveal that not all children attending primary school level are of the official age for that level (6-11 years). The gross attendance rate in Rwanda and in the Eastern Province is 141.7(for each) and 141.8 in Kayonza districts. At sector level, GAR are greater than 130% in all sectors.

The net attendance rate (NAR) in Primary school for Kayonza district (86.8%) is below the NAR of the Eastern Province (87.4%) and of the national level where it is(89.3%). The highest net attendance rate in primary school is in Kabarondo sector(92.2%) followed by Murama sector with 91.8% and Rukara with 89.2% while the sectors with the lowest NAR is Murundi and Gahini with 83.5% each.

A Gross Attendance Rate (GAR) of 141.8% in Kayonza District for the population 6 to 11 years indicates a high percentage of those who attended primary schools aged below 6 years and or above 11 years. On the other hand, the NAR of 86.8% for the population 6 to 11 years

indicates that only 86.8% of the population 6 to 11 years were attending primary schools in Kayonza District by 2022 (Table 2.7). In 2022, students older or younger than the official primary school age range made up 38.8% [(GAR141.8-NAR86.8)/GAR 141.8] of the primary school population of Kayonza District.

Al most all sectors have gender parity indexes greater than 1.00 suggesting better access to education for female students compared to male students. The table below displays results

4.1.10 2.3.3 Gross and Net Attendance Rate (%) in Secondary School

The table 2. 9 provides information on the gross and net attendance rates in the secondary school level (12-17 years) in Kayonza District, disaggregated by sex and sector. The Eastern Province and Kayonza District both have lower NARs than the national average (19.2% and 17.6%, respectively, versus 22.3%) when compared to the national average. Comparing males and females in Kayonza District in terms of Net Attendance Rates (NAR), the table 2. 9 indicates that a higher proportion of females 20.4%) in Kayonza District, within the secondary school-age range (12-17 years), are attending school compared to males (14.7%). Female students older or younger than the official secondary school age range made up 42.6 % [(GAR35.6-NAR20.4)/GAR35.6] of the female with secondary school age of Kayonza District, while for male students it made up 51.5 % [(GAR30.3-NAR14.7)/GAR30.3]. This shows that males have a higher attendance rate in Kayonza District compared to females when considering the overall attendance rates, regardless of age or grade-level eligibility.

Among the sectors in Kayonza District, Mukarange and Kabarondo have the highest GARs for both sexes, with a rate of 46.5%, 43.2 respectively as well as NARs (25.1% and 23.5%)

respectively). Sectors such as Ruramira and Murundi have relatively both lower GARS and NARs compared to others (23.6%, 24.8% respectively for GARs and 13.1% and 12.8% respectively).

2.3.4 Highest level of school attended in Kayonza district

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate the total population of Rwanda aged 3 and above is 11,999,691. The highest level of education attended is categorized into several levels: Never attended School, Nursery, Primary, INGOBOKA/Vocational, Lower secondary, Upper secondary, University, and Not stated. In Rwanda, 16.7% of the population aged 3 years and above has never attended school, while 2.7% have attended nursery, and 59.5% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.8% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.6% for lower secondary, 7.1% for upper secondary, 3.6% for university, and 0.0% is not stated.

The total population of the Eastern Province aged 3 and above is 3,215,103. The distribution of the highest level of education attended is like the national level, with slight variations. In the Eastern Province, 18.1% of the population has never attended school, while 2.9% have attended nursery, and 60.9% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.6% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.3% for lower secondary, 6.0% for upper secondary, 2.2% for university, and 0.0% is not stated.

The total population of Kayonza District aged 3 and above is 412,951. In Kayonza District, 18.2% of the population has never attended school, while 3.1% have attended nursery, and 61.5% have attended primary school. Other education levels include 0.5% for INGOBOKA/Vocational, 9.1% for lower secondary, 5.6% for upper secondary, 2.0% for university, and 0.0% is not stated.

The distribution of the highest level of education attended varies among sectors, with differences in the percentage of individuals at each education level. For example, Ruramira

has a higher percentage (23.1%) of individuals who have never attended school compared to other sectors, while Mukarange has a higher percentage (11.4%) of individuals who attended upper secondary school. The percentage of those attended primary school is more than 50% where Murama(66.4%) is the sector with the highest percentage. Kabarondo has a high percentage of those attended university level(3.3%).

Each sector has its own unique distribution of education levels attended by the population. The table below indicates the findings:

2.4 Characteristics of the Employed Population

The official working age in Rwanda is 16 years and above. Aggregate employment generally increase with growing population. Therefore, the ration of employment to the working age population (employment to population ratio) is an important indicator of the capacity of the Economy to provide employment to a growing population. A decline in the employment to population ration is often regarded as an indicator of economic slowdown and a decline in total employment as an indicator of a more severe economic downturn.

2.4.1 Employment to population ratio by sex, Province, District and area of residence

The results presented in the below table 2.11 shows that the employment to population ratio stood at 45.9 in Rwanda, it is lower among females (40.2 percent) than males (52.4 percent). On the other side, it was observed that the employment to population ratio is higher in urban areas of Rwanda (53.5 percent) than in rural areas (42.7 percent).

It was observed that in Eastern Province, the employment to population ratio stood at 47.9 percent, it is higher in urban areas (53.1 percent) than in rural areas of The Eastern Province (46.5 percent).

It was also revealed that the employment to population ratio is 45.3percent among people residing in Kayonza districts, it is higher in urban areas of Kayonza (52.0 percent) than in rural areas of Kayonza (44.1 percent).

4.1.11 2.4.2 Employment to population ratio(EPR) among the resident population of Kayonza aged 16 years and above by age group and sex

Figure 2.1 allows the study of intensity of Employment to population ratio and its variation by sex. The figure reveals the following remarks: The employment to population ratio among males as well as females increases from age group 16-19 to 35-44 and starts decreasing from age group 45-49 to 85 years and above as people starts getting very older and retire.

It was observed that in district of Kayonza. the highest employment to population ratio among males stands at 65.6% and was observed in age group 30-34. On the other side the highest employment to population among females is 52.0% and was observed in the age group 40-44. The lowest employment to population ratio among males stands at 10.2% and was observed among males in the age group 80-84. the lowest employment to population ratio among females is 3.1% and was observed among females in the age group 85+.

CHAPTER 3: SUB-POPULATION

4.1.12 3.1 Children Population (0-17 years)

According to the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989). a child is defined as every human being under 18 unless. under the law applicable to the child. majority is attained earlier. It is relevant to underline here that this definition by age coincides with that of Rwanda. as stipulated in Article 3 of the National Law n° 54/2011 of 14 December 2011 relating to the rights and the protection of the child. which stipulates that a child is any person under the age of 18. The age range (0–17) adopted for this report reflects this definition.

4.1.13 3.1.1 The number and share of children in Kayonza district.

At the national level, the children population constitute 44.5% of the total population of 13.246.394. The Eastern Province has 1.656.727 children with a share of 46.5% of the total resident population.

In Kayonza District, the children constitute 46.9% of the resident population of the district. with a percentage of males slightly greater than the females' one (48.8% vs 45.2%).

At sector level, the children's share is high in Murundi(48.7%) and Mwiri (48.5%). It is small in Mukarange(44.9%). The table below indicate distribution of children by sector and by sex.

4.1.14 3.1.2 Children with birth registration in Kayonza district

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate the percentage of children whose birth was registered is 94.28% at the national level. The birth registration rate in Kayonza district is 93.78%. The variation by sex is not very significant but the birth registration is high in urban (95.51%) than in rural areas (93.51%). The table below illustrates the findings:

4.1.15 3.1.3 Birth registration by sector

The results of 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that birth registration varies across sectors and areas of residence (urban and rural). Kabare, Murama, Mwiri, Ndego, Ruramira and Rwinkwavu sectors have not urban areas. While Gahini, Kabarondo, Mukarange, Murundi, Nyamirama and Rukara have urban and rural areas.

The high percentages of birth registrations are found in Kabarondo and Ruramira (96.4% each) while the lowest is in Murundi (90.7%).

The percentage of birth registration for males is almost the same as the one for females(93.7% for males against 93.8% for females). In urban areas of Kayonza district, birth registration is 95.5% while it is 93.5% in rural areas.

3.2 Youth population in Rwanda

The United Nations. for statistical purposes. defines 'youth'. as those persons between the ages of 15 and 24 years. without prejudice to other definitions by Member States. Considering the current priorities and trends of Rwanda's Development. the definition of Youth in terms of age has been revised in this policy. It was brought from 14–35 years to 16–30 years.

4.1.16 3.2.1 The youth population in Kayonza District

The results of 5th Population and housing Censuses conducted in 2022 revealed that, the youth represent 27.14% (3,595,670) of the total population (13,246,394).

The youth population in Kayonza district was 120,691 which represents 26.40% of the total resident population of the district (457,156).

The sector with the highest youth share is Mukarange (29.22%) while Ruramira (23.60) has the lowest share of youth.

The table below indicates distribution of youth by sector. and by sex.

4.1.17 3.2.2 Educational characteristics of youth in Kayonza District

Youth who never attended school represent 5.15 % of the youth resident population at national level. it represents 6.01% of the total resident population in Eastern Province and 6.28% of the total resident population of Kayonza district.

The percentage of youth who never attended school varies a lot within sectors of Kayonza district. The highest percentage was registered in Murundi (9.48%) while the lowest percentages were registered in Kabarondo (3.93%), Murama (4.21%) and Mukarange (4.67%).

3.2.3 Highest level of education attended by youth in Kayonza district

In Kayonza district, among all youth, 55.0% attained only the primary school level, 21.3 % attained the lower secondary education, 13.6 % attained the upper secondary education, 3.1% attained university, and 6.3% have not attended any formal of school.

The highest level of education attained varies across sectors of the district. The sectors with the highest percentage of youth with no schooling are Murundi(9.6%) and Ndego (9.3% e). The percentage of youth with university level is high in Mukarange (6.1%). The sectors with the highest percentages of youth with upper secondary education are Mukarange(23.9%) and Kabarondo(20.0%), those with high percentages of youth with low secondary education are Rukara(23.7%) and Mukarange(23.1%). The percentage with high education of youth with primary education are Ruramira (63.6%), Kabare(59.8%), Murundi(59.7%), Murama and Ndego(59.6% each).

4.1.18 3.2.4 Employment to population ratio among youth(16-30)

The Census results showed that In Rwanda the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 40.3%, it is higher among males than females 44.8% and 36.2% respectively. It was observed that in the district of Kayonza, the employment to population ratio among youth stands at 38.6%, it is higher among males (42.3%) than females (35.0%)

The highest employment to population ratio among youth in Kayonza district was observed in Mukarange (52.5%) while the lowest employment to population ratio among youth was observed in Ndego (30.2%).

3.2.6 Proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training in Eastern Province by sex, district, and area of residence

The results of 5RPHC-2022 indicate that, in Rwanda the proportion of Youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training stood at 39.5 %. It is higher among females (43.8 %) than males (34.9 %).

In Eastern Province, the proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training is 38.9 %, it is lower among males (34.5 %) than females (43.1 %). 2022 census results also revealed that the aforementioned proportion is higher in rural areas of Eastern Province (40.7 percent) than in urban areas (32.5 percent).

The proportion of youth (16-30) neither in employment nor in education or training among people residing in Kayonza district stood at 42.2 percent. It is much higher (43.9 percent) among people residing in rural areas of Kayonza district than the ones residing in urban areas (33.1 percent), and it is lower among males (38.0%) than females (46.2%).

4.1.20 3.3 Persons with disabilities

In 2015, 193 countries agreed to the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development and its Sustainable Development Goals with a commitment where possible, "to disaggregate the statistics they generate by disability to provide important insights about the extent to which persons with disabilities(PWDs) are being included in society, benefit from government programmes, or are included in the workforce.

At the national level, 3.4% of the resident population aged 5 years and above have a disability while in Kayonza district the disability prevalence rate is 3.8%. At sector level, the highest prevalence rates of the resident population aged 5 years and above with disability are in Ruramira and Murundi (4,9%,4,7%) respectively and while the lowest is in Mukarange (2.5%).

Regarding the prevalence of disability among the population age 5 years and above by type of disability, 1.4% have a disability of seeing, 1.1% have a disability of walking.

4.1.21 3.4 Elderly Population (60 years and above)

Rwanda has enacted laws such as the Law No 088/01 of 07/09/2020 (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2020) on Presidential order ratifying the protocol to the African charter on human and peoples' rights on the rights of older persons in Africa adopted by the twenty sixth ordinary session of the Assembly, held in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, on 31 January 2016 through an Official Gazette No.27 of 07/09/2020 and Law No.59/2008 of 10/09/2008 on prevention and punishment of gender- based violence (Office of the Official Gazette of Rwanda, 2008), whose Article 32 sets the penalty for violence against an elderly person.

It is over two decades since the United Nations convened the First World Assembly on Ageing (Vienna, 1982) (National Academy of Sciences, National Research Council, 2001)) that launched an international action programme, which was the first international instrument on ageing, to provide a foundation for the formulation of policies and programmes on ageing.

This was done to guarantee economic and social security to older persons and other opportunities to contribute to national development.

4.1.22 3.4.1 Eldery population of Kayonza by Sector

In 2022, the elderly persons constitute 6.1% of the total resident population of Kayonza district. The share of the elderly females is higher than the male's one (6.8% vs. 5.3%).

By sector, Ruramira(7.2%) and Rukara(7.2%) have the highest share of elderly among their total population while Mukarange (4.5%) has the lowest.

4.1.23 3.4.2 Employment among elderly people in Kayonza District

In Rwanda, people keep on working until old age, the share of employed persons among the elderly population stands at 28.2%. The aforementioned share is higher among the elderly males (33.7%) than elderly females (24.3%).

In Kayonza district, 31.6 % of elderly people were employed. The percentage of employed elderly people is higher among males than females (38.6% vs. 26.4%).

Employment among elderly residents is high in Ruramira (41.2%). It is low in Ndego sector (29.3%).

4.1.24 3.4.3 Marital status of elderly people.

In Kayonza district, more than half of the elderly population (65.4%) were married(married to one wife/husband officially, married to one wife/husband not officially and live in polygamous union) and 30.1% were widowed. The rate of celibacy among elderly was 2.1% while divorce is 0.2% and separation rate is 2.2%. Marital status among the elderly varies slightly by sector of residence.

Marriage among elderly people is more important in Ndego (70.0%) sector. widowhood is widespread in Mukarange (35.5%) and lowest in Ndego sector(25.3%).

CHAPTER 4: HOUSEHOLDS AND HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS

4.1.25 4.1 Household characteristics

In this chapter 5th Population and housing census 2022 investigated households and housing characteristics; those include household size, head of household by sex, type of habitat, housing tenure, materials used for construction, sources of energy used for lighting and cooking, water sources, sanitation facilities, asset possessed by household and mode of waste and disposals.

4.1.26 Number of households and size of household members

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate the total of 3,312,743 households in Rwanda, 886,136 in the Eastern Province and 114,186 in Kayonza district.

The average household size in Kayonza district is 4.00 persons per household. At the Sector level, the highest sizes are found in Mwiri (4.30 persons/household), Gahini (4.12 persons/household), Murundi(4.10 persons/household) and Ndego(4.07 persons/household). The smallest household sizes are found in Mukarange (3.73 persons/household each) and in Ruramira (3.85 persons/household).

4.1.27 Private households' heads of Kayonza District.

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that nationally 28.9% of private households are headed by women. In Kayonza district, private households headed by females are 30.1%.

At sector level, the highest percentages of households headed by women are found in Ruramira sector (33.8%) and Nyamirama sector (33.0%) while the lowest is found in Murundi sector (27.0%).

4.2 Housing Characteristics

4.2.1 **4.2.1** Type of habitat.

The results of 5th Population and Housing Census 2022 revealed that in the Eastern Province the predominant type of habitat is Umudugudu /planned rural settlement (86.5%). The situation is the same as in Kayonza district where it is 91.8 %. This type is followed by dispersed/isolated housing (5.4%).

The type of habitat varies across sectors. Umudugudu/Planned rural settlement is most prevalent in Murama (99.2%) and Kabare (99.0%) and low in Gahini(77.4%), Rukara (84.4%) and Murundi (84.7%). The sectors with the high percentages of dispersed/isolated housing units are Gahini (15.1%) and Murundi (13.8%). The table below displays results by sector.



According to the area of residence, the predominant type of habitat in Kayonza district is the same in both urban and rural areas: it is Umudugudu (planned rural settlement) where it is 89.2% in urban areas and 92.3% in rural areas.

The second type of habitat is dispersed/isolated housing (4.5%in urban against 5.6% in rural areas).

4.2.2 Tenure of the housing

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that the ownership of housing in the Eastern Province represents 72.1% and tenant represent 21.1%. In Kayonza district, 71.6% of housing units are occupied by owners while 23.1% are occupied by the Tenants.

At the sector level, the percentage of owners of households' units is high in Kabare (81.5%), Rukara (80.3%) and Ruramira (80.1%) and low in Mukarange (51.1%). The percentage of tenants of housing units is high in Mukarange (44.4%) and Kabarondo(30.2%) while it is low in Rukara (14.8%) and Kabare (14.9%). The table below indicate details:



According to the area of residence, 3 types of tenure of housing units (owners, tenants and free lodging) predominate in urban area as well as in rural area and their percentages vary substantially according to the area of residence.



4.2.3.1 Main materials of the roof

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 indicate that housing units are mainly covered by iron sheets in Rwanda (74.1%), as where as in the Eastern Province (98.9%) and in Kayonza district(99.3%). Only 0.2% are covered by local tiles in Kayonza District and other types of roofing materials represent 0.3%.

The variation by sector is not very significant. The high percentages of housing units covered by iron sheets are found in Rukara (100%) and in all sectors of Kayonza, the percentage is more than 98%. The highest percentage of the housing units covered by local tiles is found in Rwinkwavu sector (0.6%). The table below displays details:



According to the area of residence, the predominant roofing materials are the iron sheets in both urban areas (99.8%) and rural areas (99.2%). The percentage of housing units covered by local tiles is 1.6% in rural areas while it is 0.3 in urban areas. Housing units covered by industrial tiles are found in urban areas only (0.8%). 4.2.3 4.2.3.2 Main materials of the walls

The results of the census show that the housing units of the walls are mostly built with sun dried bricks with cement in Rwanda (36.3%), and 36.4% in the Eastern Province as where as in Kayonza district with (27.8%).

In kayonza district, the second type is wood with mud without cement (27.7%), followed by sun dried bricks without cement (27.5%.

At the sector level, sun dried bricks with cement are the mostly used materials in Ndego (46.3%) and Mukarange(42.2%). Wood with mud without cement is the most frequently used material in Ruramira (73.4%) while sun dried bricks without cement are most used in Kabare(52.5%).



According to the area of residence, in urban areas, the predominant materials are sundried bricks with cement (46.3%), followed by wood with mud and cement (16.0%) and wood with mud without cement(15.1%) and sundried bricks without cement(11.8%).

In rural areas, sundried bricks without cement are predominant materials with 30.3%, followed by wood with mud without cement(29.9%) and sun dried bricks with cement(24.6%) and wood with mud and cement(13.0%).

4.2.3.3 Main materials of the floor.

The results 5RPHC 2022 indicate that the main material of the floor of the housing units is Earth in countrywide as well as in the Eastern Province and in Kayonza district(60.4%, 60.9% and 60.7% respectively

In Kayonza district, the Earth is followed by Cement (26.5%) and dung hardened (11.4%).

At sector level, the Earth as main material used for the floor is most found in Ndego (76.4%), Kabare (75.6%), Murama (74.3%), Mwiri and Rwinkwavu (70.2 % each). The highest percentage of the housing units with Cement as material used for the floor is found in

Mukarange (48.4%) and Kabarondo (38.1%).

Dung hardened as material used for the floor is more used in Rukara(32.0%) and the high percentage of housing units whose floor in ceramic/clay/granite tiles is found in Mukarange (3.8 %).

By area of residence, the results of census indicate that in urban areas, the predominant materials used for the floor of the housing units are cement (57.2%) followed by earth (31.1%), dung hardened(7.0%) and ceramic/clay/granite tiles(3.9%). In rural areas, the predominant materials are earth (65.9%), cement (21.1%) and dung hardened (12.2%).

4.3 Source of energy of the private households .

4.3.1 Grid line connectivity in Kayonza District.

At national level, the results of the 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that 52.5% of private households are connected to the national grid while 47.5% are not connected. In the Eastern Province, the percentage of private household connected to the national grid line is 47.3% while it is 45.5% in Kayonza district.

At the sector level, the percentage of households connected to the national grid is high in Mukarange(74.6%),Nyamirama (58.1%) and Rukara (52.8%). Sectors with lower percentages of private households connected to the national grid line are Ndego (12.6%) and Kabare (20.8%).



4.3.2 Main source of energy for lighting in Kayonza district.

In Kayonza district, the main source of energy for lighting used by households are electricity, flashlight/phone flashlight and candles.

At the sector level, the percentage of households using electricity for lighting is high in Mukarange(78.1%), Murama(64.8%) and Nyamirama(64.0%) while it is low in Ndego(37.6%).

The sector with the high percentage of private households using flashlight/phone flashlight for lighting is Ndego(51.2%) while the sector with the high percentage of private households using candles is Gahini(4.3%).]



According to the area of residence, the main source of energy for lighting is electricity (54.1%), followed by flashlight/phone flashlight (35.3%), lantern(3.1%) and candles (2.5%) in rural areas. In urban areas, 79.2% of private households use electricity as main source of energy for lighting ,14.2% use flashlight or phone flashlight , 3.7% use candles and 1.1% use lantern.

4.3.3 Main sources of energy for cooking in Kayonza district

At the district level, the main sources of energy for cooking used by the private households are firewood (87.0%), followed by charcoal (9.3%) and gas (1.9%).

At the sector level, firewood as the first source of energy for cooking by private households is most used in Kabare (96.6%), Murama (95.9%), Murundi (95.5%) and Ndego (95.3%). Sectors with the high percentages of private households using charcoal as source of cooking energy are Mukarange (34.8%) and Kabarondo (19.9%). Sector with the highest percentage of private households using gas as main source of cooking energy is Mukarange (8.1%).






Figure 4. 9 Percentage of the private households of Kayonza District by main source of water and by Sector



4.2.6 4.3.5.2 Main type of toilet facility

The results of census reveal that the main types of toilet facility used by the private households in Rwanda are pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one HH (68.8%).

In Kayonza district main types of toilet facility used by the private households are pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one HH (74.5%), pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by several HHs (17.0%) and pit latrine without constructed floor slab used by one HH (5.8%).

At the sector level, the percentage of households using pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by one HH is high in Ndego (89.1%) while it is low in Mukarange (57.4%).

The high percentages of households using pit latrine with constructed floor slab used by several HHs are found in Mukarange (34.6%). The lowest percentage is found in Ndego (6.8%).

The high percentages of Pit latrine without constructed floor slab used by one HH are in Murama(10.4%) while it is low in Ndego(2.5%).

Pit latrines without constructed floor slab used by one HH are more found in Murama with percentage of 10.4%.





4.2.7 4.3.5.3 Mode of waste disposal in Kayonza District

The results of the census reveal that, in Kayonza district, the high percentage of households (74.0%) evacuate their wate by using household compost dumping while 18.0% of private households evacuate their waste by throwing them in the household's fields and 3.4% in public compost dumping while 2.5% of households using waste collection companies.

At the Sector level, the high percentages of households whose their waste are evacuated in household compost dumping are in Nyamirama (83.8%), Ruramira (83.4%) and Rukara (82.2%).

Private households evacuate their waste by throwing them in the household's fields or bushes are most in Ndego (27.1%).

Evacuate waste disposal by using public compost dumping is more found in Rwinkwavu(7.4%) while the usage of waste collection companies is high in Mukarange (13.0%).

The results of the census indicate the main modes of waste disposal used by the households. Modes of waste disposal used vary by area of residence, in urban areas, the main modes of evacuate waste disposal used by households are household compost dumping (66.9%), using waste collection companies (13.9%), throwing waste in household's fields/bushes (13.5%) and using public compost dumping (4.6%).

In rural areas, the households evacuate their waste mainly by compost dumping (75.2%), followed by throwing them in their fields or in the bushes (18.8%) and by using public compost dumping(3.2%). The figure below illustrates details:

4.4.2 Access to the Internet

The results of the 5th RPHC-2022 indicate that the percentages of households with at least one member using internet are 22.2% at national level while they are 18.1% in Eastern Province and 16.8% in Kayonza district.

At sector level, the high percentage of households with at least one member using internet is high in Mukarange (33.3%), Kabarondo (25.9%) and Nyamirama (17.0%). The sectors with the lower percentages of households with at least one member using internet are Ruramira (9.0%), Ndego (9.1%) and Murundi (9.9%).



According to the area of residence in Kayonza district, the results of the census show that the access to the Internet varies greatly. CHAPTER 5: AGRICULTURE IN KAYONZA DISTRICT

The agriculture was the one of the areas of investigation of the 5th Rwanda Population and housing census conducted in 2022. The households engaged in Livestock husbandry; the number of private crop farming households cultivating different types of crops, by Sector, the number of private households raising different types of livestock, by Sector and type of household raised in district were captured in the census.

5.1 The households engaged in crop farming and livestock husbandly

The results of 5th RPHC 2022 revealed that Nationally, 2,280,854 of private households (68.9%) are engaged in agriculture, among them 62.6% are engaged in crop farming and 50.4% are engaged in Livestock husbandry.

In Kayonza district, Agricultural households represent 74.5% with 68.4% of households engaged in crop farming and 45.7% Households engaged in Livestock husbandry.

At the sector level, the highest percentages of agricultural households are found in Murama(87.4%), Kabare (87.2%) and Ruramira(83.6%) where crop farming are more represented with percentage of 83.1%, 81.6% and 78.5% and those engaged in livestock husbandry with percentage of 58.6%, 61.7% and 56.3% respectively.

5.2 Distribution of private household engaged in crop farming of different types of crops, by Sector

The results of 5th Population and housing census 2022 indicate that the most cultivated crops by the private households of Kayonza District are beans, maize, fruits, cassava, sorghum, sweet potatoes, and banana.

Private households cultivated beans and maize are more found in Murundi, Kabare Mukarange and Nyamirama

Fruits and sorghum are more found in Kabare and Murundi while cassava are more found in Murundi and Mukarange.

Kabare and Rukara have the high number Private households cultivated banana.

Mukarange, Mwiri, Kabarondo and Nyamirama have a high number of those cultivated sorghum.

5.3 Distribution of private households engaged in raising different types of livestock, by Sector

Nationally, the results of the census indicate that most private households are considerably more engaged in raising cows, goats,pigs and chicken than other livestock.

At province level, most private households are more angaged in raising goats, cows and chickens. It is in the same extent in Kirehe District.

The sectors that have high proportion of private households that are engaged in livestock are: Kabare, Murundi and Nyamirama sectors.
